




Letter prepaid 2 shilling for double rate outgoing ship letter from the interior.
Uncommon PAID AT MANCHESTER circular marking in red with non-serif letters, used 1837–1839. Apparently, New York thought the letter contained two additional sheets as it was rated a triple rate, 3x18¾¢ plus 2¢ ship fee.



1 August 1840 Liverpool to Boston

Postmarked LIVERPOOL/AUG 4/1840 with prepayment of the Cunard Packet rate of 1/- in red ink. The letter was carried on the maiden voyage of the Acadia, d. LP 4 Aug, a. Bos. 17 Aug.



Red rimless orange red LIVERPOOL/OC 3/1840/H (reverse). Boxed red orange PAID AT/LIVERPOOL which is an early use of this marking. Letter rated 1/-. Acadia d. LP 4 Oct., a. Bos. 17 Oct. Boston exchange office 20 3/4 cts.: 18 3/4 cts. for 150-400 miles + 2 cts. ship fee.





Inscribed Halifax Packet. Paid 1/- Packet fee for transatlantic crossing. Boston Exchange Office inscribed postage due of 27 cts. for inland rate of 25 cts. for over 400 miles + 2 cts. ship fee. Third transatlantic crossing: d. LP 4 Feb., a. Bos. 22 Feb.



5 January 1841 Liverpool to Cambridge, MA

Columbia

Endorsed to the steamer Cambridge of the U.S. Ball Line which dominated Atlantic trade until the Cunard Line received government contract for mail service. Cambridge was crossed out and the letter went on the maiden voyage of the Cunard steamship Columbia, d. LP 5 Jan. 1841, a. Bos. 21 Jan. Prepaid 1/-. Postage due 8 cts: U.S. inland fee of 6 cts. for under 30 miles + 2 cts. ship fee.


4 February 1841 Liverpool to Boston

Britannia

Endorsed p. Britannia Str., the letter was postmarked PAID AT/LIVERPOOL/FE 4 1841 and struck with the red one shilling rate mark, which is known from October 1840. The Cunard Liner Britannia departed Liverpool on the 4th of February, stopped at Halifax and arrived in Boston on the 22nd. The Boston exchange office treated it as a ship letter and thus struck it with the red SHIP/6 (BPM 274), the rate for a single ship letter addressed to the port of arrival.


Zone Rates with additional postage for weight British Contract Steamships



14 September 1841 London to New York

Red orange London tombstone A/PAID/18SP 18/1841. Letter rated 4/6 with additional 1p in black circle for a total of one shilling, seven pence for a 3 ½ oz. weight. Acadia d. LP 19 Sept, a. Bos. 5 Oct. Boston rated the letter postage due \$2.45 (13 x 18 3/4 cts. for 100 to 400 miles + 2 cts. ship fee).



Columbia

Postmarked PAID AT/LIVERPOOL/0C 1841 and rated 1/-. Endorsed pr Columbia/Via Halifax. Columbia d. LP 5 Oct., a. Bos. 21 Oct. Boston rated the letter 95 3/4 cts. for 1 1/4 oz. According to the British postal system, one rate per ½ oz. equaled an additional full rate or two shillings. There was no triple rate. The U.S. rate was one oz. equaled four rates plus one rate for the 1/4 oz. or five rates. Hence, the rate of 95 3/4 cts. (5 x 18 3/4 + 2 cts. ship fee).

20 January 1841 Off Boston to Chippawa, Upper Canada

Columbia

A letter written during the voyage of the Columbia on her maiden Atlantic voyage, d. LP 5 Jan., a. Bos. 21 Jan., posted on arrival at Boston. Rated 25 cts. in red ink by Boston exchange office for the distance to the Canadian border and then in black ink $1/3 + 4 \frac{1}{2} = 1/7 \frac{1}{2}$ currency, the Canadian inland rate to Chippawa, Upper Canada via Halifax and Toronto. The letter arrived. on the 28th, taking eight days due to the poor condition of the roads and ice at river crossings.

Steamer Columbia, Jany 20th 1841, 7 o'clock p.m.

My 'Dear Mother,

We are now within sixty miles of Boston - sea is calm as in Summer - and running at the rate of 12 miles per hour. We left Liverpool on the morning of the 5th and shall have made this passage in a little over fifteen days - it is the first time any steamer has crossed the Atlantic during Winter - and the extraordinary quick voyage of fifteen days at this season, a good part of the time against head winds and heavy seas, and altogether very bad weather, has put our Captain and indeed all the passengers in great spirits. We reached Halifax in 13 ½ days - stopped there five hours, had time to see the town, and shall be in Boston before daylight tomorrow. I shall proceed by railway as far as I can towards home - I write this to appraise you of my arrival and shall despatch it as soon as I reach Boston....



FORWARDED BY/EMERSON & Co./HAVRE and numbered 4261, the letter was conveyed by a messenger of the forwarding agency to the purser on the Cunard Packet Acadia who later placed it in the mails in Boston. The Acadia departed Liverpool on 19 March, arriving Boston 7 April. The letter was postmarked (BPM 293) and rated 27 cts. (25 cts. for over 400 miles + 2 cts. ship fee) as postage due.




Liverpool black transit markings in the dotted or four-arc circle are found only on outgoing packet letters carried by Cunard Line steamships. Both letters were prepaid 1 s. Rate markings of 20 ¾ and 8 cts. are for 150-400 miles (18 ¾ cts.) and under 80 miles (6 cts.) + 2 cts. ship fee.

This letter was hand carried from Copenhagen, Denmark to London where it was postmarked by the orange-red London tombstone postmark C/PAID/3 JA 3/1842 and inscribed "1/-" in red ink indicating prepayment of packet rate. Endorsed "p Britannia Str," it departed Liverpool 5 January, arriving Boston 21 January where it was rated SHIP/6 as a ship letter at port of entry.



Acadia and Unicorn

This letter was posted at BishopgateWithout, which was a small substation of the large Bishop(s) Gate post office in the City of London. Someone at Royal Mail had a sense of humor as there was another small station called BishopgateWithin. Both were probably in a store or shop. The packet rate of 1/- (1s) was paid and the orange-red London tombstone postmark is dated 18 February 1842. It was endorsed via Boston and sailed on the Cunard Packet Acadia on 19 February with the Caledonia's mails, as well as her own, since the Caledonia had returned to port due to damage resulting from violent storms at sea. By chance, the Acadia fell in with the steamer Unicorn which, in consequence of the non-arrival of the Caledonia, had been dispatched to Halifax on March 7. On 8 March the Unicorn sailed to Boston with Acadia's mails and Acadia sailed from Halifax for Liverpool on 12 March with Unicorn's mails. In Boston the letter was postmarked (BPM 293) and rated 20 3/4 cts. (18 3/4 cts. for 150 to 400 miles + 2 cts. ship fee).


17 March 1842 Portsmouth to Raleigh

Written on board ship Off: Portsmouth England, the letter was posted at Portsmouth March 18 and struck with the large black 2 pence rate mark. It was re-rated in black mss. 1s/2p collect to Boston. Since packet postage had to be prepaid, the letter was forwarded to London and backstamped with a red encircled Returned for Postage and on its face a red boxed Returned for Postage with mss. 1s, as well as a red boxed Detained for Postage with No. 6949 inscribed. The London post office applied the red mss.1/- rate and the red tombstone postmark E/PAID1 JU 1/1842. The black Liverpool transit marking is dated JUN 2/42. The Britannia d. LP 4 June, a. Bos.18 June where it was lightly struck with the SHIP postmark and forwarded collect with 27 cts. postage due (25 cts inland rate + 2 cts. ship fee).





In order to avoid the one shilling packet rate, this letter was carried privately on the Caledonia and entered the mails in Boston. It received a regular Boston postmark, not that of the Exchange office with SHIP, and was rated 37 ½ cts. (2 X 18 3/4) to the Canadian border. The Montreal postoffice converted the rate to 2/9d cy. The letter was docketed *Rec. 30* (1843).



Posted in London on 3 May, prepaid 2 shillings for a double weight letter, and endorsed Pr Caledonia via Lpool & Boston, the letter was carried on the Cunard Packet Caledonia, departing Liverpool 4 May, arriving Boston 19 May. It received the Boston postmark (BPM 293) and the 39 ½ rate mark (unlisted) for a double weight-letter traveling 150 to 400 miles (2 x 18 3/4 cts. + 2 cts. ship fee).



Posted in Frankfurt 12 April (red dbl. circle) and marked 12/6 in red crayon on reverse, the Anglo-Bremen pre-convention transit rate (effective 1 Dec. 1844) of 1s/8d to London. Endorsed Via Liverpool p. Steamer. The letter was sent to Aachen to go into the mail bags for the United Kingdom and struck with a large red boxed P.D. Red London PAID transit and red 1/- packet rate. Black LP transit APR 18/43. Hibernia d. LP 19 Apr. on maiden voyage, a. Bos. 4 May.







Postage due 20 ¾ cts. for inland rate of 18 ¾ cts. for 150 to 400 miles + 2 cts. ship fee. Docketed on reverse "r 23 Jany 1844." Reference to *America* on front refers to the United States as destination, not to the Cunard ship which was not commissioned until 1848.







Endorsed Packet Letter with red ms. P 1/o Packet rate Paid. Black oval LP transit 19 July (reverse). Hibernia d. LP 20 June, a. Bos. 3 July. Partial red Boston postmark and red postage due 20 3/4: 18 3/4 + 2 cts. ship fee.





Both letters were posted to New York in Paris at the BUREAU CENTRAL and struck with a red boxed PD (paid to destination, i.e. U.S. frontier). The letter of 14 May 1843 was sent under the articles of the Anglo-French Convention of 1836. It stipulated a British packet fee of 12 decimes and a French internal rate of 15 decimes for a letter weighing 17 grams, totaling 27 decimes (reverse). Carried on the Acadia, d. LP 19 May, a. Bos. 1 June, it was postmarked and rated 39 ½ cts. postage due (2 x 18 ¾ cts. for 150-400 miles + 2 cts. ship fee). The letter of 31 May 1843 was sent under the articles of the Anglo-French Convention of 1843 requiring a rate of 32 decimes (reverse) for 19 grams weight. Carried on the Columbia, d. LP 4 June, a. Bos. 18 June, where it was rated 77 cts. postage due (4 x 18 ¾ cts.+ 2 cts. ship fee). Both letters received the London red 1/- rate and PAID circular postmark. Each was struck with the black oval LP transit handstamp. The marking was proofed on 13 May 1843 and has hitherto only been seen from July to December of 1843.


Pre U.S. – British Treaty: 4 July 1840 to 1 July 1845 Southampton FOREIGN PAID handstamp markings




Pre U.S. – British Treaty: 4 July 1840 to 1 July 1845 British Contract Steamship - Hand stamped Rate Markings

Posted in London on August 18. The packet rate of 1 shilling was paid and the letter was endorsed Pr. Steamer Packet Britannia via Halifax and forwarded to Liverpool. The Britannia d. LP 19 Aug., was delayed by fog at Halifax for 36 hours and a. Bos. 3 Sept. Red BOSTON SHIP exchange office postmark applied and the 20 3/4 cts. rate mark for a distance of 150 to 300 miles inland rate + 2 cts. sea passage.



Britannia?

The letter was posted in a suburban post office in the London area where the clerk wrote pd. 1/- and then forwarded it to London for the orange red London PAID post mark and sent it to Liverpool where a black Liverpool lozenge transit mark dated 16DE43 was applied. According to Colin Tabeart this mark "has only been seen from July to December of that year" (1843). R.F. Winter does not list any Cunard voyages from Boston after 5 Dec. 1843 until Jan. 4, 1844. The letter is docketed as received 24 January 1844 and the red BOSTON SHIP post mark appears to have a date of Jan 22 or 23. Hence the letter may have been held for the sailing of the **Britannia** on 4 Jan. 1844, a. Bos. 21st.



Red PP for paid to destination. Orange red London and black Liverpool transit marks Carried on Caledonia, d. LP 4 Nov., a. Bos. 21 Nov. Rated 27 cts.: 25 cts. inland rate for over 25 miles + 2 cts. ship fee.






13 August 1844 Marseille to Boston

Britannia

Posted Marseilles/28/AUOT/44 with mss. notations on reverse side 7 ½ (grams weight) and 17 + 10/27 decimes on reverse side (17 decimes for French internal rate + 10 decimes, the rate for passage from Calais to Great Britain and by British packet to the United States, according to the Anglo-French Treaty of 3 April 1843). The letter arrived in Paris on 1 September and was struck with the red boxed P.P. (partial payment) and then struck twice with P.D. (paid to destination [frontier]). The letter, endorsed p. Steamer of 4th September - via Liverpool, was carried on the Packet Britannia, departing Liverpool 4 September, arriving in Boston 17 September where it was stamped SHIP/6, fee for delivery at port of entry.



Inscribed per Cambria Steamer and prepaid 1/- packet rate in London on the 19th. The folded letter was struck with the "hot-crossed bun" accountancy handstamp with matching orange-red London tombstone postmark. Black Liverpool oval transit dated MY 20 and placed on the Cambria, d. LP 20 May, a. Bos. 1 June. Postmarked in red with red BOSTON/SHIP and rated postage due 14 cts.: 12 cts. inland + 2 cts. ship fee.



1/- Packet rate. Carried by the **Britannia**, d. LP 4 July, a. Bos. 19 July. This was the second arrival of a Cunard liner since inception of new inland postage fee effective 1 July 1845: 5 cts. to 100 mi., 10 cts. over 300 mi. prepaid or unpaid. Postage due 12 cts.: 10 cts. + 2 cts. ship fee.



30 April 1846 Halifax to New York

Cambria

1/- Packet rate. Cambria d. LP 19 Apr., due in Bos. 5 May. Ship went ashore at Truro on Cape Cod 2 May. Mails were landed and taken by ox teams to Plymouth and thence to Boston by railroad. Postage due 7 cts.: 5 cts. U.S. inland + 2 cts. ship fee. The ship got off without damage and arrived in Boston on 5 May. Closed bag to New York where the large 7 was applied.





August 5, 1845. A letter to Paris posted at New Orleans and paid at the U.S. Domestic rate of 10¢, Rate of 1845, over 300 miles, New Orleans to Boston. This paid the letter only to the port of embarkation, Boston.

August 16. R.M.S. Cambria of the Cunard Line departed from Boston.

August 28. Cambria arrived at Liverpool, London transit backstamp August 29. The London "tray" mark charged France at the bulk rate of 3sh.4d. per ounce of Franch mail handled by Britain. The British Transit was 16 centimes + British Packet 84 cent. = 100 centimes per 4-oz.




The 100 cent. x 4 = 400 centimes per ounce or the equivalent of 40 decimes (also equivalent to 3sh.4d.)

Boulogne to Paris is about 200 kilometers; rate per 7.5 grams was 50 centimes, 10 grams was 80c. and 15 grams 100 cent (1 franc). Here rated as 15 grams at 100 centimes + 100 cent. Treaty = 200 centimes = 20 decimes, that amount shown as "20" in manuscript.

New United States inland postal rates were in effect as of July 1, 1845 with distances under 300 miles charged 5 cents and over 300 miles 10 cents. The letter was sent to New York by closed bag, and the New York post office applied the blue manuscript 7, the amount due from the addressee (5 cts. inland rate + 2 cts. ship fee).

Notation by recipient confirms that the letter was sent on board the Cambria and that it was received on Sept. 28. British transit post marks appear to be in error.

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
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

Posted in New Orleans where the sender PAID 10 cents for the U.S. inland rate for over 300 miles, the letter was carried on the Packet Britannia, departing Boston 19 August, arriving Liverpool 3 September. The London Exchange Office orange-red transit mark is dated BA/14SEP14/1846 (reverse). It also applied the red boxed COLONIES/&c ART.13. Under the new convention effective 1 June 1843, France paid Britain 40d per 30 grams for sea and British transit. The new COLONIES/&c ART. 12 marking of 1843 referred in the accountancy ledger (not in the convention) for sea and British transit to or from "colonies and countries beyond the sea, wherever the same may be situated." On 1 January 1846 the article for accountancy between France and Britain changed from Art. 12 to Art. 13. The French postage due of 28 decimes is based on 10 decimes sea passage due Britain (or 10d sterling) + 18 decimes French inland for a letter weighing 15 grams and traveling a distance between 501-600 km. from Calais to La Poutroye. The letter arrived in La Poutroye 18/Sept./46 (reverse).



Carried on the Packet Caledonia, which sailed from Boston on 1 November, arriving Liverpool 15 November, it received the orange-red London circular transit handstamp HC/16NO16/1846 (reverse) and the red boxed COLONIES/&c ART. 13. The Calais Exchange Office noted the weight in the upper left corner as 15 grams. Hence, the postage due in Bordeaux was 45 decimes: 20 decimes due Britain for sea passage and transit + 25 decimes for French inland for a double weight letter from Calais to Bordeaux, a distance between 601-750 km. The black Bordeaux cds backstamp is dated 20/NOV/46.



Noted in the opening sentence that this is a *duplicate* letter, a frequent business practice, the letter was posted at the Lonbard Street post office in London on 2 March. The sender paid the packet rate of one shilling and the letter was sent to Liverpool where it received the black transit handstamp L/MR/C, The **Hibernia** d. LP on 4 Mar, a. LP 20 Mar. It was received in Boston as a ship letter and struck with the SHIP/6 rate stamp for a letter addressed to the port of entry.





It received the orange red London datestamp on 2 April and the black Liverpool transit handstamp on the same date. 

Both letters arrived in Boston and were sent closed-bag mail to New York. Each was prepaid 4/- in Liverpool, quadruple packet rate, although one letter was rated 17 cts. (3 x 5cts. U.S. inland rate for under 300 miles + 2 cts. ship fee) and the other 22 cts. (4 x 5 cts. U.S. inland rate + 2 cts. ship fee). Great Britain did not have a triple rate; hence, while rated 4 s., the April letter was triple rated by the New York post office.
