In March 1871, the White Star Line commenced operations between Liverpool and New York. Contract mails were not carried until October 1872. Letter placed on board *Oceanic* as a consignee letter to accompany merchandise shipment and did not enter the British mail system. New York introduced a new ship letter circular datestamp in April 1870 and used it on this letter with a manuscript 4¢ postage due for reasons unknown since the normal handstamps, which combined the date and rate in one marking, were still in use.
