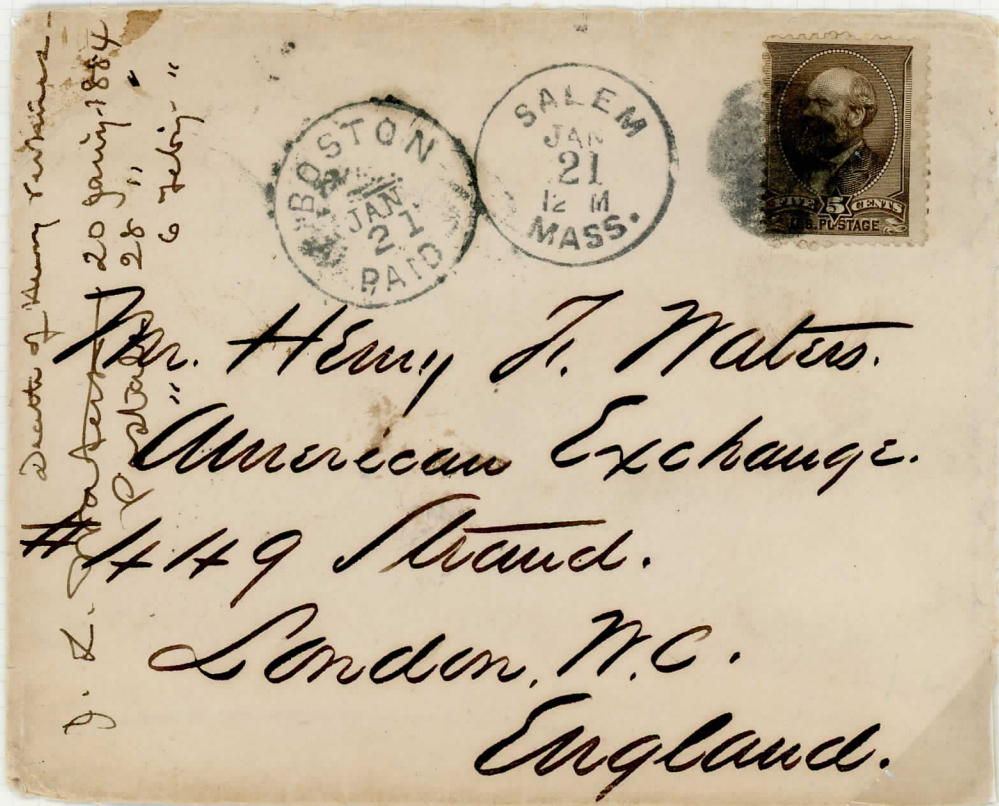


AMERICAN EXCHANGE IN EUROPE

IT WAS RECEIVED IN LONDON ON AUG 17 WHERE IT WAS BACKSTAMPED, LONDON.W.C. / DATE / S.M.P. TOGETHER WITH THE FORWARDING AGENTS HANDSTAMP. IT WAS RE-ADDRESSED TO FREIBURG GERMANY WHERE IT WAS RECEIVED ON AUG 19, AT NO EXTRA COST.

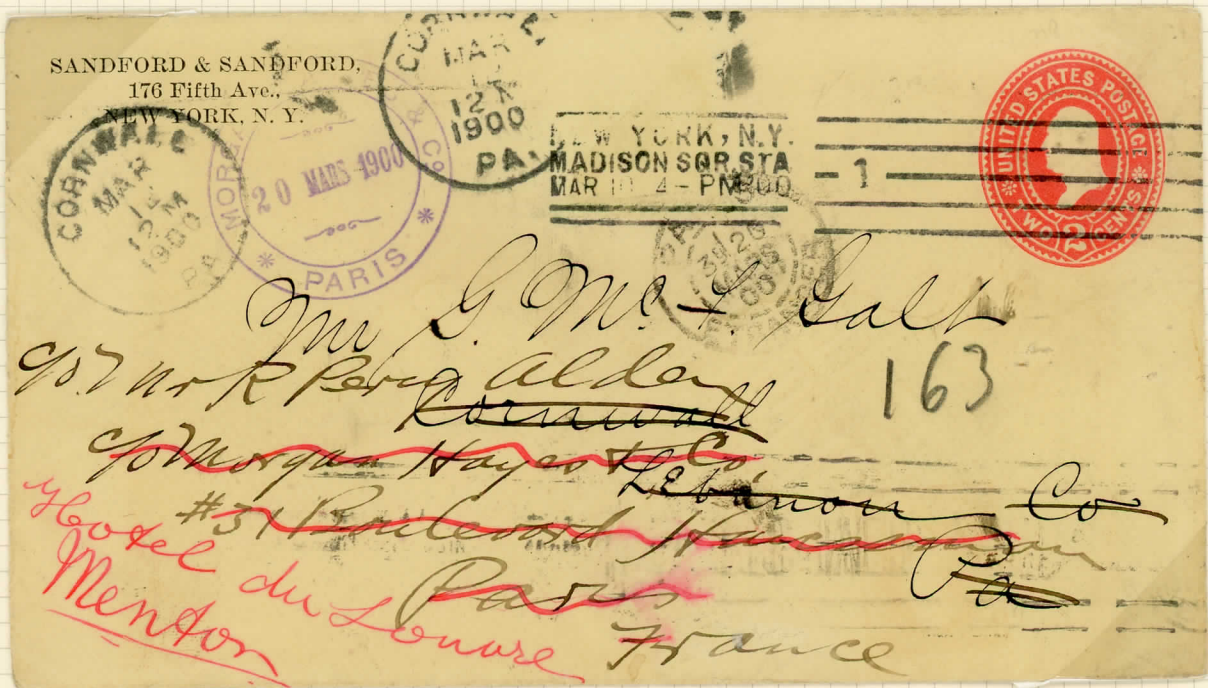

Forwarded to Menton, received Mar 21.

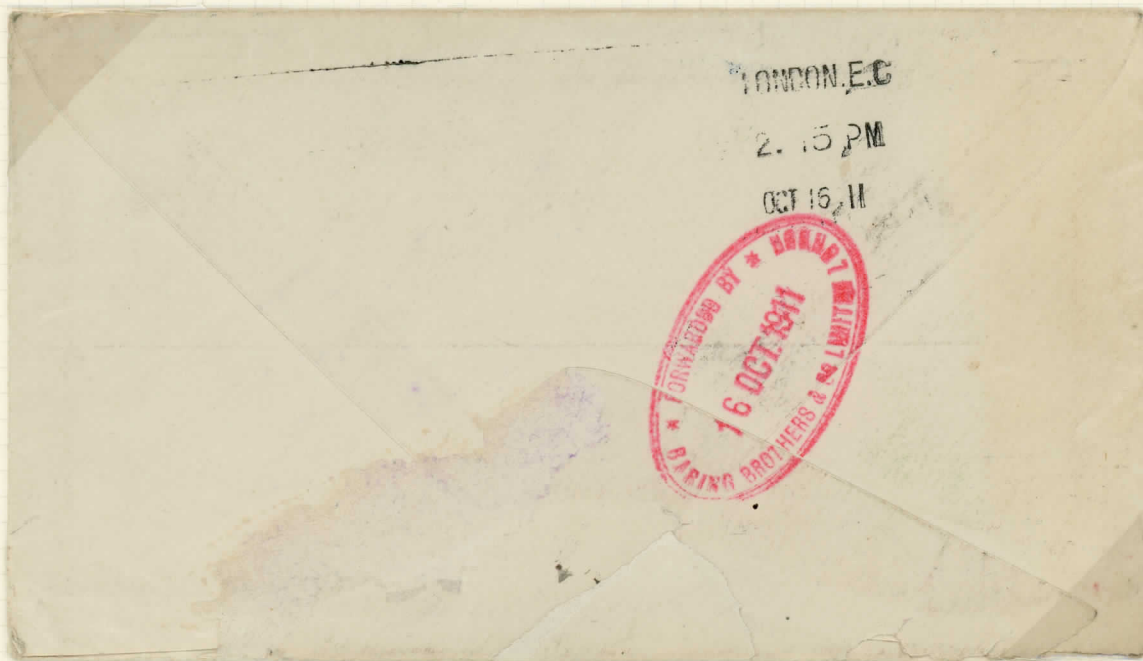

They were sent to the forwarding agents Messrs Baring Brothers in London who forwarded them.

Letter with 5¢ (Scott #270) used from Auburn, N.Y. on Oct 12, 1902 addressed to 3, Waterloo Place London c/o Am. Exp Co.

The cover was then readdressed to Berlin.



FORWARDING AGENT

2¢ postal stationery envelope with additional 1¢ and 2¢ stamps of the 1898 issue which was originally addressed to:-

London S.W.

& then forwarded to
5, Pembroke Square,
Earls Court.

The forwarder's handstamp is on the reverse.
