

THE 2005 ST. JOHN'S TO CLIFDEN FLIGHT



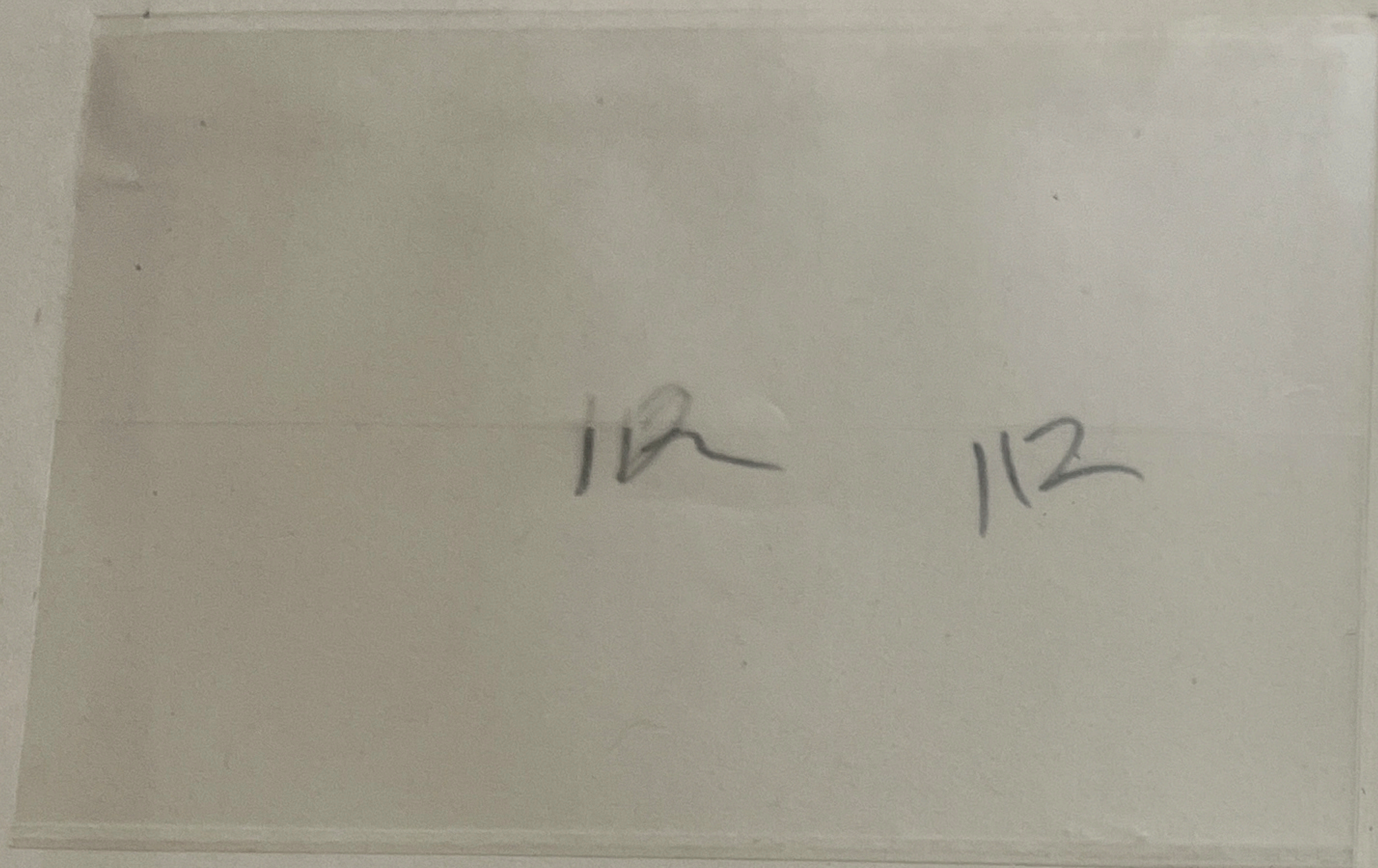

A painstakingly recreated Vickers-Vimy was put together in California, and flown across the continent to St. John's. From there it was flown by Fossett and Rebholz over the Atlantic, leaving July 2nd. 18 hours later they landed at Clifden, successfully recreating the 1919 flight, in an open cockpit like before. It was an "endurance test" said Fossett. 500 signed and flown covers bearing a special St. John's "Alcock & Brown" postmark, at the proper \$1.45 rate, were handed to the Clifden postmaster.

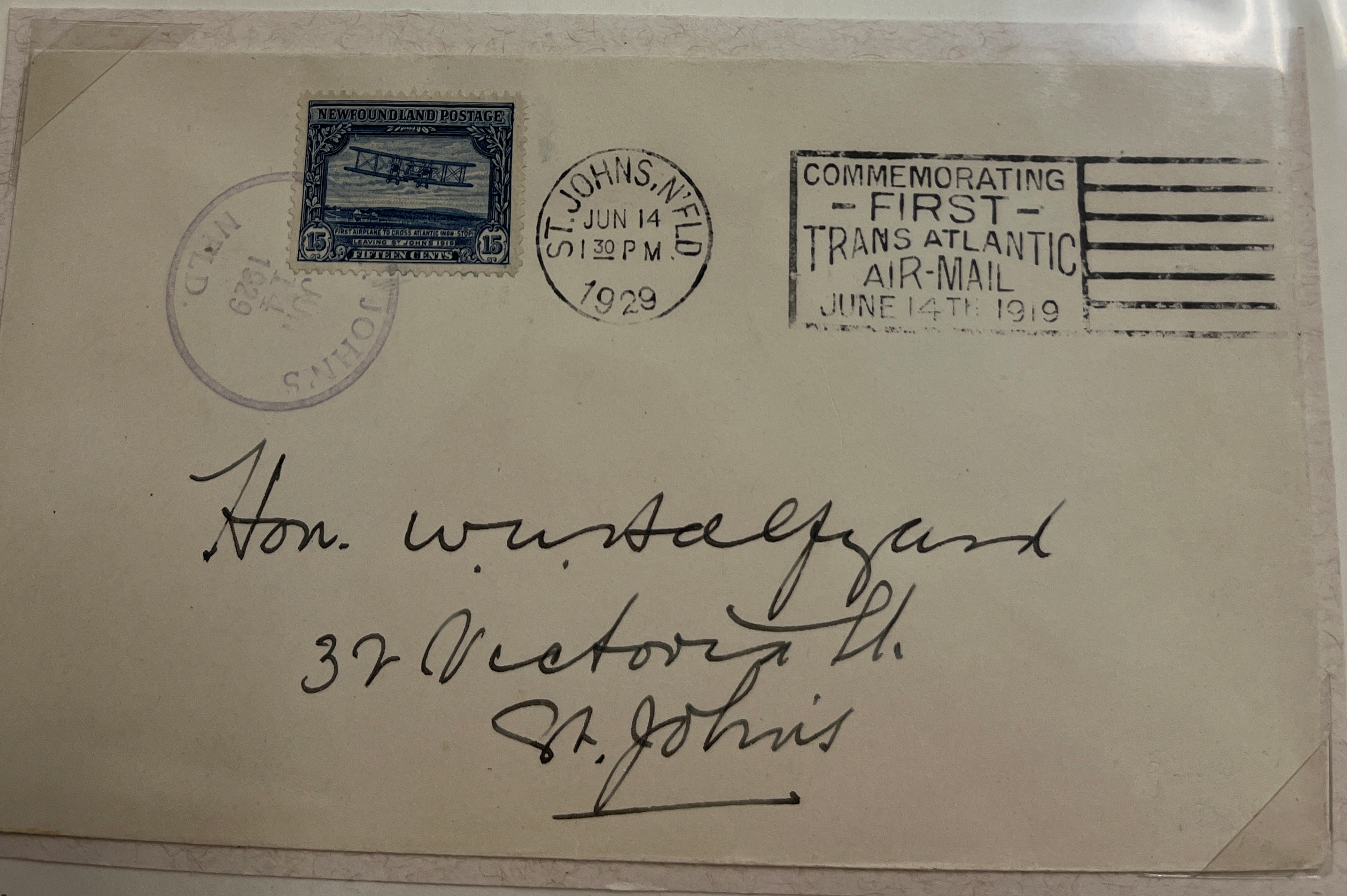
The 15¢ value of the 1928 "Publicity Issue" showed the Vickers-Vimy leaving Lester's Field on the successful 1919 flight.

An Authentic Flight Souvenir

When Steve Fossett and Mark Rebolz flew the Vickers-Vimy Silver Queen from St. John's, Newfoundland to Clifden, Ireland last July, the aircraft carried mail aboard, as did the original Vimy flown by John Alcock and Whitten Brown in 1919.

Each bears a colorful cachet developed by a design showing the original Vimy and an authorized by Canada Post for the 2005 flight. Covers were numbered, with 250 covers by Restoration Inc. All the

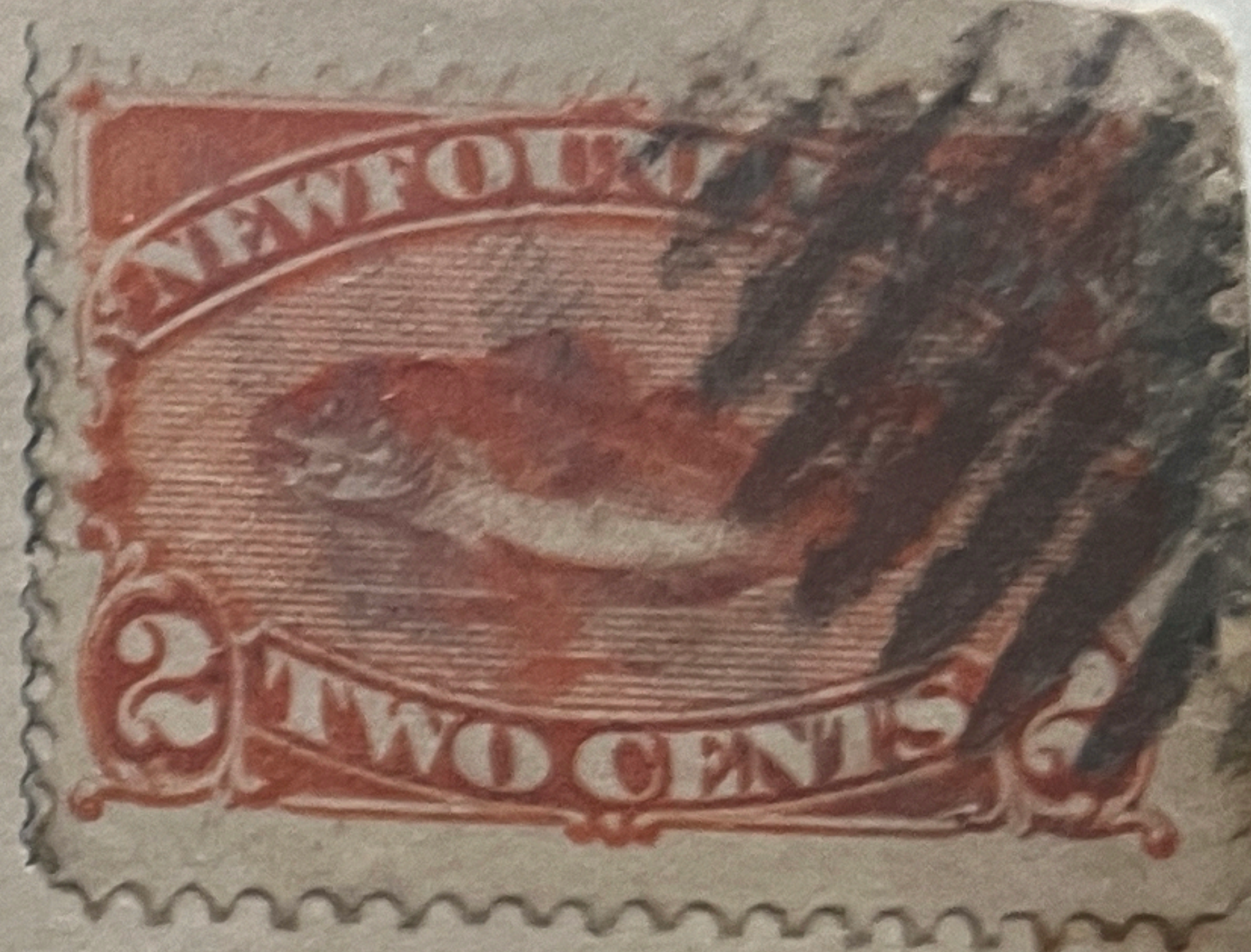
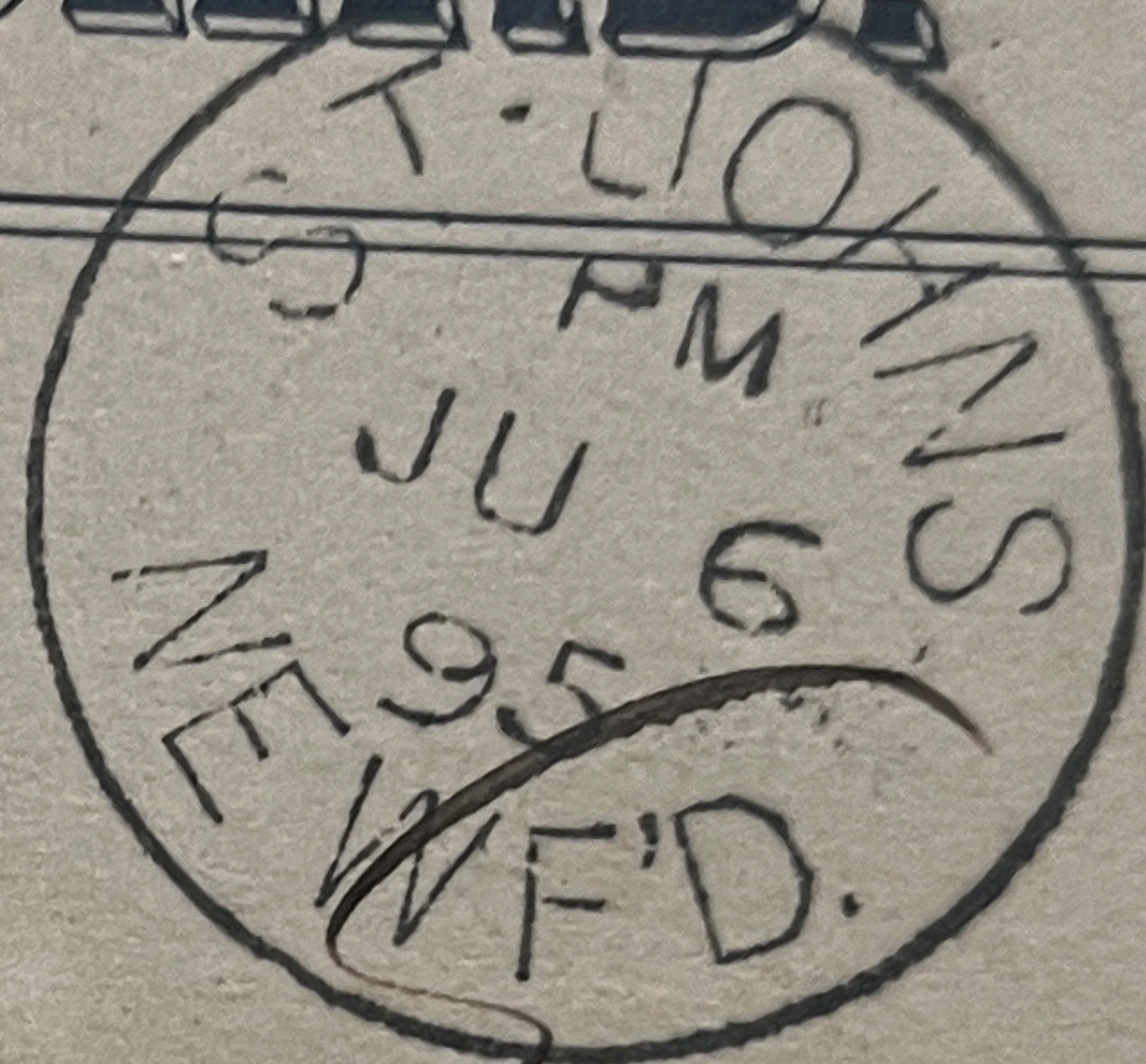
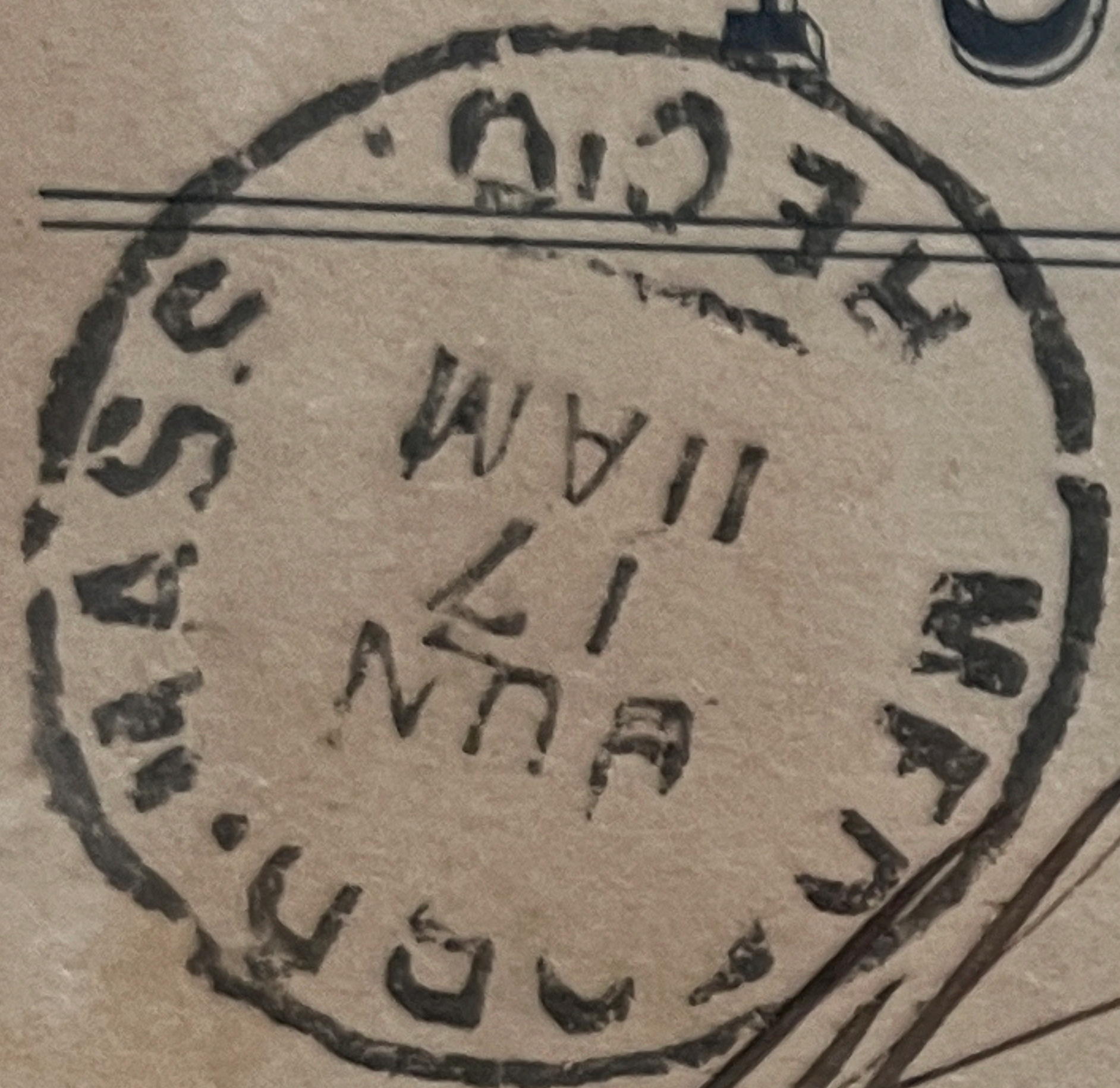
