Clock Marking

Purple ink was used for approximately 15 days in 1910 — on July 29th and then from September 10th through the 24th. All other uses were in blue ink on the face of covers.

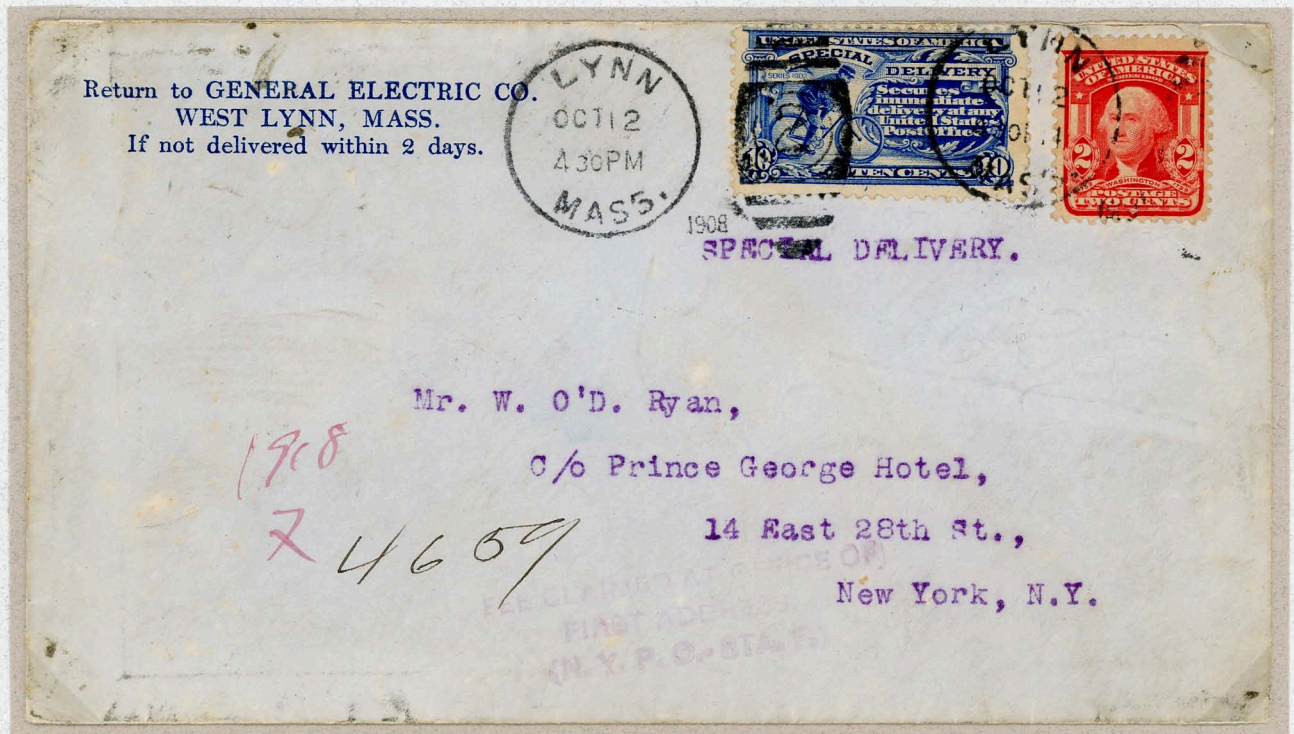

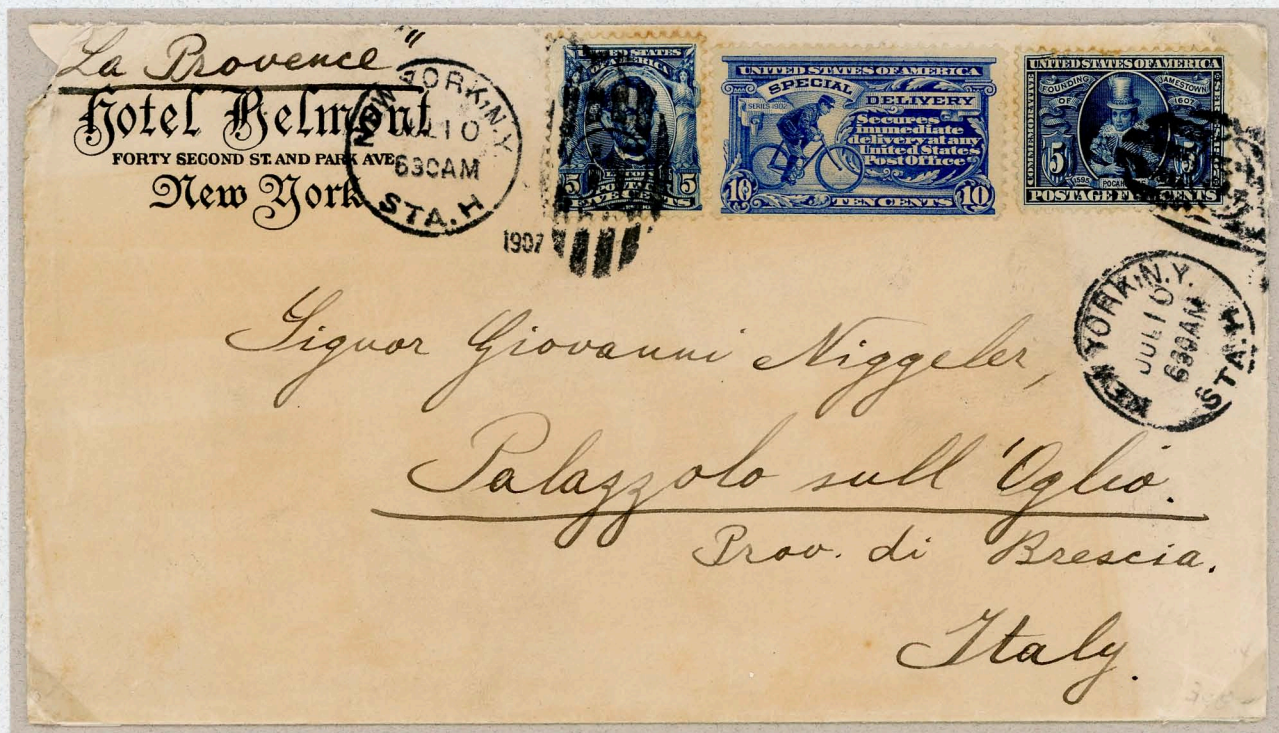

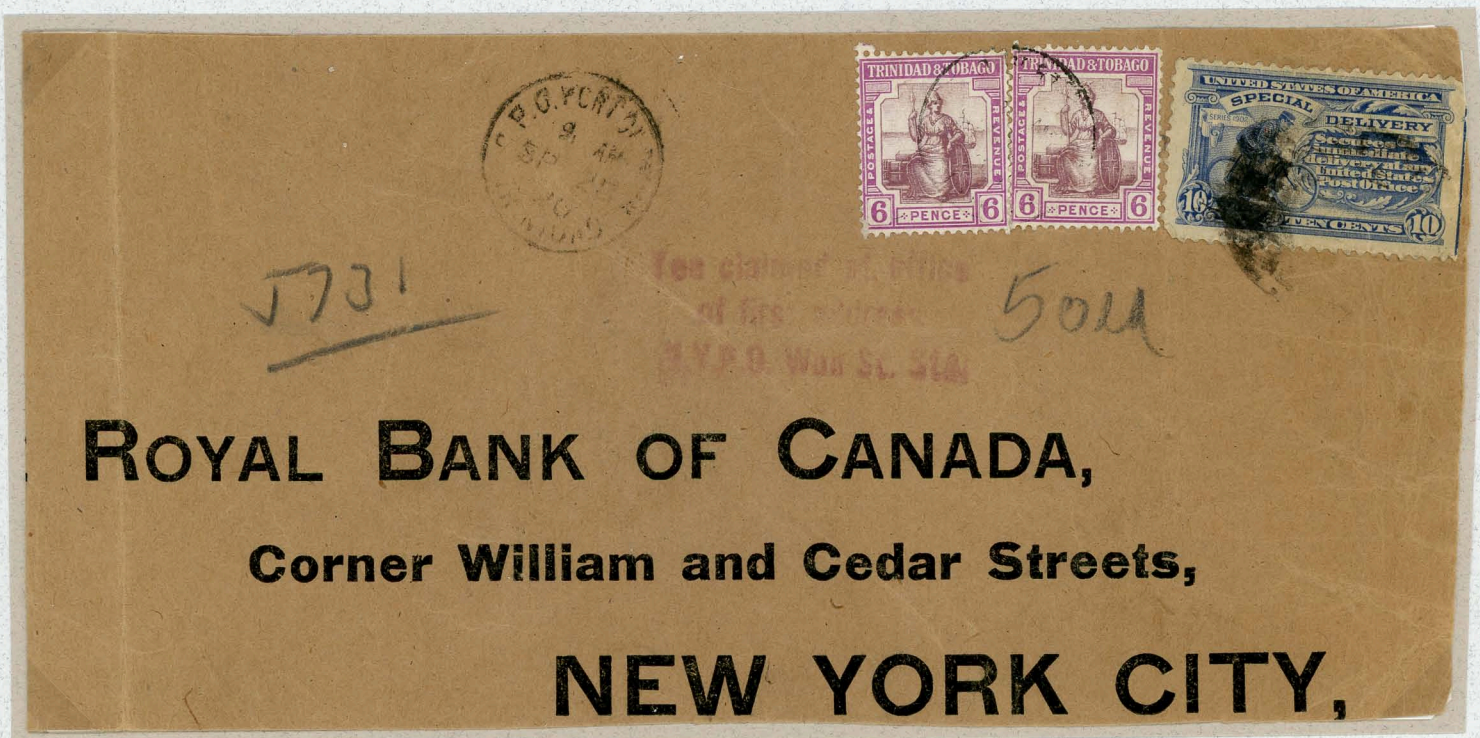

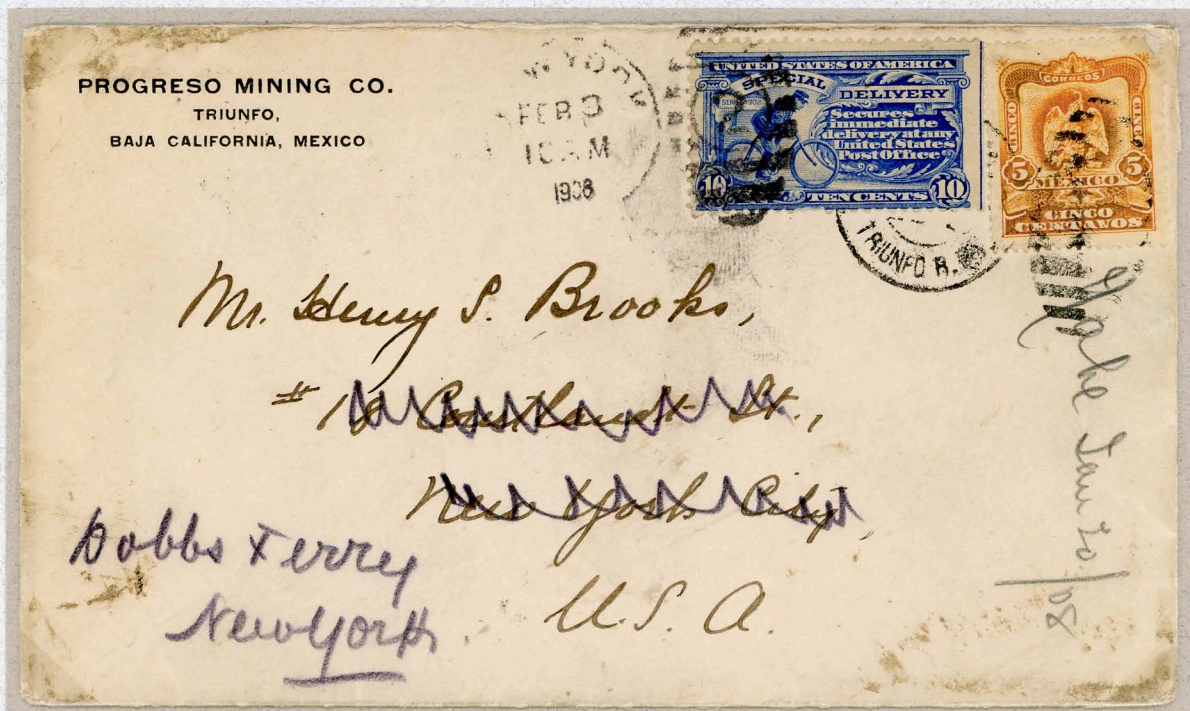


Trinidad and Tobago to New York, N.Y., Canada, September 23, 1906
