Notes: Letter given to New York forwarding agent Funch \& Meincke, who sent letter unpaid to Boston "out of the mails" avoiding retaliatory fee. Upon arrival at England letter was held in London detained for 2s7d postage (marked in black ink for 1s transatlantic packet fee less 2d U.K. internal fee plus 1s9d fee from London to Portugal by steamship). When paid by another agent in London this amount was marked in red on the front. P\&0 steamship Montrose carried letter from Southampton to Lisbon. Here it was marked in blue ink 210 reis postage due for a $1-1 \frac{1}{2}$ ovitas weight letter by packet from England ( $11 / 2 \times 1 / 8$ ounce). Rare transatlantic cover to Portugal.

When letter arrived in London, it was detained while notice was sent to the originator to pay 4s7d since letter had not been paid for transit beyond the U.K. After payment received, London sent letter to France, marked with oval PF to show letter paid to French-Spanish border only. In Spain letter marked for 22 reales postage due, the rate for a letter for Madrid weighing 9 adarmes or 16 grames. Scarce routing, but questions about British rate.

Letter marked with red "15R" handstamp to show 15 reales postage was due for a letter weighing 14-15 adarmes.

Letter sent in closed mail bag through England and Belgium to Aachen, where 2 groschen restated as the amount paid for transit beyond the NGU ("wfco 2" handstamp in red).
