

Carranza takes over Veracruz from the USA occupation on November 23, and establishes it as his temporary capital. On December 16, 1914 Carranza's Postmaster General Cosme Hinojosa authorizes the overprinting of the Centenario issue, recently arrived from England, with a GCM handstamp slightly smaller and more watery than the one used in Hermosillo in May. These stamps are considered "regional locals" as they were used in surrounding states as Carranza won strength. They are known from Veracruz, Merida, Oaxaca, Chiapas and Veracruz. All provisional issues are declared invalid and replaced with the "Famous Men" issue on September 10, 1915 Carranza finally arrives in Mexico City on April 14, 1916.

Puebla to Cuba
August 1915

Amozoc, Puebla to La Habana, Cuba. Dated August 16, 1915, Transit via Veracruz (Aug 19), La Habana (Sept 1) and then dead letter office (Sept 13) and sent back (Sept 15) Paid 5c instead of 10c which was the 2nd rate to Cuba for 20c registration. Assessed double indemnity T 10c, which was scratched because the cover was never claimed.

Registered to Norway 1st Rate

Nogales to Bergen, Norway. Dated June 25, 1915, Paid 30c: 20c registration + 10c overseas 1st rate for 20 grams. Transit 15 days via Nogales, AZ (June 25), New York, Bergen (July 9 and 12). Very few covers exist to Europe.



Culiacan to San Francisco 2nd Rate

Culiacan to San Francisco, CA. Dated November 28, 1915, Paid 20c 2nd rate to USA for 20 grams. Constitutionlists doubled their rates after August 15, 1915, seven months after the Conventionists.

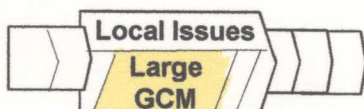

Veracruz to Cuba May 1914

Orizaba to La Habana, Cuba. Dated May 16, 1915. Transit via Veracruz (May 17), La Habana (May 24), Unclaimed Habana dead letter office (July 5). Paid 5c 1st overseas first rate to Cuba for 20 grams.
