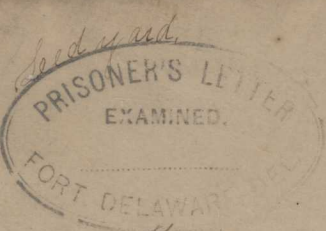

FORT DELAWARE, DEL., APRIL 28TH, 1865: 1 pg. (8 x 10) in ink, written by J.M. Lovett, to his brother, reverse of letter is addressed to Paw Paw Depot, Morgan County, Va.: he acknowledges the receipt of his letter with the \$5 which he is truly thankful for as it will afford him great relief, his health is no better and he fears that it will never be, he is suffering with a bad cough, severe pain in his breast and his lungs are also affected, he hopes to get home upon the necessary arrangements, there is no idea of when his release will be, mentions that Capt. Heiskell is there with him & how the captain is fretting because he has not heard from his wife since the fall of RICHMOND, says to send word if he knows anything about her, he enquires about numerous girls by name, & more, very neatly written Confederate prisoner of war letter. Capt. Heiskell who is mentioned is Felix D. Heiskell, who was a lieutenant in the Hampshire Guards which at the outbreak of the war reported to T.J. Jackson at Harpers Ferry. They then were mustered into the 13th Va. Inf. under A.P. Hill. The town of Hampshire, Va. is mentioned in Lovett's letter. Capt. J. Mortimer Lovett commanded Co. E, 23rd Virginia Cavalry!

18265 FORT DELAWARE: US 3c rose #65 used with Delaware City Apr 4, 1865, duplex addressed to Dr. L. C. Cordell, Care of Thos. A. Moore, Esq., Clerk of the Court, Charlestown, Jefferson Co[unty, West] Va. with manuscript censor marking "Ex & Permitted By Order of E. W. Andrews, Capt & Prov Marsh," with mandated endorsement "from Lt. E. F. Cordell, Prisoner of War, Fort Delaware." Bit edge worn with small sealed opening an flap tears. Handstamped censor markings were discontinued in November 1864, according to Harrison. This manuscript CENSOR MARKING IS UNLISTED in his book on Civil War prisons. \$250.
