The Five Cent Brown (Scotts #1) was issued on July 1st, 1847.

During the four years that the Five Cent Stamp was valid for postal use. A total of 22,200 were sent to Mobile, Alabama.

According to the Post Office Records-Fulton, Mo; was not issued any Stamps of 1847. It, would be assumed that someone passing through Fulton, Mo had stamps, and mailed this letter with one, of the 1847. Or, one of the citizens had been to a larger town which recieved a supply of them.

This, is a very scarce useage from this small town.

Petersburgh, Virginia.

Five Cent Stamp of 1847; (USA #1).

Petersbbrgh/May 21/5cts/Va." all markings in red.



#1: " Petersburg, May 21, 5cts, Va." Double strike of town PMK.

According to Elliot Perry, there was only 1500 of the Five Cent 1847 issue sent to Petersburg, Va. Making uses of this stamp scarce.

Aberdeen, Mississippi had a total of one thousand five cent 1847 stamps sent to it's office. And, only a hundred of the ten cent 1847's.

And, this was over a four years that the 1847 stamps were valid.

Elliot Perry, stated once, that there were less than ten known covers used from the State of Mississippi. The total may have been added to over the years, but, not by much.

Very rare usage of the 1847's.

WAS RATED 10 CENTS DUE FOR THE OVER 300 MILES RATE
TO DANVILLE, PA. THE FIVE CENT STAMP PAID ONLY THE
UNDER 300 MILE RATE. THIS COVER WAS USED ABOUT 1848.

The Act of 1847...primary provisions, postage stamps introduced with use optional. 1845 rates of under 300 miles @5¢ and 10¢ over 300 miles continued. Charges same for prepaid or collect service. Circulars or printed matter charged 3¢ per sheet.



May 12, 1849; Series 1847 dark brown 5¢ stamp for single weight letter. Note continued use of AN-7 town cancel. A Type S-17 seven bar grid cancels stamp.

January 10, 1850; Series 1847 reddish brown 5¢ stamp struck with the S-17 grid. Charleston marking is an AN-17.
