I wrote you last from Batavia, Sept. 25th advising that I had drawn in virtue of your letter of credit (£1,000) on Mess. Morrison Cryder & Co London for three thousand pounds Stg.

I now have the pleasure of informing you that I have remitted from there, that sum, and one hundred pounds more.

I have requested those Gentlemen to forward to your address, my account current.

There will be a balance of course in my favor, which please retain for me, or pay the same to my son Mr Charles Brown.

The amount of money I shall have to pay to Mr Bowditch, will be an. £2000 Stg.

I have a premium policy on Specie and Merchandise landed at Batavia granted by Mr C Bradbury - No 8181, for \$3,000, and £1000 - of my Invoice (amts to \$16,777.65) in an account of Mess Edwards & Stoddard, negotiated and insured by their Bill on Mess Paring Brothers & Co as by their instructions at Batavia - in my Invoice of Rice.

vessel for England -
