Damage to the new plate occurred on arrival in New Zealand, most likely from acid used to remove the wax preservative for prevention of corrosion during the sea voyage. Retouching of 36 of the most severely damaged impressions was done by an engraver in late 1867. An example from row 18 position 7 is illustrated above.

The seven shade varieties recognized in the Campbell Paterson catalogue are shown with the earliest in the deep 'indigo' shade and later printings in paler shades.






