

# WANTED! FOR MURDER \$50.00 REWARD

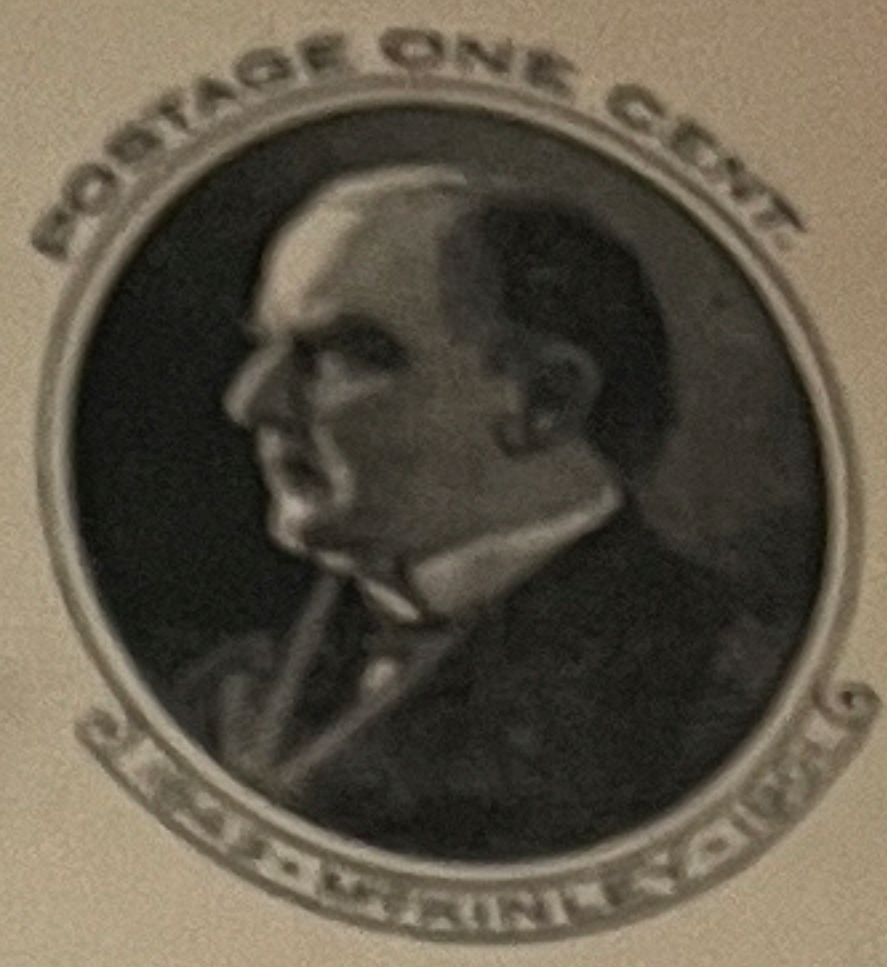
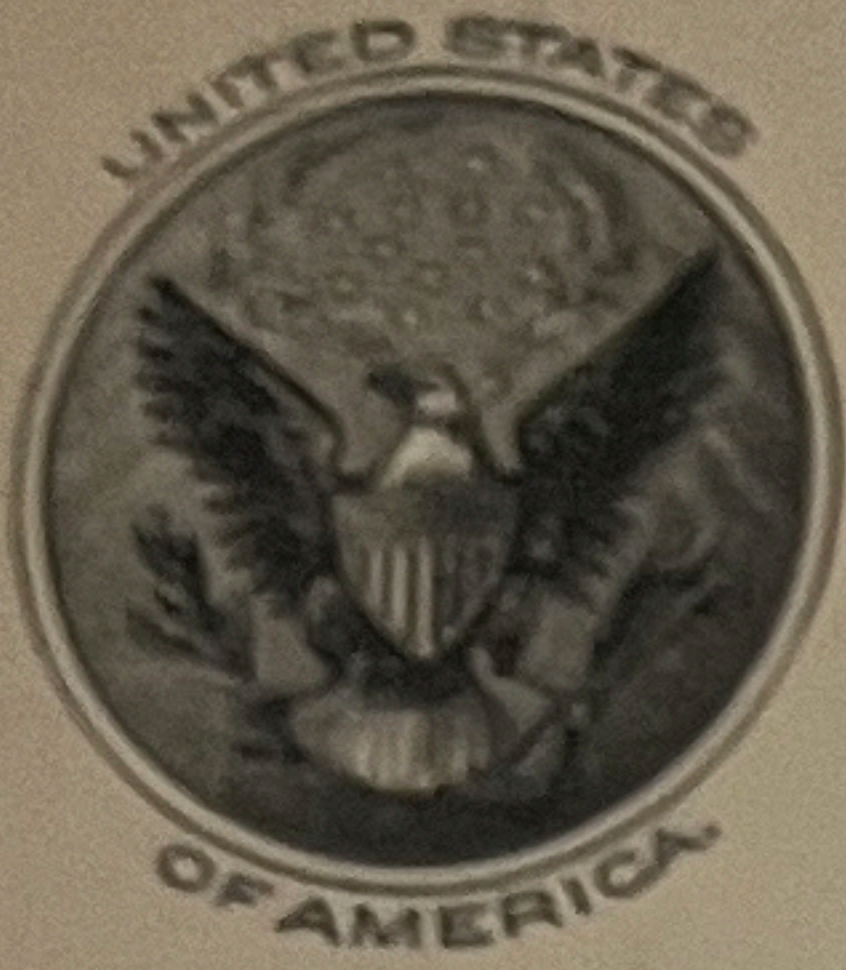
