

12 January 1845 letter headed "Sydney" enclosed in another letter to a friend in Jacksonville Illinois, since sender did not know addressee's St. Louis address. Note at right - "If you can find no direct way of sending us a letter, send your letter under cover direct to the Postmaster General London with one shilling enclosed to pay postage." Mail between the continents was not easy - no 1840s letters from USA to Australia have been recorded.
