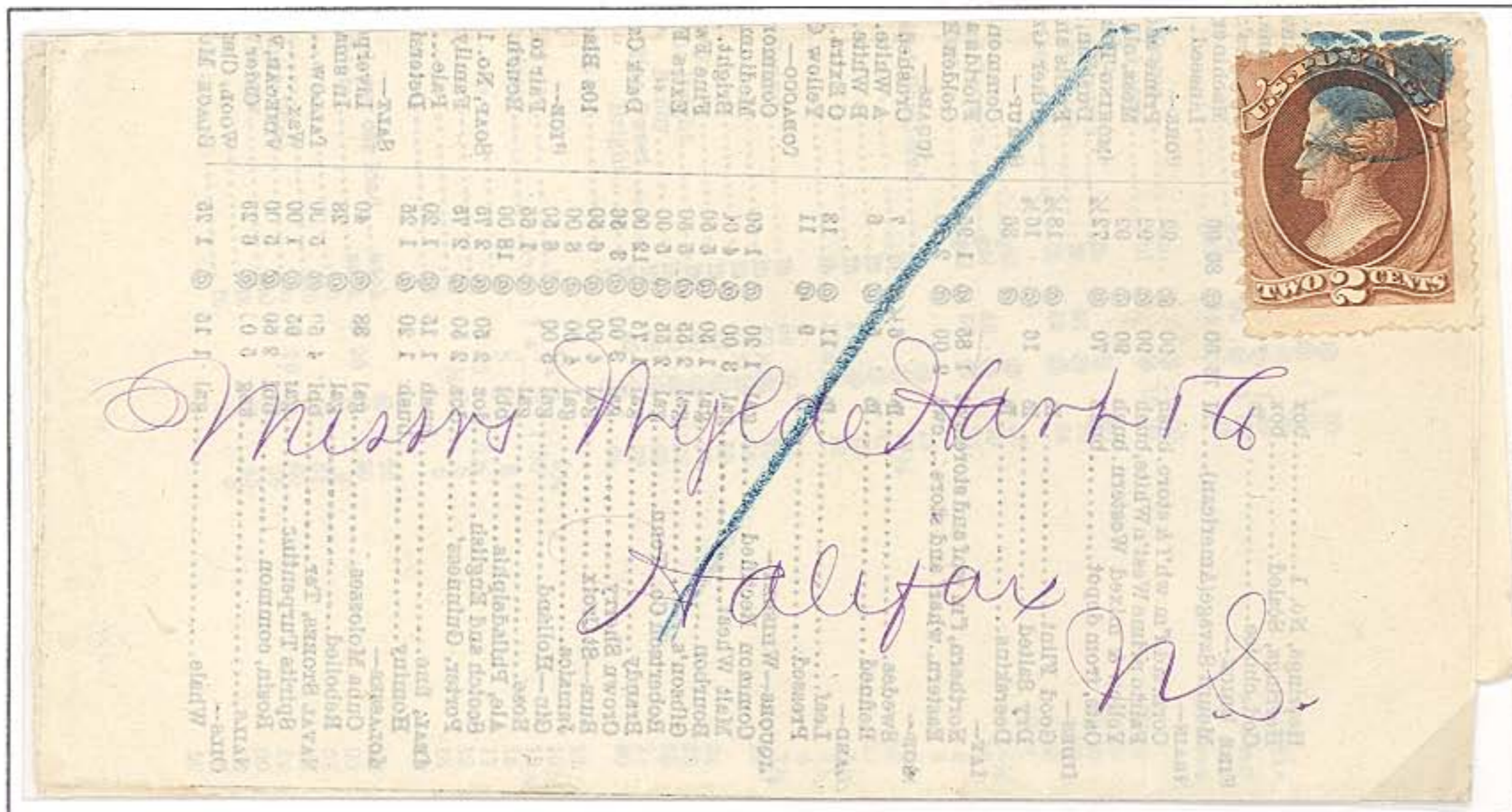

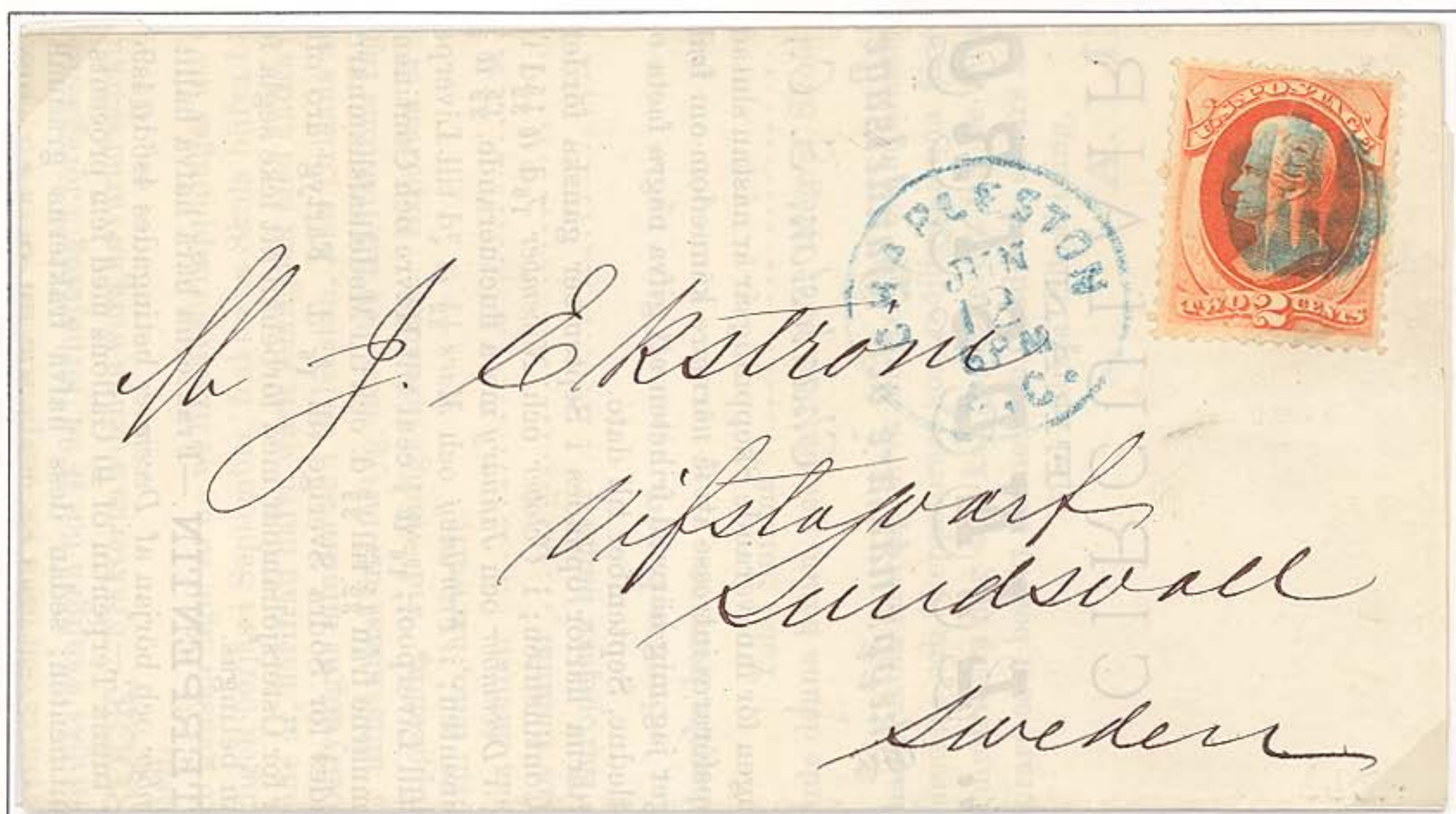
Notes: The U.S. postage for up to three unsealed circular to one address was 2¢, paid with Scott No. 146. From April 1863, circulars from the U.S. were charged 1 cent at the Canadian destination. The large blue pencil strike in the center of this circular denotes the postage due. This circular may have been sent overland and not by sea.

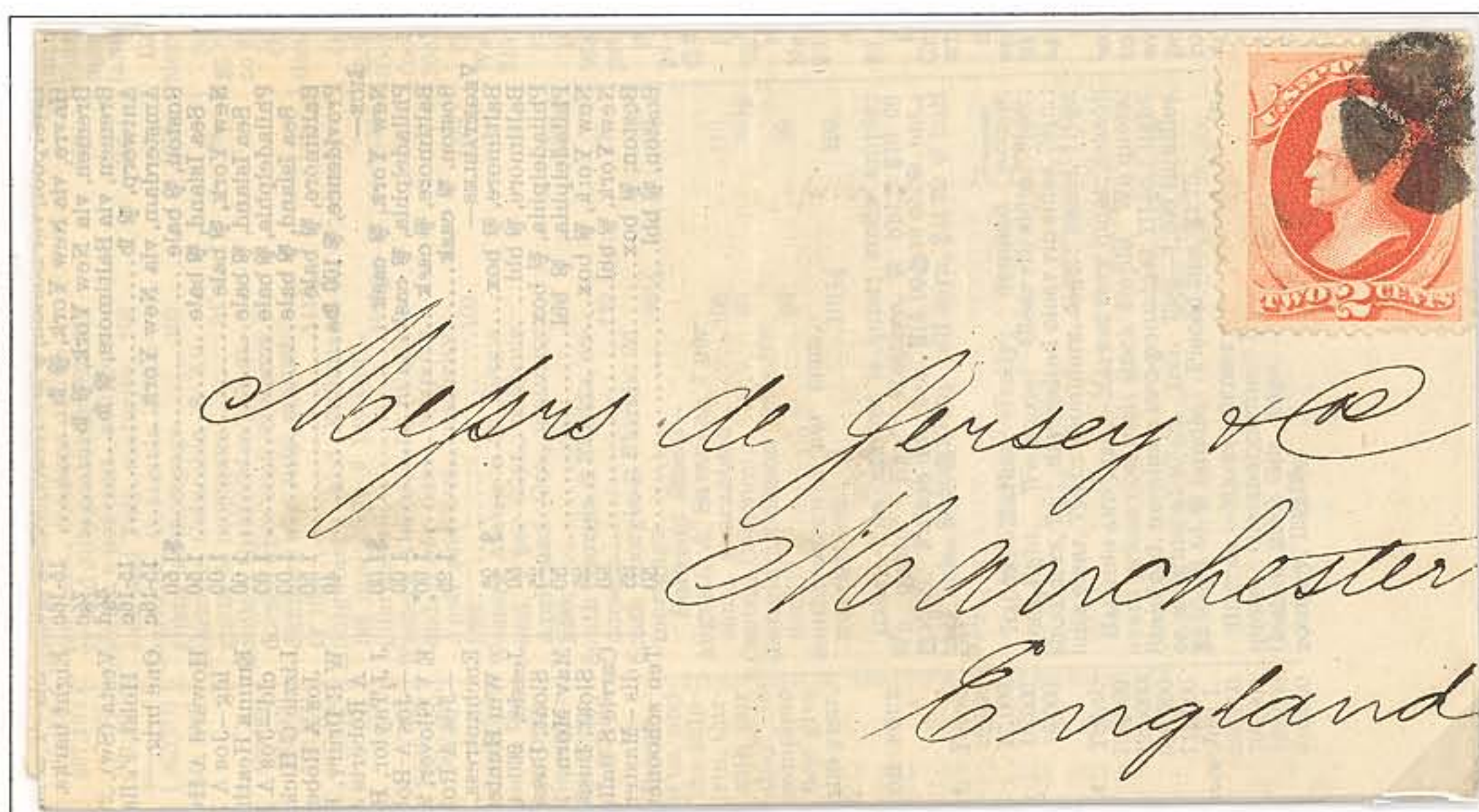
