

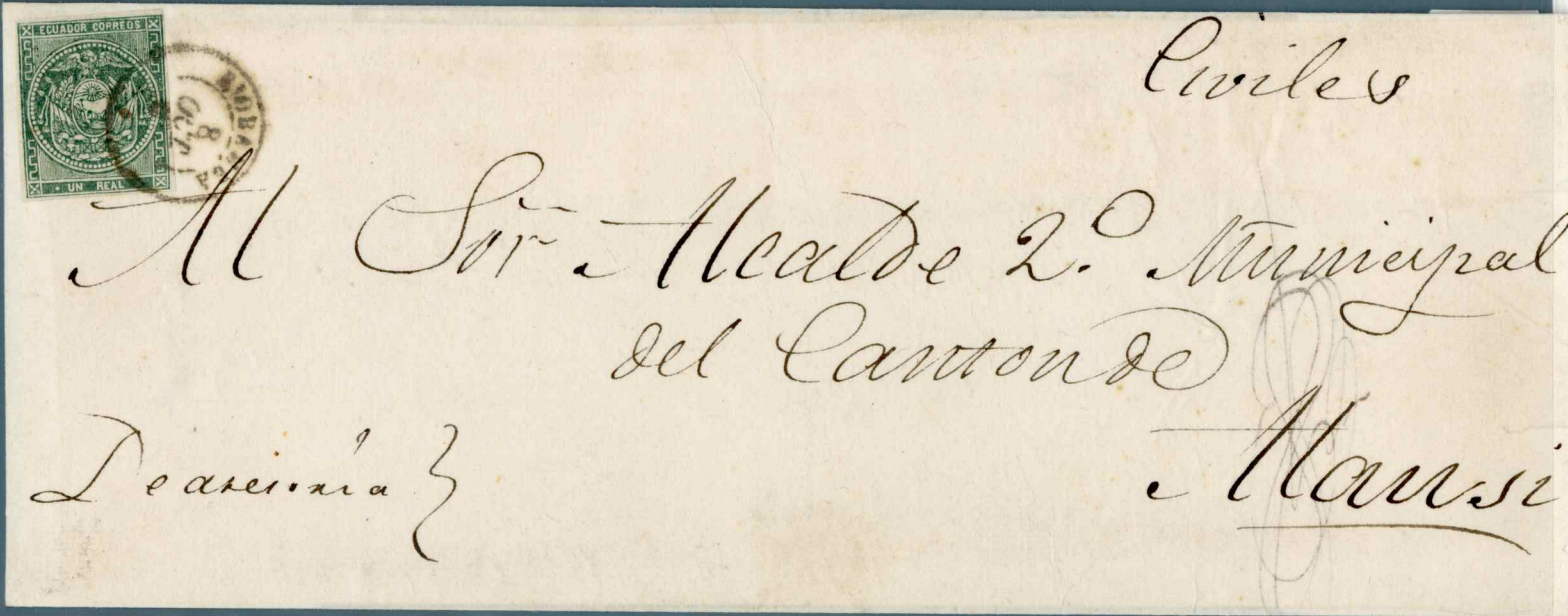

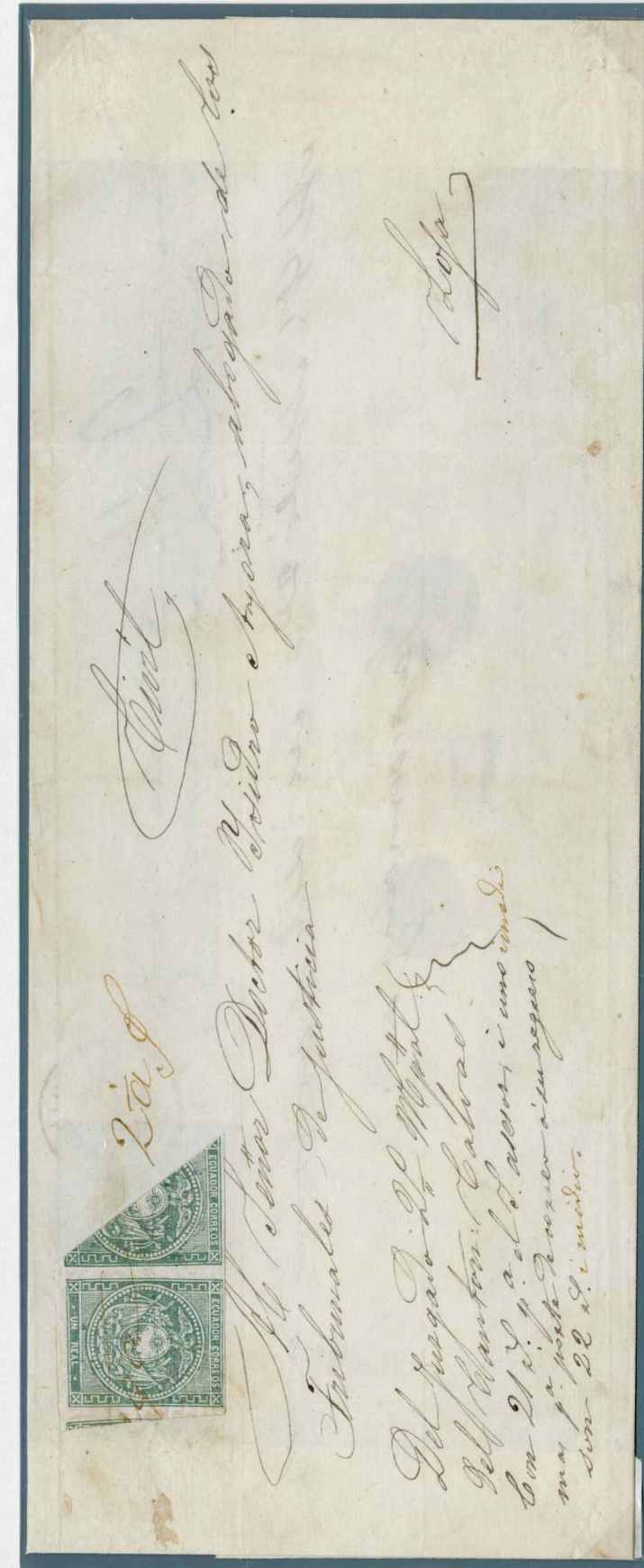

Double Parcel rate

18.5.1866: Judicial wrapper from Ambato to Riobamba. "1 3/4 oz" weight in manuscript properly paid with 1 real, which covered the weight over 1 oz and not exceeding 2 oz.



8.10.1867: Single franking paying the double parcel rate from Riobamba to Alausi.

Bisect and Double Usages

21.7.1870: Judicial wrapper from cariamanga to Loja, endorsed "2 1/2 oz", correctly paid with pair including one bisected stamp, cancelled in manuscript as all usages from cariamanga. The wrapper was reused and sent back from Loja to Cariamanga with 1/2r. and 1r., with these stamps being attached on dispatch as confirmed by manuscript endorsement, tied by Loja cds. *Ex Olgieser.*

Very few covers are known with multiples containing bisects.

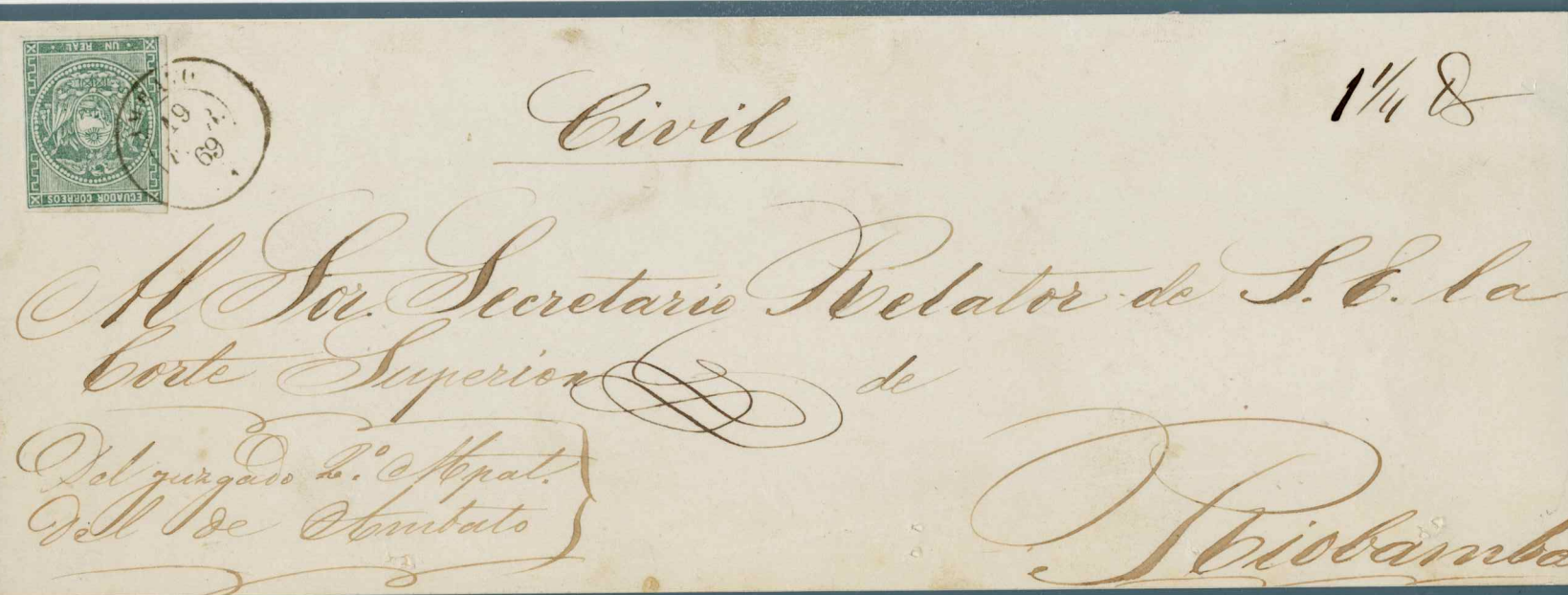

Double Parcel Rate



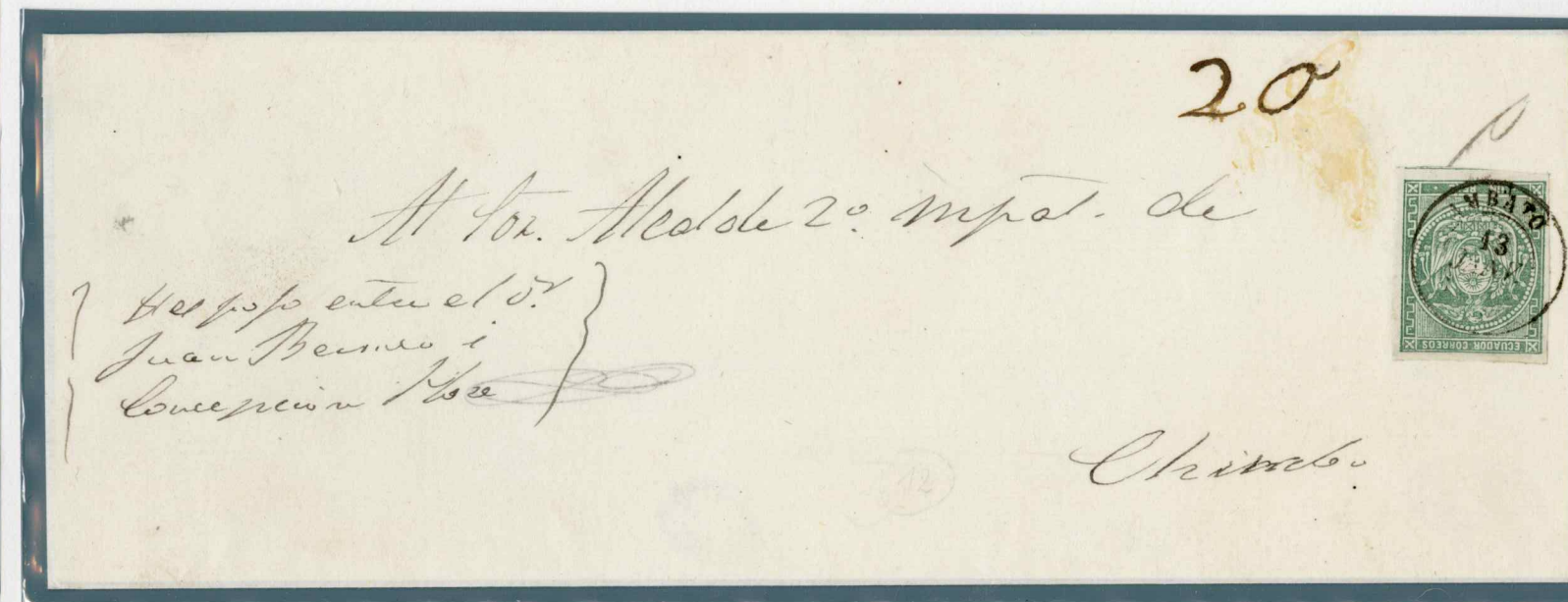
19.2.1869: Judicial wrapper front from Ambato to Riobamba, 1r. pale green, properly covering the "1 1/4 oz" weight for the double parcel rate over 1 oz and not exceeding 2 oz.

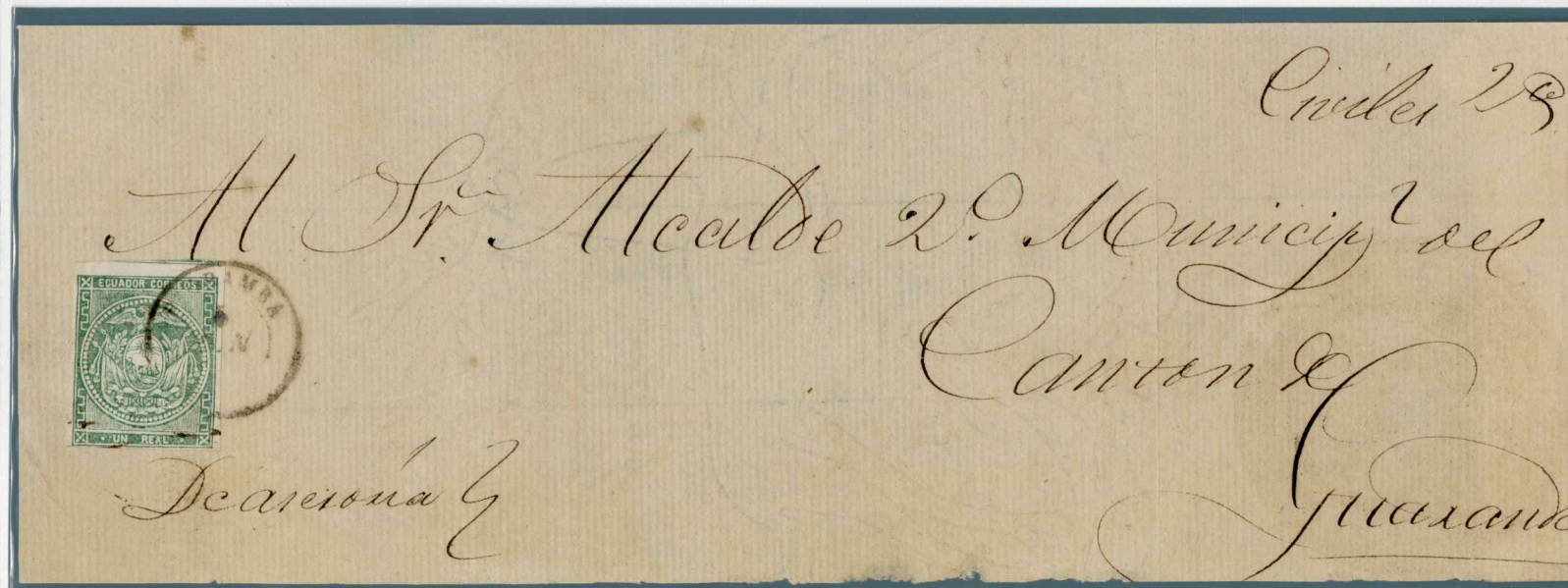
Third Period of Printing



Undated judicial cover front from Ambato to Chimbo at double parcel rate. 1r. pale greyish green.



11.11.1870: Judicial cover from Ambato to Riobamba with 1r. deep green, to pay the double parcel rate.



Judicial cover front from riobamba to Guaranda, with 1r. light greyish green.

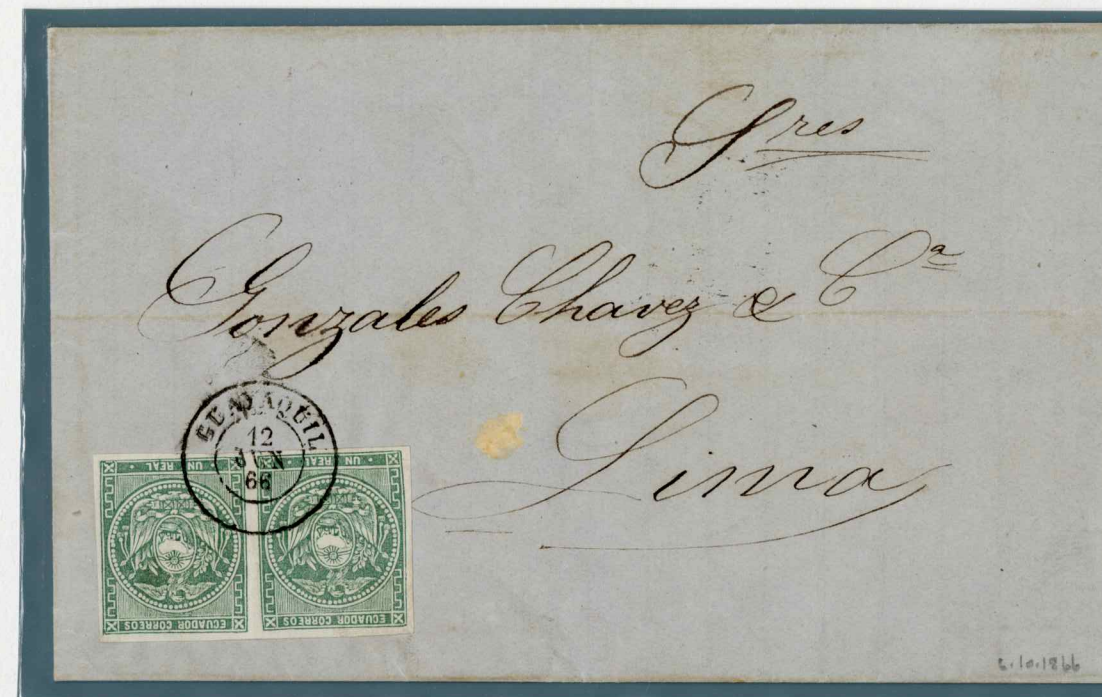
26.2.1868: Entire letter from Guayaquil to Lima at single rate, with stamps from the 3<sup>rd</sup> printing



27.8.1868: Entire letter from Guayaquil to Arequipa (Peru), with vertical pair from the third printing, positions 62 / 71, the latter featuring constant flaw through "REAL". Red cds of Callao, being the port of call of the PSNC, and taxed with "10c" for overland carriage in Peru. *Ex Ayora.*



## External Mail



6.6.1866: Entire letter from Guayaquil to Lima (Peru) at single external rate. The great majority of maritime mail to Peru before autumn 1866 was carried through the British post office at Guayaquil. This is one of the very few covers known in this period not forwarded through the British P.O.



13.12.1866: Entire letter from Guayaquil to Lima (Peru). External mail franked with 1r. green from the second printing, instead of 1r. yellow, is scarcer.
