





POSTMARKS



WAVERLY, OHIO 1861

THIS FAINT MARKING WAS FIRST CALLED TO ATTENTION BY RECOGNIZING THE COVER AS A PART OF THE GREGG CORRESPONDANCE, THE NOTABLE SOURCE OF OTHER WAVERLY STENCILS. HOWEVER, THE MARKING DOES NOT RESEMBLE THE COLORFUL STAR-ENCIRCLED STENCILS FOUND ON SCOTT #65, BUT RATHER APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN MADE IN THE SAME STYLE AS THAT OF THE WILLOWDALE, OHIO POSTMARK ON THE FOLLOWING PAGE.

SIMILARITIES BETWEEN OTHER STENCIL POSTMARKS CAN ALSO BE FOUND. FURTHER, THE TOWNS OF USE ARE ALWAYS CLOSE TO EACH OTHER. THIS WOULD TEND TO CONFIRM THE MULTIBLE EFFORTS OF ONE CRAFTSMAN IN A GIVEN AREA.

WESTERN TERRITORIAL EXPRESS
