please dispose of at best price possible placing proceeds to credit  
my accounts.

With the funds herein provided over the \$500  
from Philad<sup>a</sup> as above noticed you will please pay my  
note favour Chamberlain Brown & Co. due 1<sup>st</sup> prox<sup>o</sup>  
for \$307<sup>50</sup>/ and my note to Joseph Fulkert & Sons due



2<sup>nd</sup> prom<sup>e</sup> for \$1828.<sup>04</sup> and return me the notes cancelled

Should my Brother not have remitted you the \$500 -  
as instructed by my Brother Charles I do not wish you to advance  
any money for me but explain the transaction to Messrs Chamberlain  
Brown & Co and request them to draw on me at sight for amount  
of note Interest & Exchange and their draft will be duly honored

Business is quite brisk and money market comparatively  
easy - I wish to have declining a little owing to decline at New
