

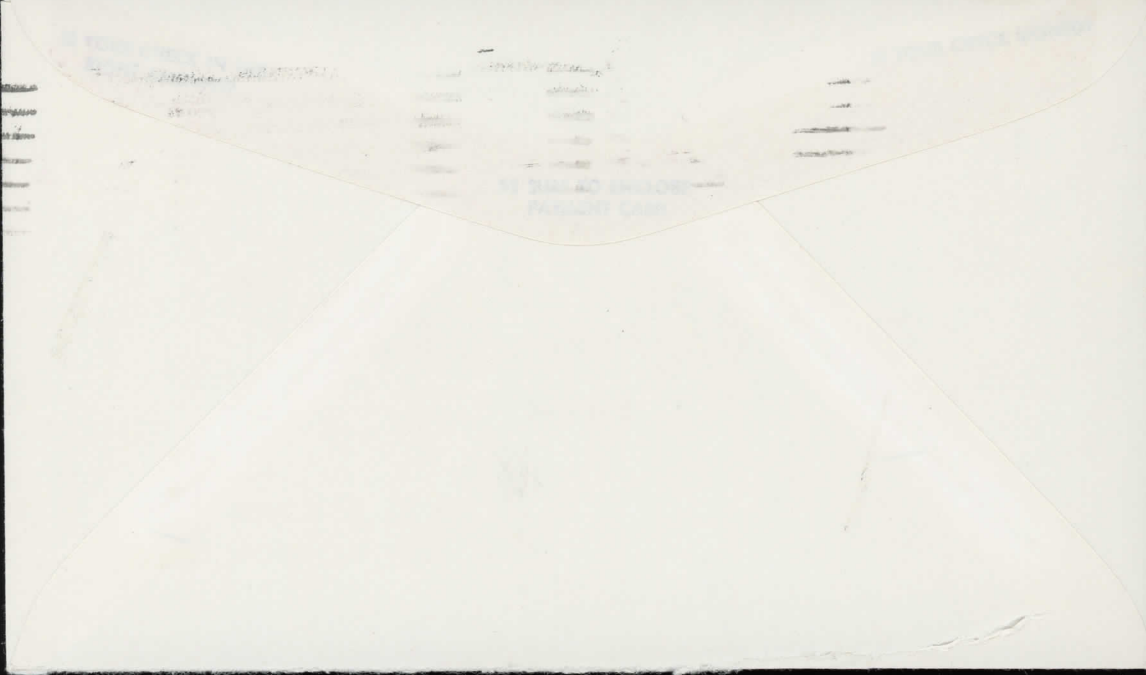

The four cent Lincoln imperforate coils mounted above were discovered by the undersigned on Monday, September 10, 1962. A single was found on cover in the mail received by The Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas, on September 7, 1962. The letter was mailed on September 6, 1962 by Paul A. Vinsant. Mr. Vinsant was contacted on Wednesday, September 12, 1962 and he related that he had his secretary mail the letter. Mr. Vinsant is employed by Briggs-Weaver Machinery Co. and says that the stamps were purchased by one of the company employees at the Arlington Heights Branch of the Fort Worth Post Office on or about September 5, 1962.

On the morning of Thursday, September 13, Mr. Vinsant purchased the remaining copies of the imperforate stamps from the secretary. It is estimated that she used about 100 stamps on ordinary mail before the discovery. As far as anyone knows only the one cover was saved out of all the stamps that were used. The stamps all came out of a roll of 500 coils and as shown by the strip above, started being perforated again a little over one-third way through the roll.

The above stamps were purchased by the undersigned from Mr. Paul A. Vinsant of 3717 Kimberly Lane, Fort Worth, Texas.

In mail sale # 28 11/13/93 Ritter offered a commercial cover with Fort Worth Natl Bank C.C. addressed to Willard C. Jackson with strip of 3 imperf. 1058's described "stamps torn, presumably in anticipation of use, inasmuch as L. stamp was torn from strip".
