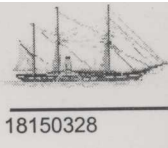

18150328 28 March 1815. An entire from London with very faint 'POST PAID WITHDRAWN SHIP LETTER LONDON' across join and seal (as usual) on reverse. Paid 'P9' (Liverpool to Falmouth 377 miles, 1s 1d plus Packet to America, 1s 3d, rebated by 1d, total 2s 3d, a third = 9d) and carried by private ship to Quebec, where it was charged a further '11½' (Pence Currency, 2½d ship and 9d inland) postage to Montreal. Poor strike, but the only single rate PPWSL recorded to Canada, otherwise fine despite a couple of ink smudges, ex de Volpi collection.
