























EXPLANATION: In this Table we list the 47 Royal Family Specimen Stamps by the Date they were placed in the American Bank Note Archives. We've also identified 12 different SPECIMEN Types and these are labeled by Roman Numerals. These SPECIMENS differ in size and typestyle. We see that some TYPES were used only once on the Newfoundland stamps while TYPE VIII was used 20 times. Remember the Amer. Bank Note Co. was printing the stamps of many other countries and the SPECIMEN overprints were applied for a period and then probably wore out. We have not been able to establish how the overprints were applied. The regularity of spacing, position, pressure and inking on most sheets seems to imply a mechanical process. However, there is the occasional variety (double overprint etc) which tends to support a manual process.

1897 ROYAL FAMILY ISSUE, COMPLETE SPECIMENS

In 1990, the American Bank Note Co. archives were opened and sold to dealers/collectors. Many of the items sold were seen by those outside the A.B.N.C. for the first time. The following stamps represent ALL specimen issues of this set over twenty years - and not just first printing specimens sent to the United postal Union. Quantities of these items range from 100-400. In some instances, careful study is needed to distinguish specimens from the various printings. Descriptors are primarily those provided by Edward Wener, of INDIGO, who purchased the complete inventory of these unique issues. Descriptions follow.

SCOTT #86 is included, although SCOTT shows it as distinct from the Royal Family issues (for design purposes); however both LOWE and BOGGS place it within the set, since it was apparently issued to protect the post office from illicit use of SCOTT 82, the 2¢ value, lost at sea, but washed ashore.
