14157 **CAMP PAROLE, ANNAPOLIS, MD:** U.S. 3¢ rose #65 (small faults) tied target cancel; addressed in peacock blue ink to "Robert R. Cook, Camp Parole Annapolis Maryland in G W Hathaway Lieutenant Co D, 106 Reig NYSV" with regimental receiving mark "HEU VELTON / JULY 13 1863 / N.V.", slightly reduced at left. CSA Catalog PAR-01 with CCV of \$300. Harrison lists only 25 covers known from Camp Parole. \$250.

Inv-10013 **JOHNSON'S ISLAND, SANDUSKY, OHIO:** 3¢ rose tied target and matching **SANDUSKY / O // JUL / 14 //** 64 double circle and **RICHMOND / Va. // JUL / 30 [1864]** cds with matching straightline **DUE 10** to pay the Confederate rate; on cover to Mrs. M. E. Mitchell, Glennville Barbour Co, Ala. with endorsement of **J.B. Mitchell Co B 34th Ala Inf.**; routing "For flag of truce via Ft. Monroe, Va" and manuscript Ex DSA examined marking; Nice use of both sides. Military records show Mitchell as a 1st Lieut. \$600.

Inv-7138 **CAMP DOUGLAS:** U.S. #65, 3¢ rose tied Chicago, Ill Mar 10 cds as well as Camp Douglas small examined circle and Richmond, Va. Mar 17 cds on cover to "Mrs. S. C. Sloop, Taylorsville, Alexander Co. N.C. **Via Fortress Monroe Va Per Flag of Truce**" with "**Prisoner of War**" docketing at top and second weak strike of Camp Douglas examined at lower left. Confederate straightline **DUE 10** at center pays the Confederate postage so **postally used on both sides**. Unfortunately, some nitwit cut out the stamp and no doubt thought better of it and put it back in place - still a nice use. Military records show two "S. Sloop" from NC, but neither with any details of use. A good research candidate. \$300.

Porter, Ontario Female Academy, Canandaigua, N.Y. with **Camp Douglas** Examined oval at lower left, cover slight reduced at left; Jack Molesworth pencil note on verso indicating letter from a POW in the **Arkansas Regiment** datelined "Barracks No. 30" now regrettably missing \$325

Barracks, Prisoner's Letter, Examined" handstamp, **US 65, 3¢ rose** (small faults) cancelled by target, **ROCK ISLAND / ILL. // OCT/ 4 / '64** dcds on unsealed envelope to Mrs. Lucy Hughes, Louisville Kentucky with directive "In Care of Smith & Co, Wade" docketing on back, typed transcript of original letter (not included) - clothing request from A. J. Lovett. Mrs. Hughes was known for helping the prisoners, Fine. \$300.

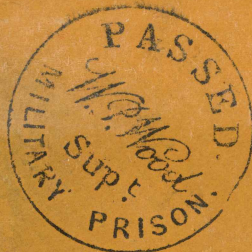


Inv-6043 **CAMP CHASE, COLUMBUS, OH:** U.S. 3¢ rose #65, uncanceled, trimmed and oxidized - perhaps cut from encased currency, on cover to "Moses L. Robinson, Prisoner of War, Prison No. 3 Camp Chase, Ohio" endorsed "By Flag of Truce", light partially erased examiner's marking in pencil, Fine, contents likely "\$5 U.S. Currency". Robinson is listed as having served in Co. "D" 20th LA Infantry (Lovell Regiment). \$450.

14154 **JOHNSONS ISLAND, SANDUSKY, OH:** US 3¢ rose tied by Sandusky O, Aug 6 '64 duplex to Mrs. Lou. L. Clark at Attalaville, Miss., endorsed "T. A. Pope, Capt. 29th Miss. Inf, and Prisoner of War" and "Per Flag of Truce via Fortress Monroe", manuscript "Ex G.A." examiner's marking, entered Southern mails with Richmond Va. Aug 24 cds and matching DUE 10 rating handstamp; light staining, Fine. **Nice use of both Union and Southern postage.** \$500.

14165 OLD CAPITAL PRISON, WASHINGTON, D.C.: US #65, 3¢ rose (faulty, with lower left corner torn away) tied cork with matching WASHINGTON / D.C. / MAY / 20 [1865] cds on cover to J. Gildea Woolts S. J., Georgetown College, Georgetown, D.C. with pencil docketing "Rec May 31st 1865", beautiful strike of W. P. Wood examined marking CSA Catalog type A, CCV \$800. John G. Woolts was Prefect of Discipline for Georgetown College. \$500.



17212 JOHNSON'S ISLAND, SANDUSKY, OHIO: US 65, 3¢ rose tied blue SANDUSKY / O duplex JUN 2 '65 on cover sent after the war was over, "Prisoner's Letter, Johnsons Island, O. Examined B. -" oval handstamp (likely BFM for Benjamin F. Miller which Harrison notes as used from April 26-May 5, 1865, which would make this latest recorded use of this censor marking) as well as manuscript directive "Care of Gen. Scammon, via Jacksonville, Fla." to Mrs. B. M. Burroughs, Tallahassee Florida, prisoner's (husband's) endorsement at top left and docketing "[letter] #24." Some staining. Confederate postage not needed as CSA was no more. \$300.
