

## The 1938 Presidential Issue - The Rates

### Purpose and Scope of Exhibit

This exhibit presents the rates of postage and special service fees, both domestic and foreign, that were in effect while the Presidential Issue -the Prexies- were current (1938-1961) in the post offices. These rates are selected to show the flow of the rates.

### Importance

This series of stamps was current for over 20 years, which spanned a world war. The rates, especially the foreign air mail rates during World War II, varies considerably over time. The rates would simplify and, in some cases, be reduced over time. The prexies were the workforce of the postal system that was up to the task of moving the mail without a revision of the original set.



Half cent stamp used as change. Since double weight cover not fully prepaid, half cent stamps used as postage due. ONE half cent stamp affixed and given back as change and NOT CANCELLED.

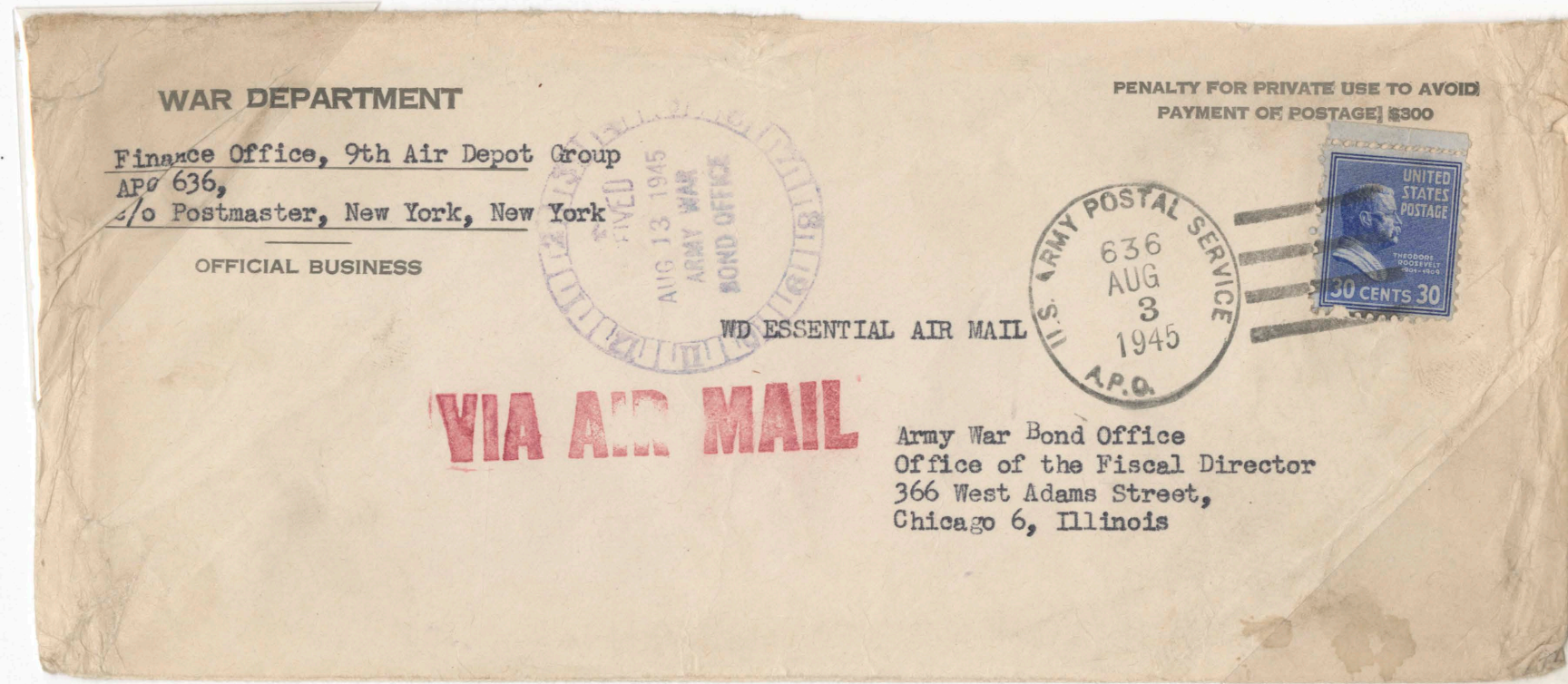

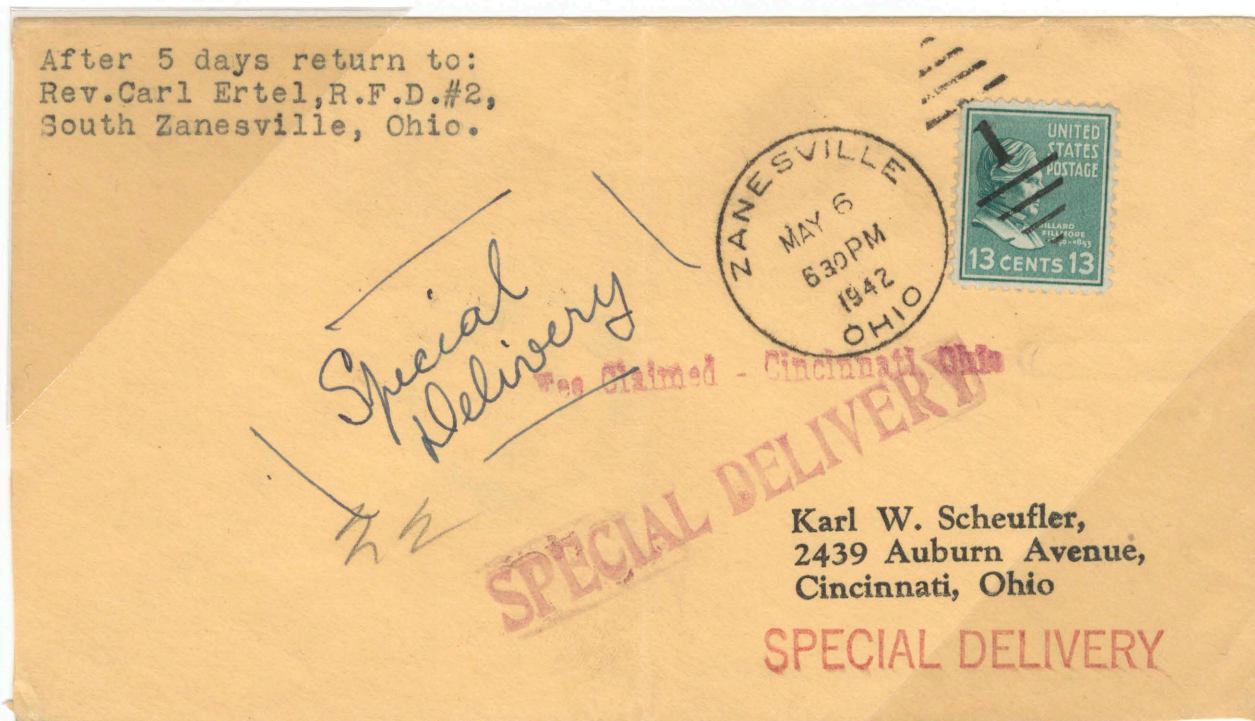

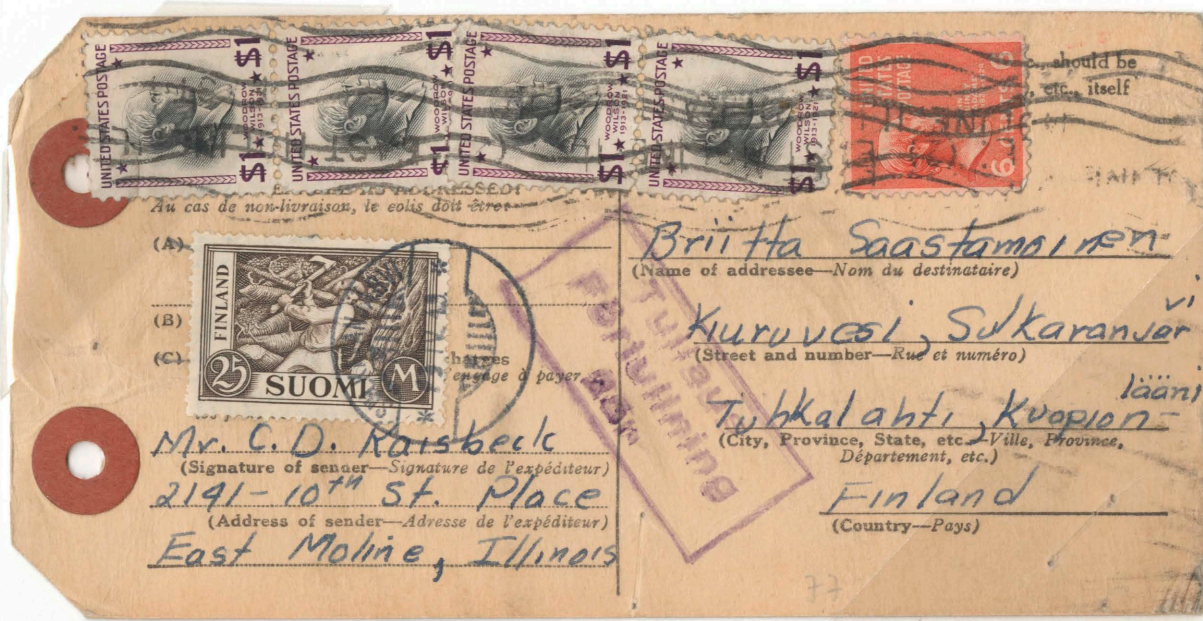
