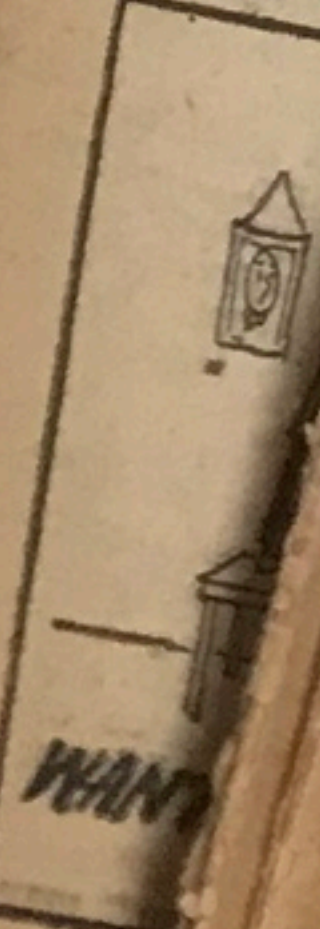

YOU HAVE SMILED!!!

"WE shall anxiously watch out for a happy smile on your face. That's how we ended our last Editorial. Well, you have smiled.

You have sent us congratulatory letters, one of you even a cable from the Antipodes, you have given us your benevolent advice. Some of you even pressed us for more frequent issues. Irish newspapers and international philatelic magazines have written about us favourably.

We had 183 compliments and two criticisms. One of these was just anonymous rudeness, the other came from a prominent contributor.

The latter one complained that "Green I.S.L.E. Philately" is too light-hearted and not specialised enough. Well, my friend, you are right. We are not a specialised magazine. There are several hundred excellent ones appearing every week in every part of the world, but we are not one of them.

On the other hand, there is none, so far as we can see, which addresses itself to the average general collector; to the man (or woman) for whom a stamp is not so much an object of intensive study, but rather a means of a pleasant recreation. To whom a smile is as important as a perforation, a good story as important as the discovery of a cover dated the day before the stamp's official issue.

"Green I.S.L.E. Philately" also frankly wants to be a propaganda sheet for philately. We meet so many people who are just at the fringe of the hobby, who would like to take it up but who are overawed by the formidable technical terms, by the bewildering number of stamps and their variety, by the difficulty of understanding the price formation, etc. For them we want to lift the Iron Philatelic Curtain a little.

It is these people and the general amateur collector whom we have in mind when

choosing our articles. We like to show and explore the human side of philately, the why, the how and the wherefore. We also want to demonstrate that whatever the race, nationality or creed, philately is substantially the same everywhere.

This, then, is our aim. A popular, international stamp magazine. And, friends, you will scarcely credit it, although this hobby has been going on for nearly 100 years, there does not seem to be another *light-hearted stamp magazine* in the world.

One word more about the new shape of this magazine. We have chosen this form because it solves two problems for us:

- (1) It reduces the weight, which makes it easier and cheaper for us to send all overseas *airmail*;
- (2) It allows us, at the same time, to print more reading matter.

Please let us know what you think about the new shape. We should have liked to provide a stiff cover, but unfortunately weight considerations do not permit this.

To the advertisers, we have allocated slightly larger space than was originally booked by them on the smaller page, and we believe that their advertising should be even more effective now, as the reader will have to dwell longer on each of the larger pages and, therefore, will be more conscious of each advertisement.

Now, friends, we must conclude with the hope that you will continue your friendly support, will still give us the benefit of your advice. We are still very inexperienced and must lean heavily on your constructive criticism, because how else can we know how "Green I.S.L.E. Philately" appears to you.

Keep telling us your likes and dislikes and how to make "Green I.S.L.E. Philately" even more *your* stamp magazine.

But, most of all, *keep smiling!!!*

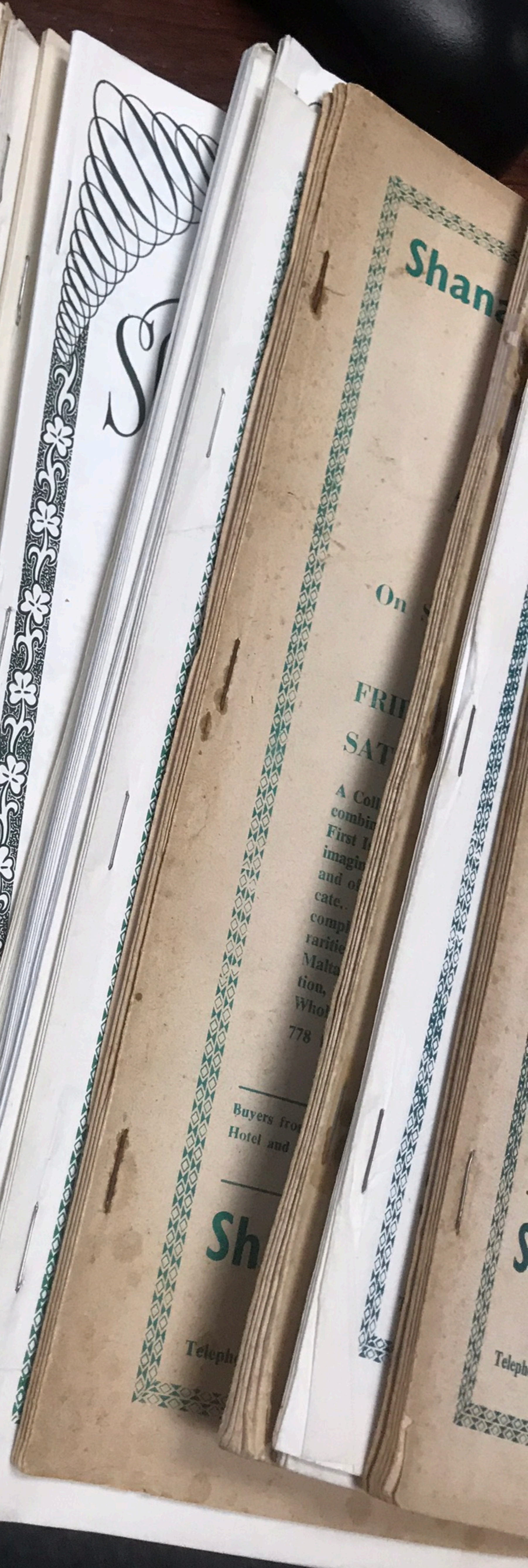
