U.S. City Despatch, 13 April 1844

A new device with larger date-slugs was introduced about the beginning of 1844.

U.S. City Despatch, 25 March 1844



Tammany Hall circular, 1 cent drop rate, U.S. City Despatch, 28 May 1845, 3 cents due



U.S. City Despatch, 23 Dec 1845

Octagonal FREE

3 cent delivery fee paid in cash - FREE handstamp used to indicate to carrier that no money was due from addressee – no PAID handstamp was used

New York 1 May 1846, 2 cents paid to P,O. for drop letter (July 1845 Act), PAID in arc of New York P.O.

U.S. City Despatch 1 May 1846, FREE obliterates red "3" in ms., Apparently no postage collected



Unusual use of PAID and FREE handstamps on same cover



New York, 21 Nov 1845, 2 cents drop letter Delivered by City Despatch same day



New York, 13 May 1846, 2 cents drop letter Delivered by City Despatch same day Letter headed Buffalo, 7 May 1846, carried privately to New York

Competition from Boyd's Express and the increased 2 cent drop letter rate forced the closure of the City Despatch carrier service in November 1846.



Dropped in letter bag at American Hotel

11 May 1846, 9 o'clock

Three cents collected from addressee for New York City carrier delivery.



Paris France, 16 June 1846 Carried out of mail to Liverpool

19 May 1846, Liverpool to Boston out of mail on Cunard <u>Hibernia</u> 1 June 1846, Harnden's Boston red oval handstamp

Harnden's Express Boston to New York
U.S. City Despatch, 2 June 1846
3 cents collected from addressee by City Despatch

It is not clear of an extra charge was collected from addressee for Harnden's Express



15 October 1842
Printed circular – 3 cents due



21 October 1842 9 o'clock 1 in manuscript for drop letter rate – 3 cents total collected

Most letters were still sent collect during the September – December 1842 period of use of the first government adhesive on unsurfaced paper (6LB3).
