Prior to 1 June 1843, mail to France from Great Britain was governed by the Anglo-French Convention of 1836. On letters carried by non-contract vessels, Great Britain was entitled to 1 shilling 6 pence per single rate. In March 1839, when the British packet rate to the United States was reduced to 1 shilling, this debit was passed directly on to France instead of the 2 shilling 3 pence fee under the original 1836 Convention.

Commencing 1 August 1849, the French went to a uniform internal rate of 5 decimes per 7½ gram letter on incoming foreign mails. 




