

27th October 1829, entire letter from Quebec to Halifax (9/11). Rated 1/8s.cy. plus 1d.cy. local delivery in Halifax.



22nd September 1830, Halifax, entire letter with Fleuron type to Quebec. A double letter rated 3/4s.cy.



30th January 1833, Halifax, entire letter with Fleuron type to Quebec. Single letter rate 1/8s.cy.



12th August 1835, Halifax, entire letter with single circle (used from 20th November 1830) rated 1/8s.cy to Quebec.



16th December 1840, Halifax, entire with letter two-part circle cancel (used 12/9/1839 to 5/7/1843) to Montreal rated 2/1s.cy.



27th March 1847, St. Johns, entire via Halifax (7/4) to Ouebec (17/4) rated 1/8s.cy. Routed via Fredericton, Woodstock, Grand Falls, Lake Temiscouata.

9th February 1848, Halifax, red tombstone type (used from 9/7/1839) on cover via Quebec 19/2 to London (27/2). Rated 3s.cy.

29th March 1865, Yorkville, cover via Toronto (29/3), Montreal (31/3), Halifax (4/4) to Yarmouth (11/4). Red « PAID 5 » routed via Portland. Now a decimal 5c.-rate.



Red "HALIFAX PAID MY 22 66" (used from 13/9/1865) and "CTS 5" on cover with contents via Montreal (31/5) to Ottawa. Carried via Portland.

8th December 1866, Montreal, entire letter carried to Portland and from there by "Express" via Halifax (12/12) to Ship Harbour (14/12) on Cape Breton. Carried by Grand Trunk Railway to Portland, New England and from there by Nova Scotia Stamship Co. to Halifax. This route was established in October 1866. 10c. rate for an unpaid letter rather than 5c. closed mail rate. Another cover from the same correspondence from 1863 prepaid 10c. is illustrated in Boggs. Both were paid for the US treaty rate.

Exess mail 1967 Mip May In Tremain Can Sev M Forder by Cowada West

30th July 1867, 5c. cancelled by Halifax Duplex (used from January 1867) on cover endorsed "Express Mail" via Montreal (4/8) to Coburg. Carried at the 5c. closed letter rate.
