Goods imported may be Bonded for Warehousing either at Montreal or Quebec.

Bonds may be given for all Provincial Duties when amounting to £50 Currency, with conditions for payment at Six Months from date, if the same shall be dated on or before the 1st day of September—and if dated after the 1st September, then they become due on the 1st April next ensuing.

Ten per cent. is added to all Invoices paying Imperial per centage Duties, and Duty is paid at Currency rate.

Provincial per centage Duties are also paid in Currency rate.

All Specific Duties are paid in Sterling.

The Subscribers in again tendering their services to the business public as Custom House, Forwarding and Commission Agents at this Port, will on their part, promise prompt and faithful attention to the interests of their employers, and at satisfactory charges. For the information of new Importers we would state the necessity of sending Invoices to us as ~~Custom House~~ upon shipment of Goods, so as to avoid detention by the Custom House ~~Duty~~ ~~ent~~. Goods shipped at New York, Albany, or Troy, either by "the Northern Transportation Line Association," or the "Northern Line," and consigned to us, will come forward with despatch and safety. Goods shipped at Boston, and assigned to either of the above Lines at Albany, and ourselves at St. Johns, will come direct. The Subscribers are prepared at all times to contract for the transport of Freight in quantities to and from Montreal and New York, and intermediate Ports.

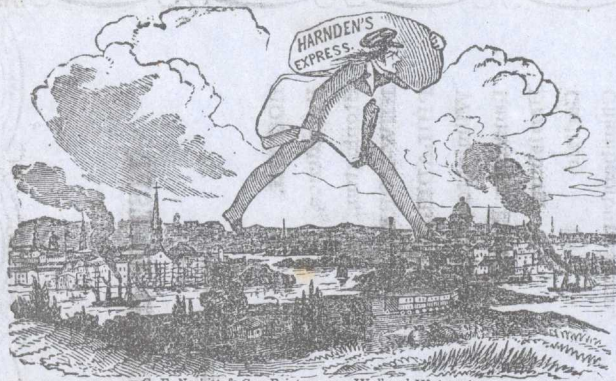
