The Pan-American Exposition was held at Buffalo, N.Y., to create a bond of friendship and advertise the commerce and industry of the Pan-American Countries. The stamps were placed on sale May 1, 1901 and withdrawn Oct. 31, 1901 the dates fixed for opening and closing the Exposition.
