

St. George, Bermuda Feb 4 1864

Honoured Father, - you have not doubt heard
of the capture of the schooner Perry by
which circumstance two of your sons became
prisoners of war, I am happy now to tell you
that I have got my parcel of honour to return
But owing to the Embargo home I think
proper to try what I can do at Amelia Island
to which place I shall sail in a few days
where is oblig still to remain on board the
prison ship till there is an Exchange
which I trust will be soon they are
well use, as Capt. Cousha the agent for
prisoners of war is a very humane and
good man, the poor fellow had all his
clothes stolen from him at the time of our
capture but I have supplyd him with sum
I lost a good part of my own and all my
adventure but you know it is the fortune
of war, give my love to all the family
Dear Sir I remain yours sincerely



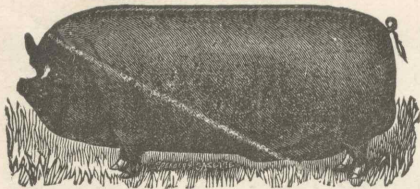

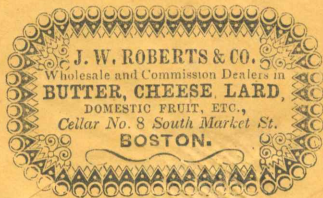
