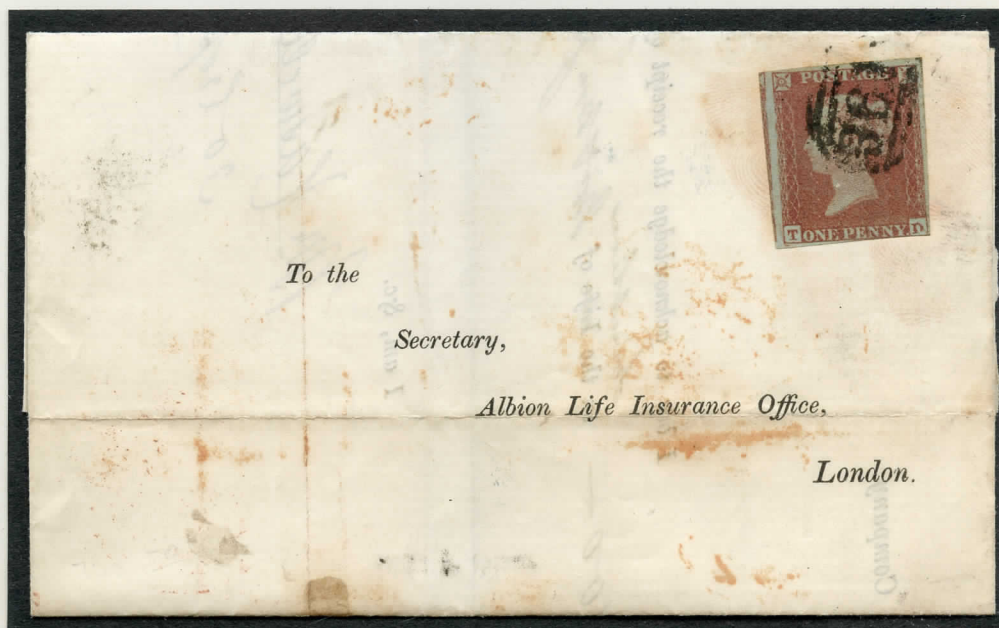

Total number of plates used was 154. Plates of 240 subjects.  
Plate numbers appear in scroll work at sides of stamps.

The "Penny Black" was the first regularly issued stamp in the world.



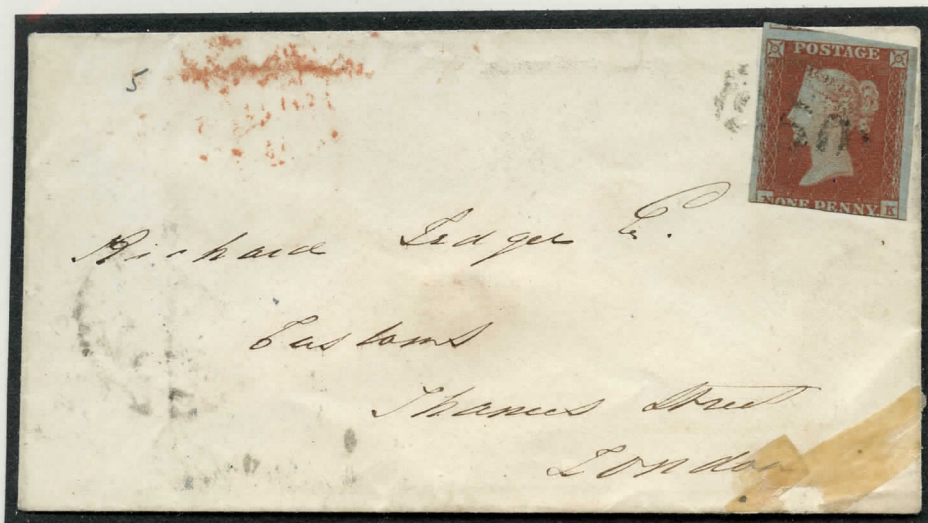
Scott #2

The so-called "Maltese Cross" design was the first cancellation used for obliterating British postage stamps and was in use from 1840 to 1844.

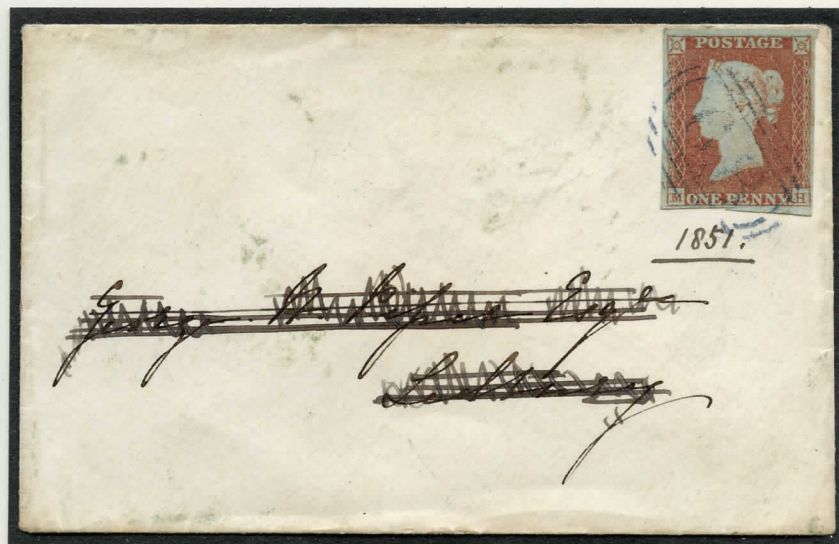

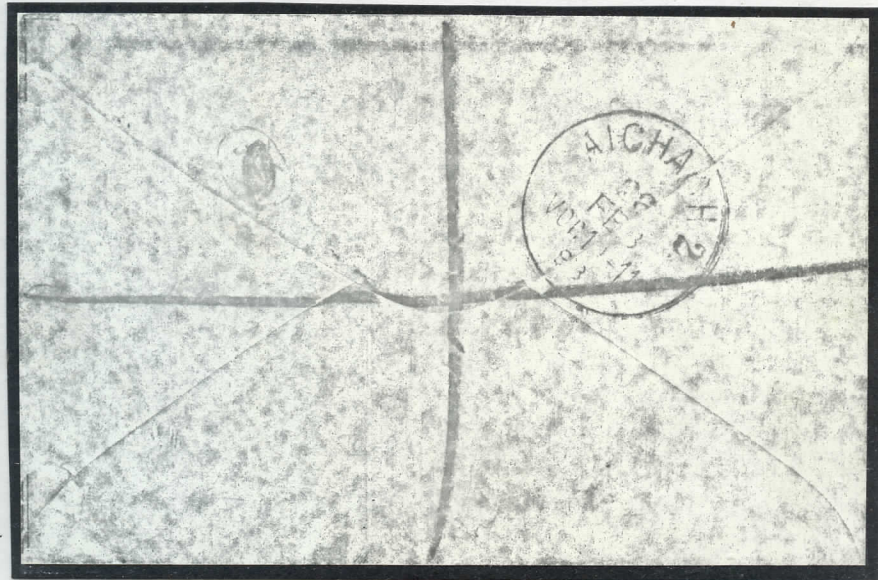
GREAT BRITAIN

Issued February 25, 1893. Handstamped surcharge on Great Britain #111. 40 Paras on 1/2 Pence. This was a provisional stamp, made and used at Constantinople for five days only.
