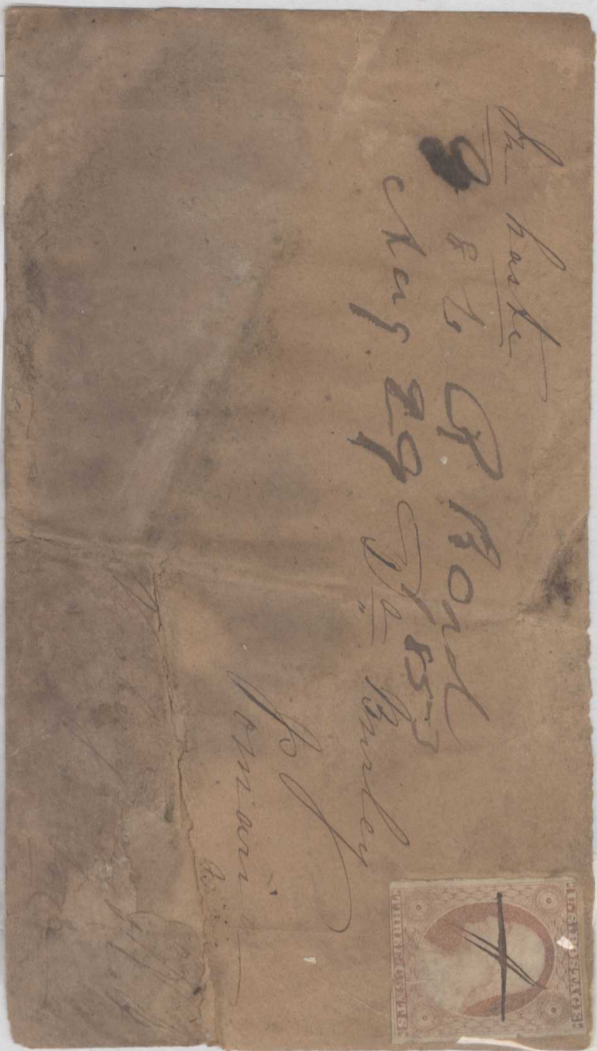

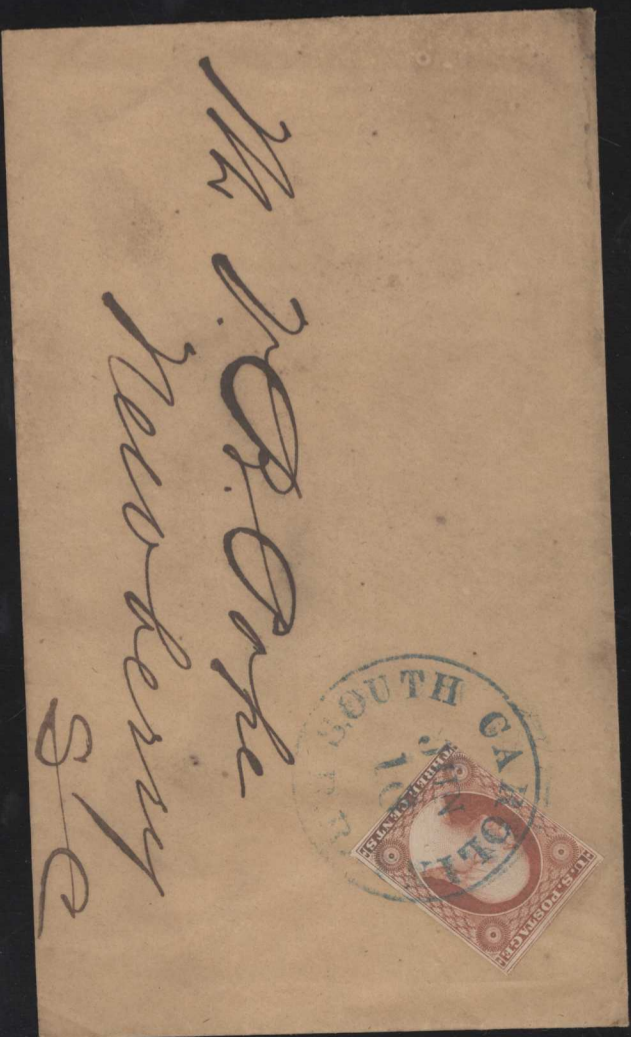
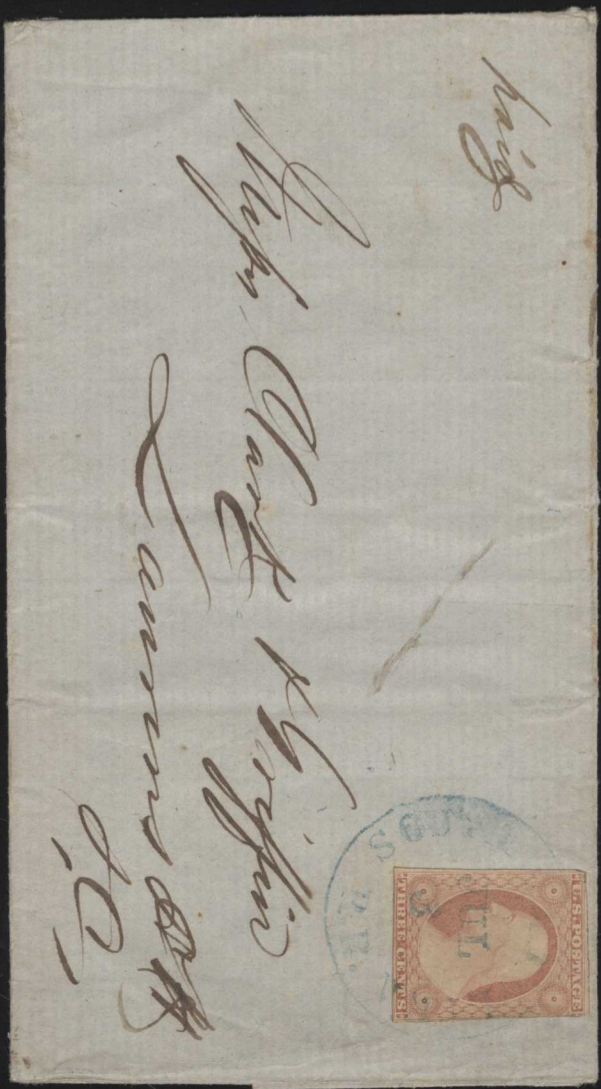

Manuscript G. & C. R. Road [Greenville & Columbia R. R.] cover of August 28, 1853 to Dr. Berly in Pomaria, S. C.

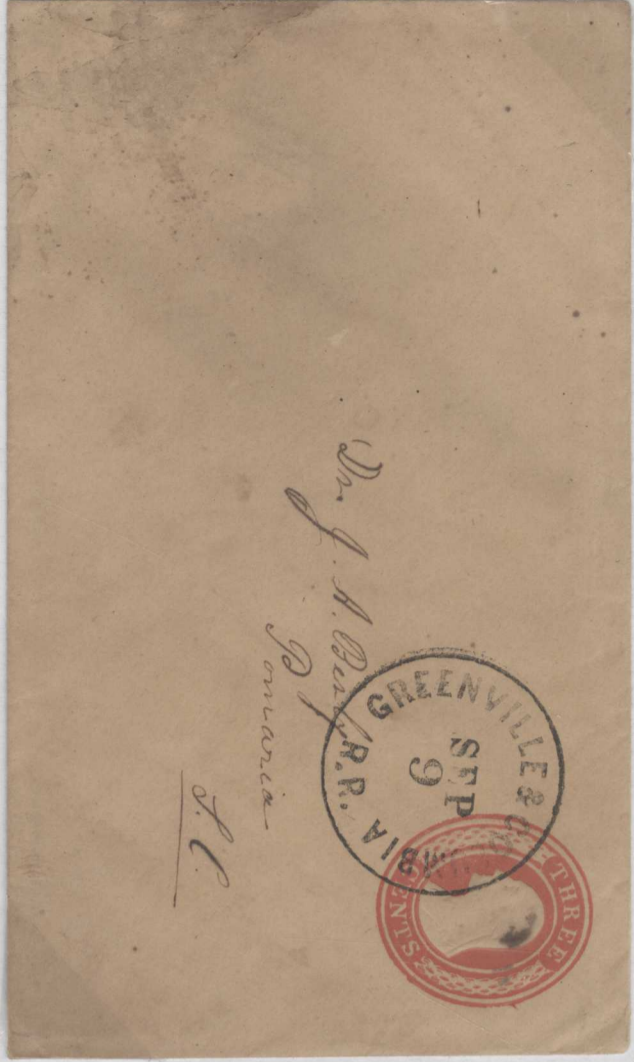


Greenville & Columbia R. R. postmark of April 21 [1850s] To Miss Berly in Pomaria, S. C.

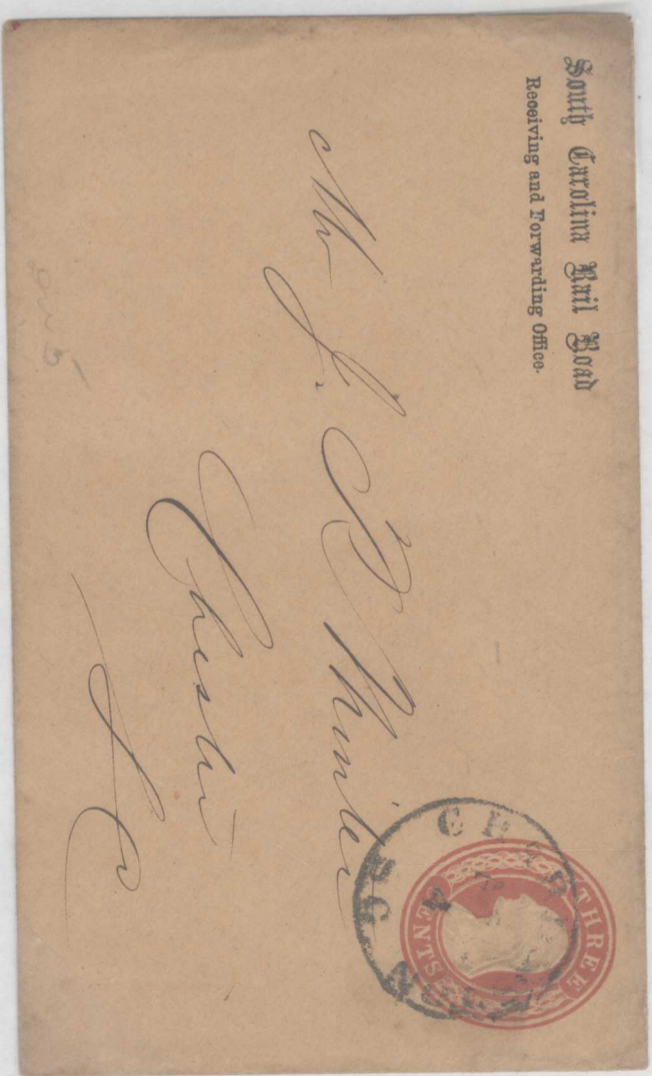
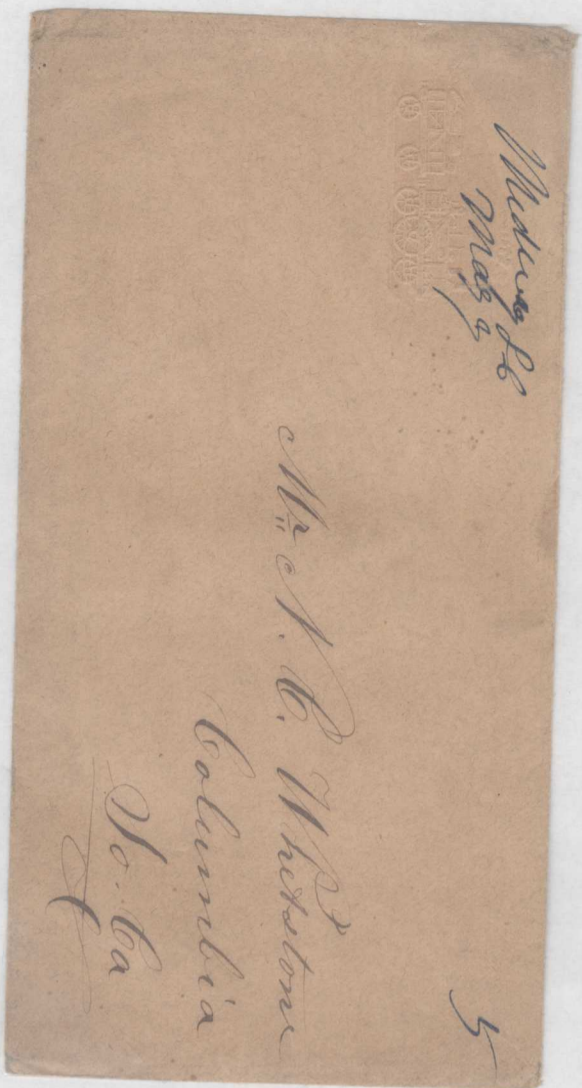

embossed 1830s steam engine and coach.



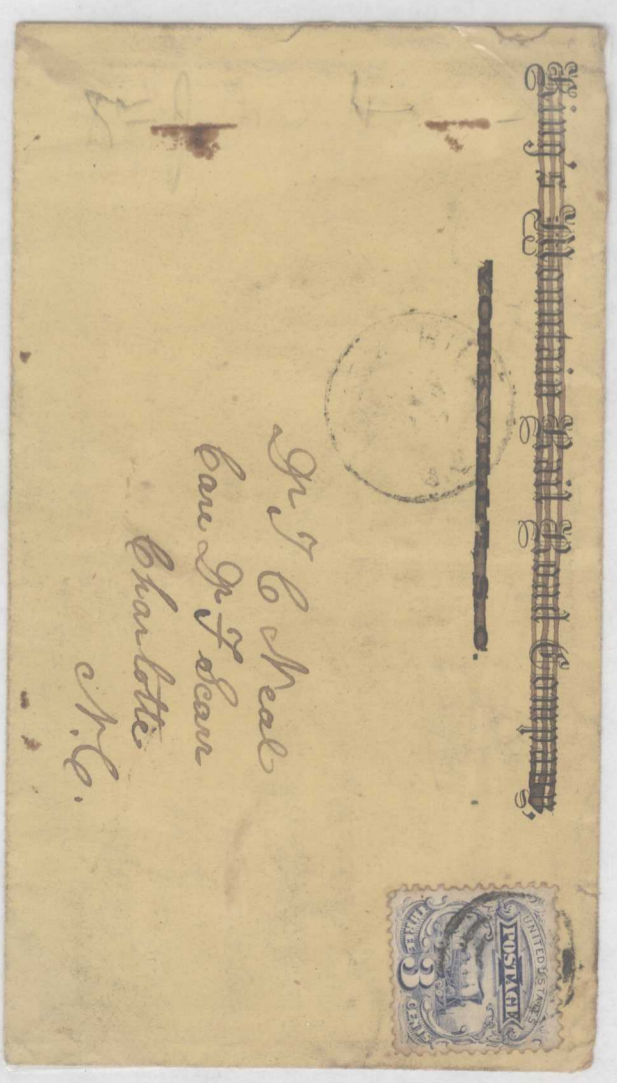
Two South Carolina Rail Road cornercards of the Receiving & Forwarding
Office with a three cent postal stationery and a 3 cent 1850s U. S. stamp.



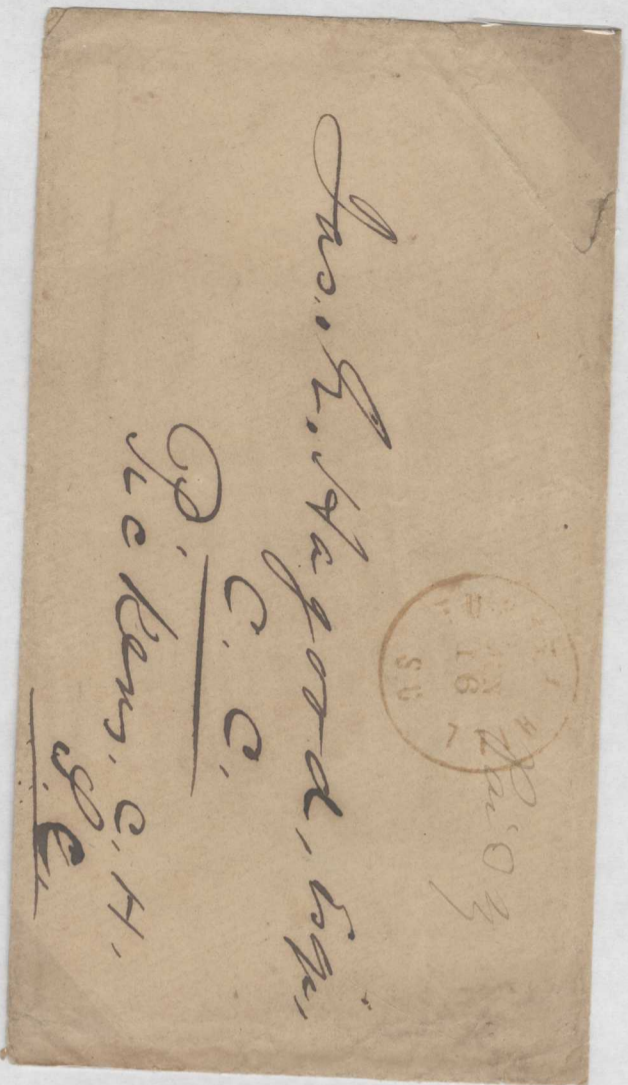

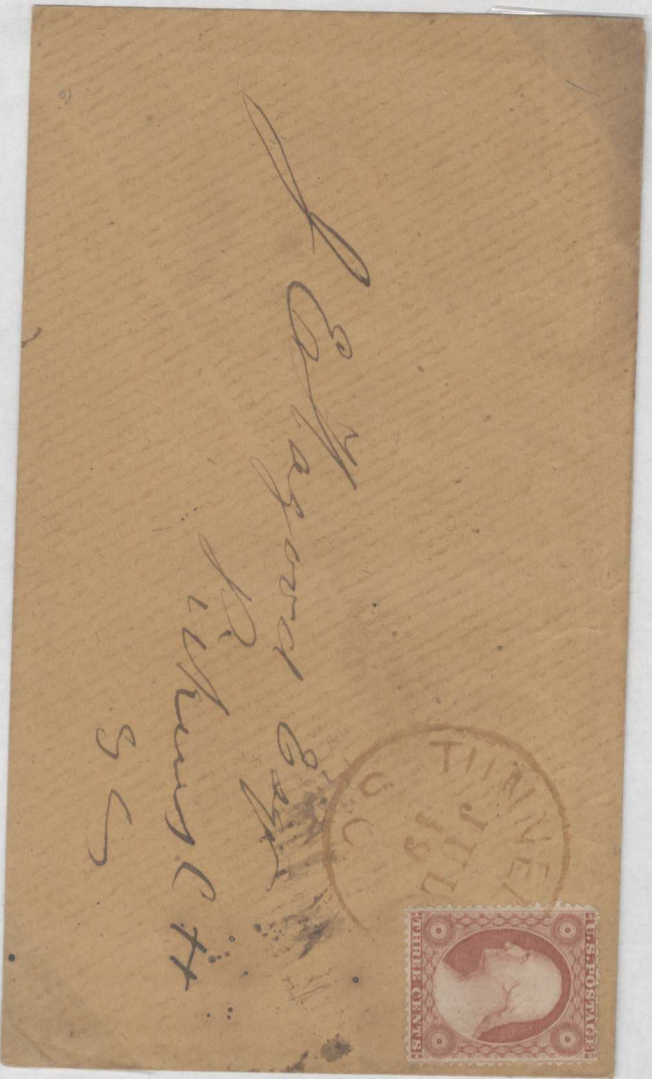
Two antebellum South Carolina R. R. covers featuring a blue 5 (due) and a blue postmark.



Two late 1860s cornercards of the King's Mountain Railroad Company, Yorkville, S. C. This railroad was completed in 1855.

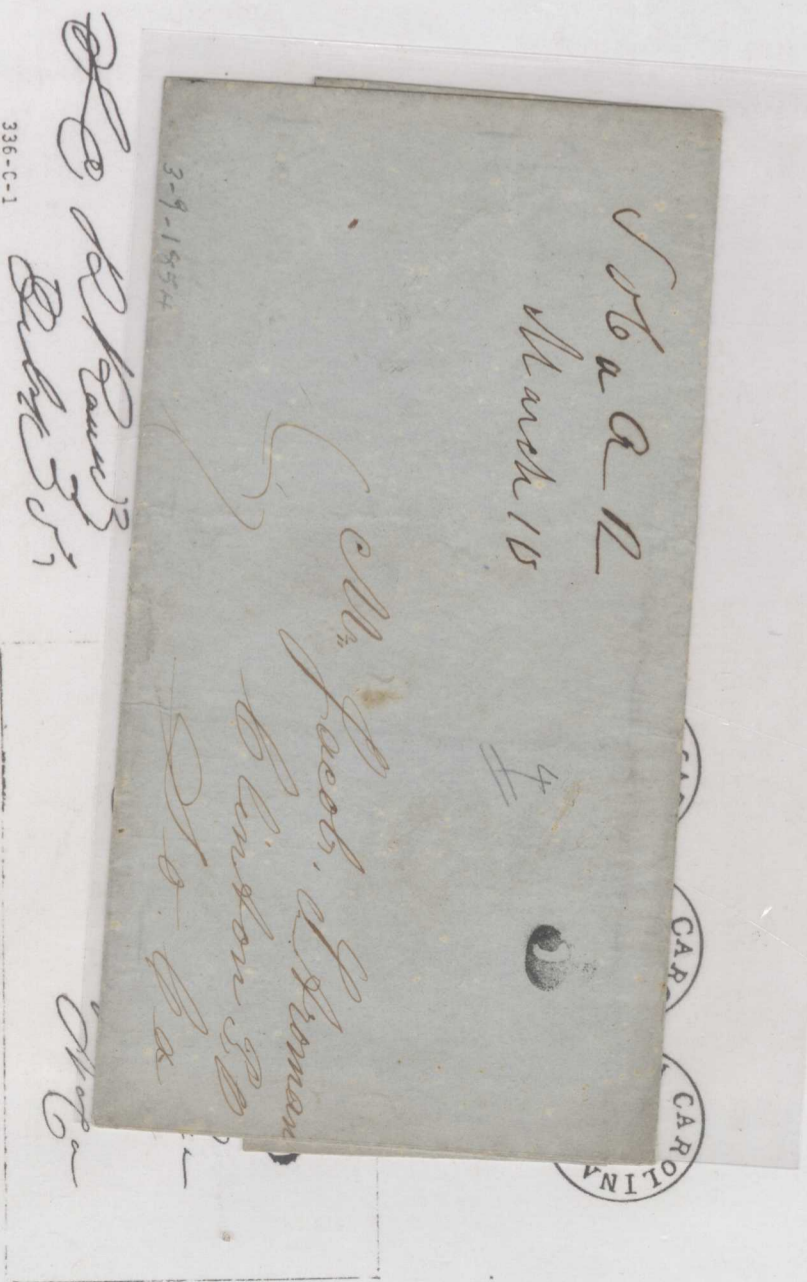


An 1850s Tunnel Hill, S. C. stampless cover with a Ms. Paid 3.

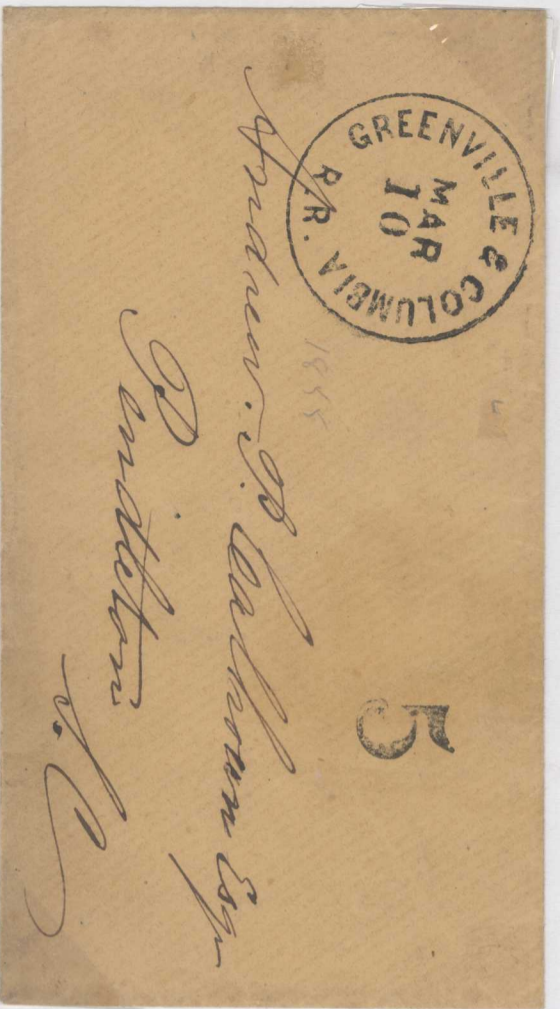
