

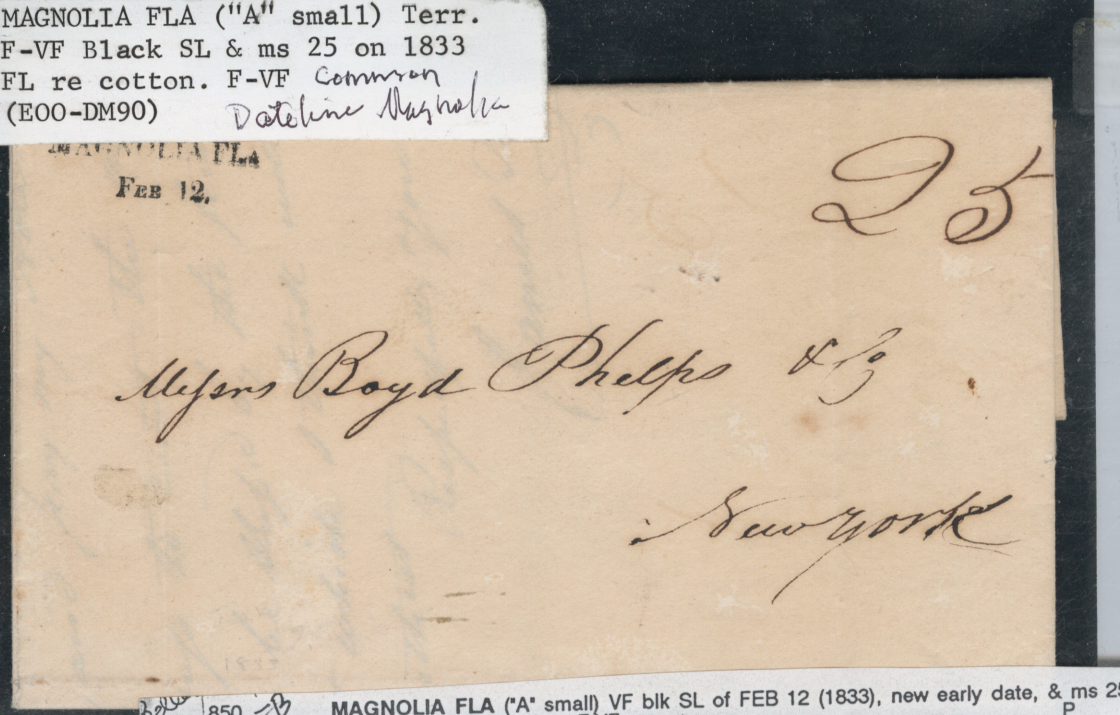

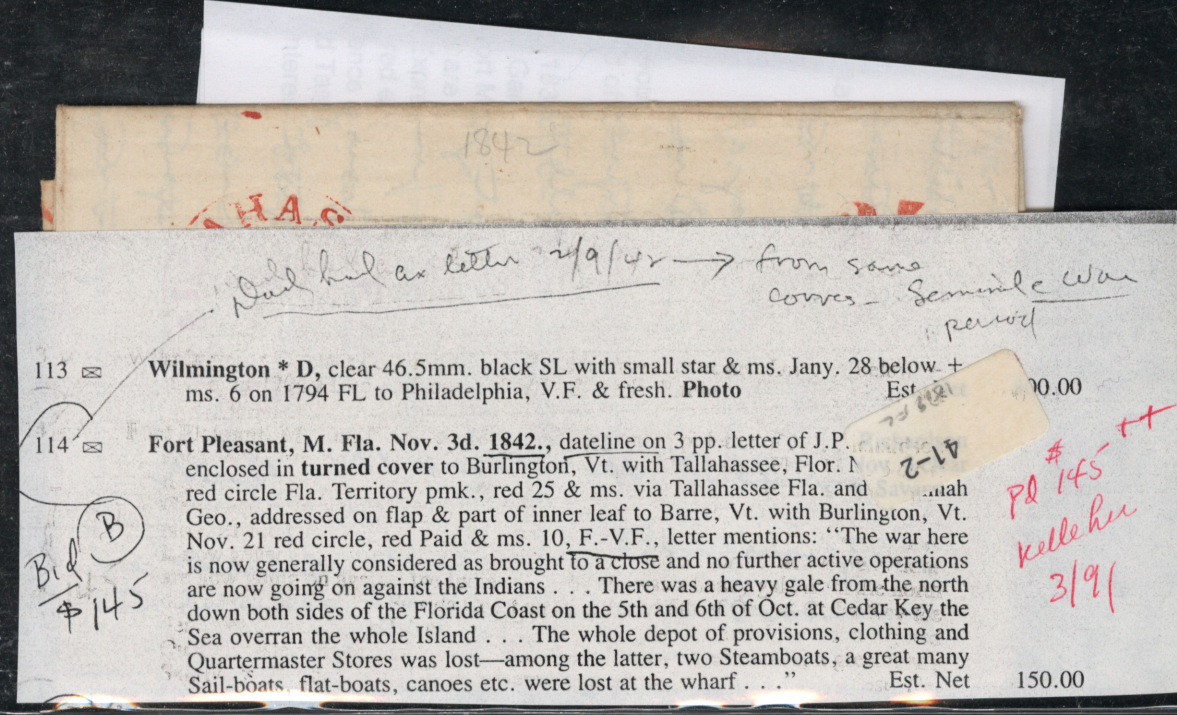

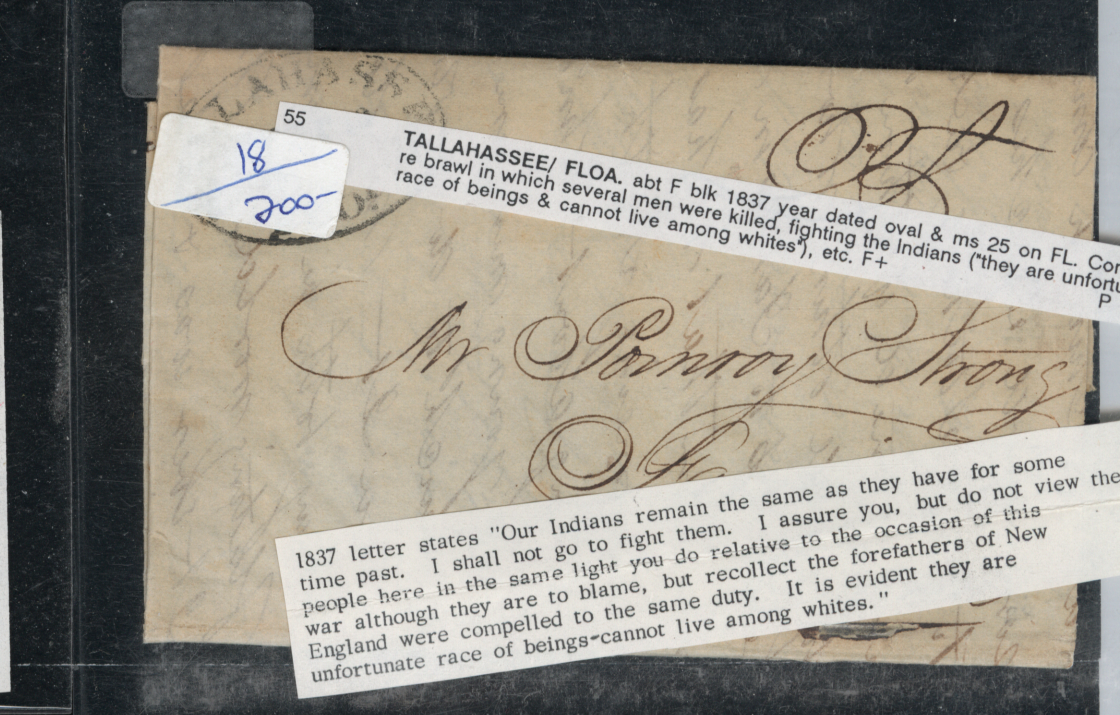

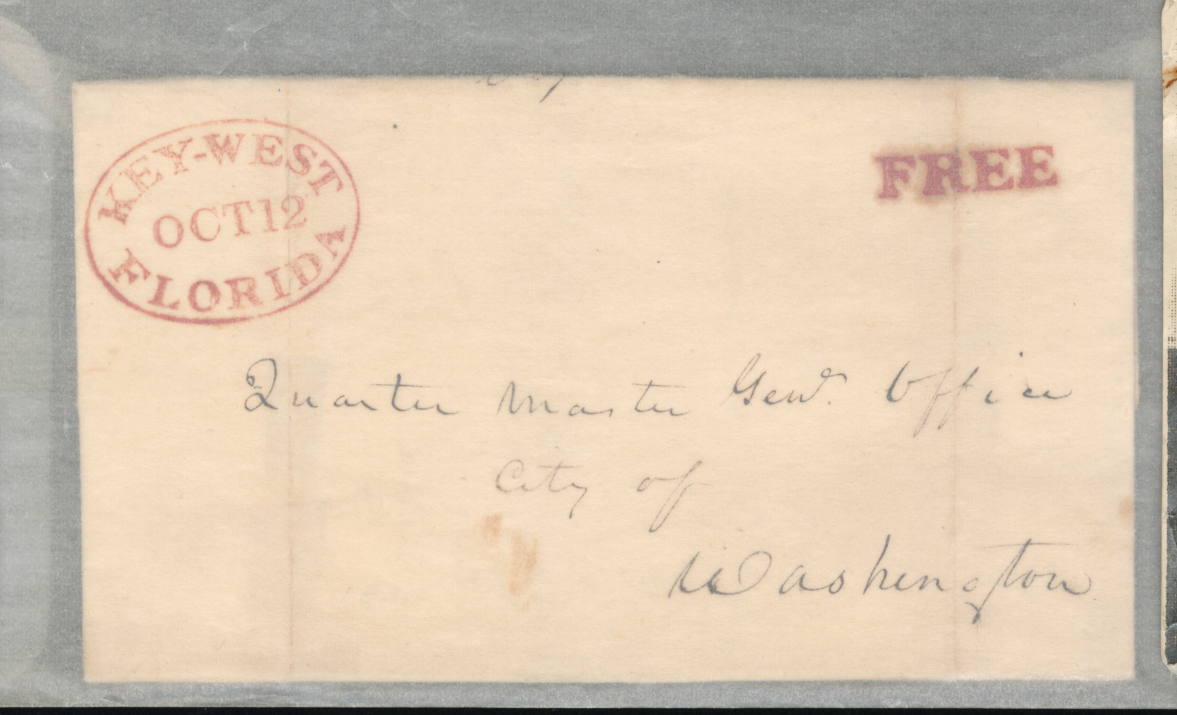

There was a heavy gale from the north down both sides of the Florida Coast on the 5th and 6th of Oct. at Cedar Key the Sea overran the whole Island . . . The whole depot of provisions, clothing and Quartermaster Stores was lost—among the latter, two Steamboats, a great many Sail-boats, flat-boats, canoes etc. were lost at the wharf . . ." Est. 55 18 200 TALLAHASSEE/ FLOA. abt F blk 1837 year dated oval & ms 25 on FL. Cont re brawl in which several men were killed, fighting the Indians ("they are unfortunate race of beings & cannot live among whites"), etc. F+

1837 letter states "Our Indians remain the same as they have for some time past. I shall not go to fight them. I assure you, but do not view the people here in the same light you do relative to the occasion of this war although they are to blame, but recollect the forefathers of New England were compelled to the same duty. It is evident they are unfortunate race of beings-cannot live among whites."

St. Augustine Fl. T. Apr. 24, partly clear 30 mm. red circle Florida Terr. pmk. + ms. 25 on FL to Cohoes, N. Y., some stains. Fine, 4 pp. letter of L. W. Mansfield mentions: "I wrote Mr. White from Pilatka Sunday night stating that an express rider had been shot out from Tampa & that a party (of) Indians were seen the other day at Micanopy—also another party of 20 or 30 at Fort King, which is between Pilatka & Tampa. A man was shot not long since less than a mile from Fort King & the opinion of every one now is that the war is on, will be in full blast again directly. Major Van Ness came in this afternoon & reports that, per Express yesterday to Pilatka (probably after I left) 100 Indians had escaped from Fort Cummings . . ."; he also gives a detailed description of his trip to & from Pilatka.

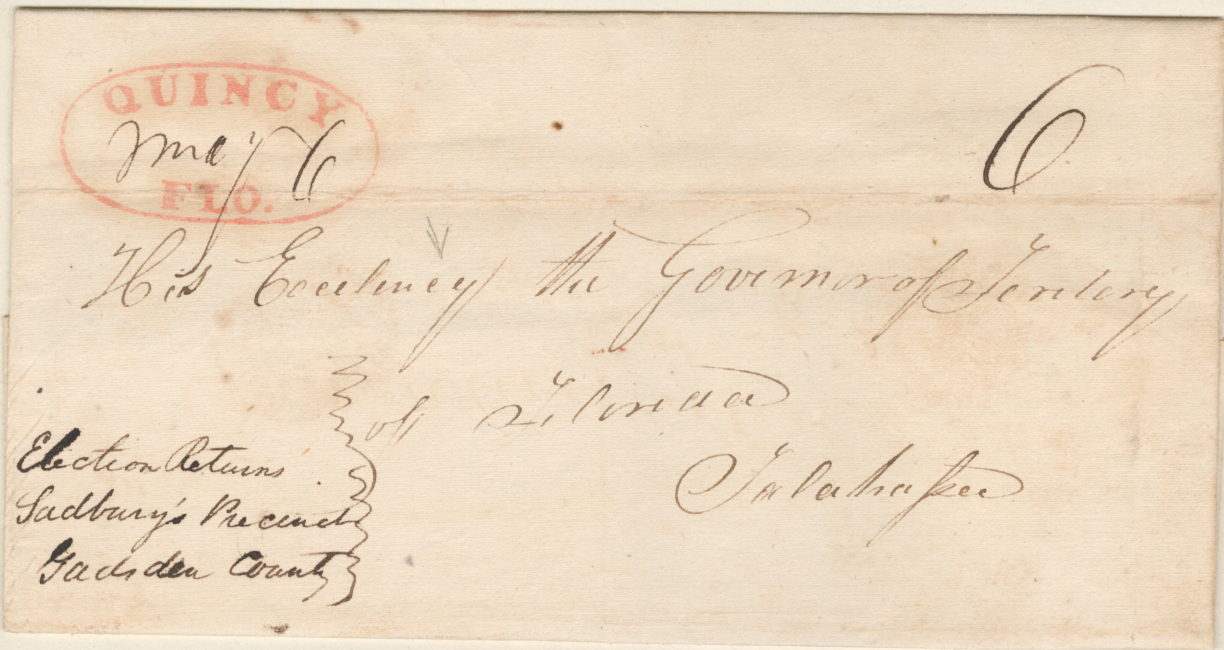

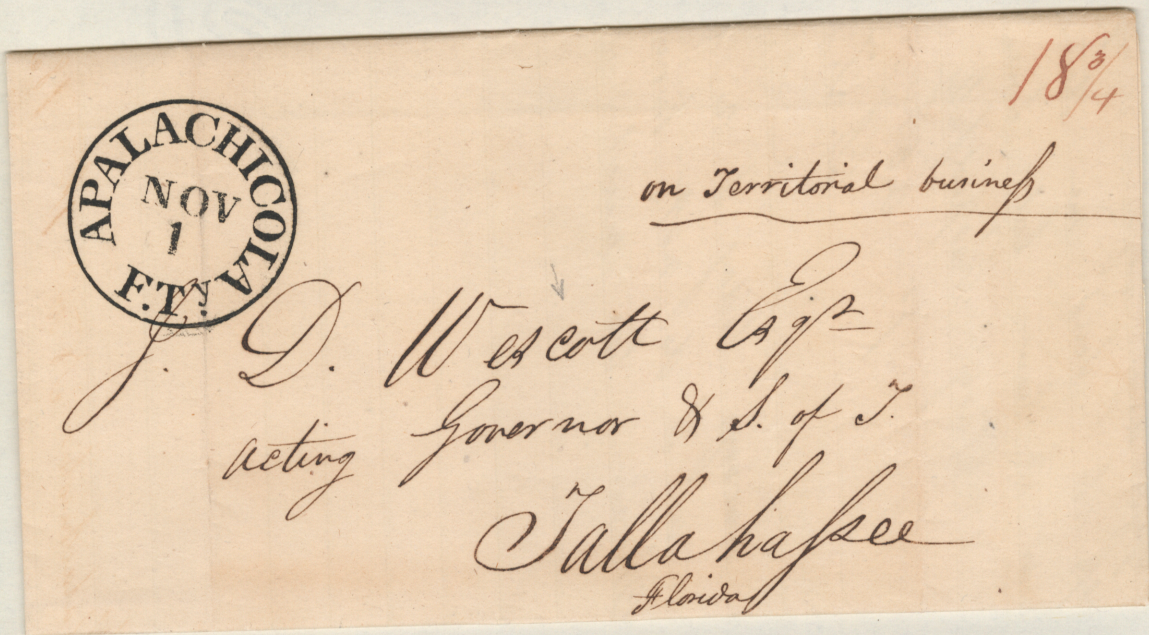
