





LZ 129 Hindenburg Zeppelin being moved from the hangar to the field b&w pc with 15 pg blue Air mail st. (Scott N° 48) pmk Frankfurt (Rhein-Main) dd 23/7/37, with red Zeppelin cachet, circulated to Northfield, New Jersey, USA This card was probably carried by plane, due to the fact that the "Hindenburg" accident and final flight happened on May 3–6, 1937, and the "Graf Zeppelin" last flight from Brazil took place on May 8, am Main on what would prove to be its 590th and final flight

In June 18th the airship was ferried to Frankfurt. Upon arrival at its massive hangar at the Frankfurt airport, the airship was deflated and opened to the public as a museum.

Registered First Flight (air mail) cover with Czech (Ceskoslovensko) 24 Kcs stamp cancelled by double circle cancellation Praha Leteckaposta Praha-New York dd 17/6/1946, apllied twice with plane printed drawing, addressed to New York and with registered label 1 N° 2327 C, with backstamp cancell New York, dd June 19 1946, from Ervin Hirsch to Arthur Kessler. A trial First flight from Prague to New York took plave on 3 May 1946, just five weeks before inauguration of Pan American Airways extension of FAM-18 to Vienna via London, Brussels and Prague. Registered cover with "VIA AIR MAIL" cachet with backstamps of New York May 5 & May 6. from Ervin Hirsch to Arthur Kessler. (1946 PAA extension to Vienna)
