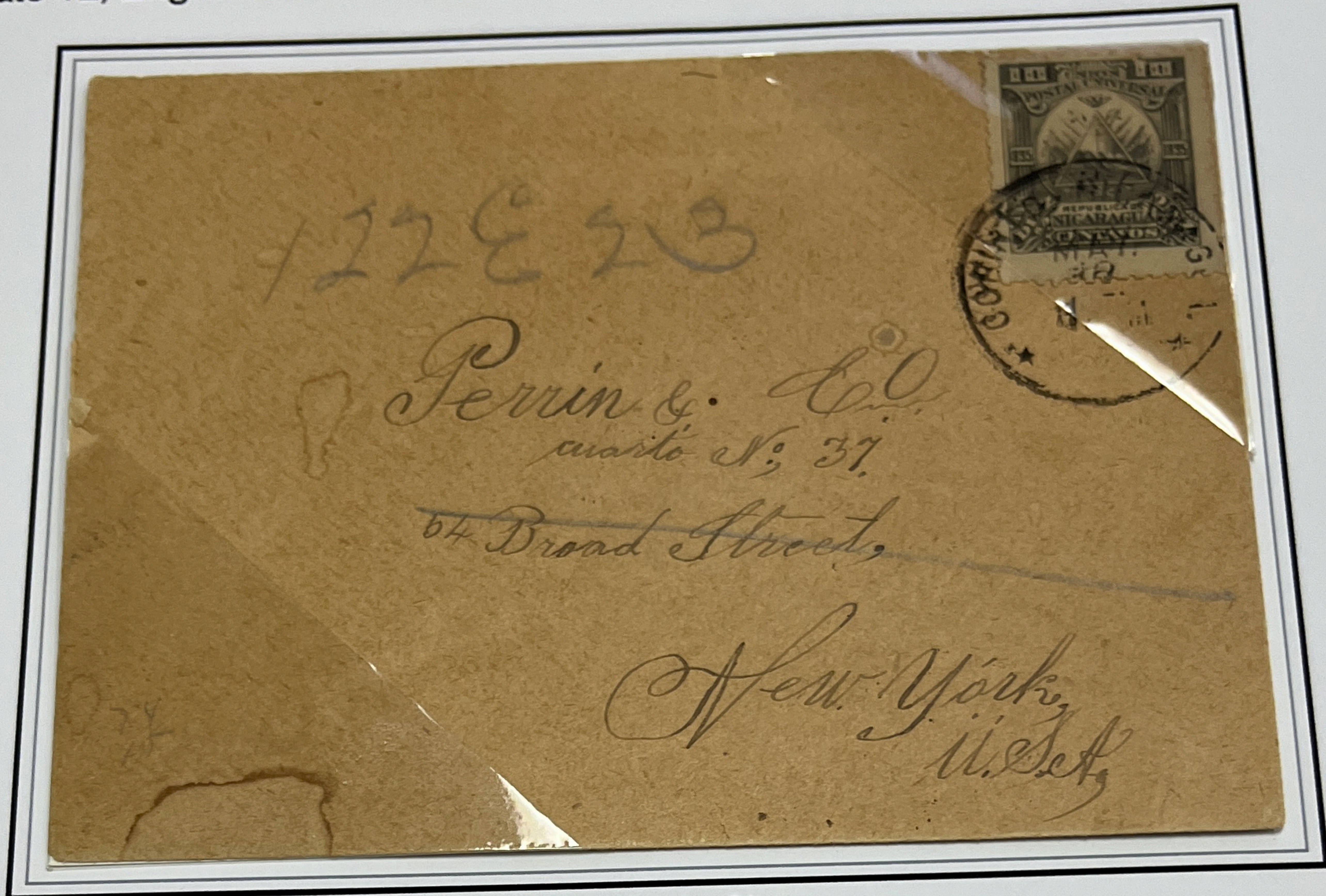

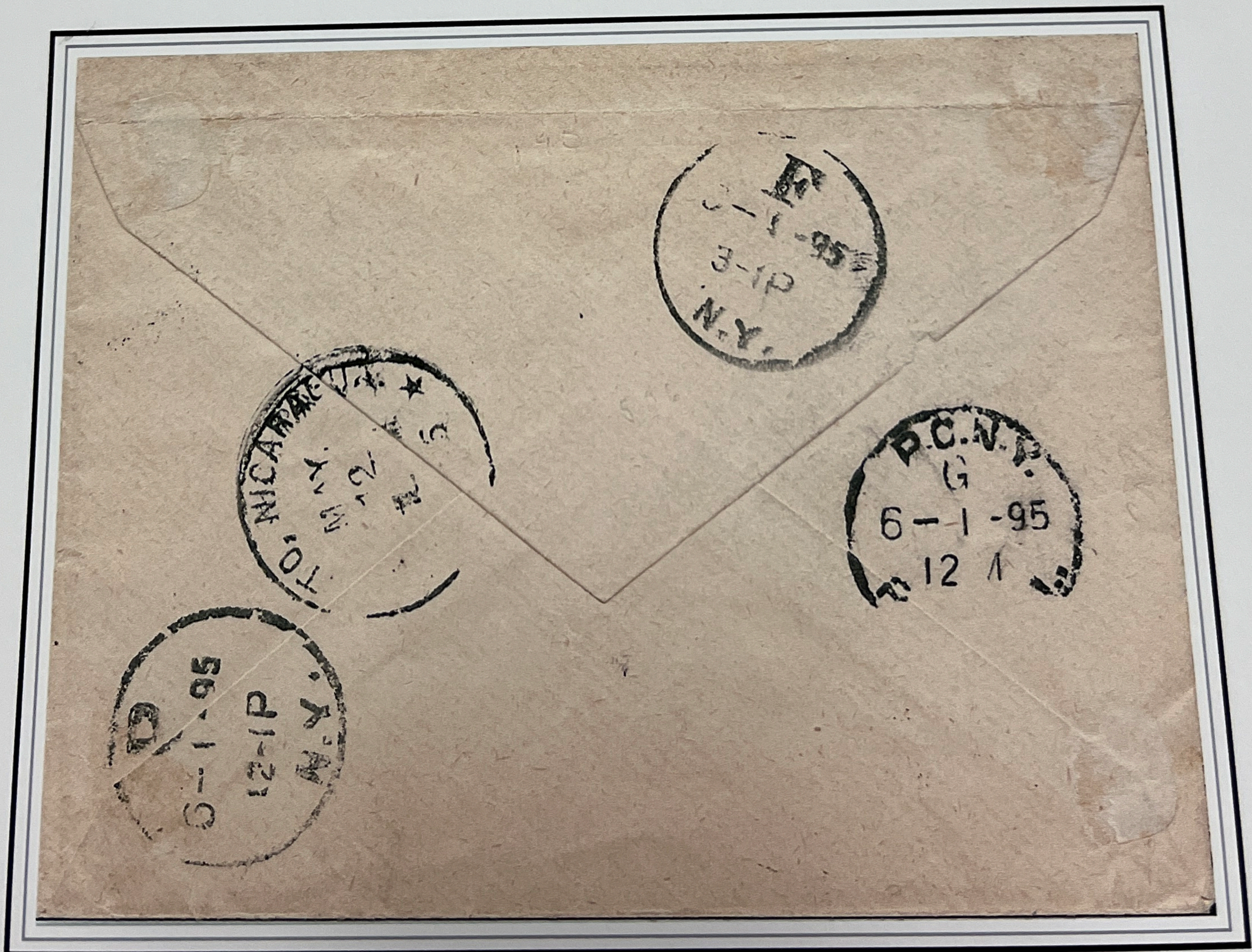

And Three Black Circular New York June 6, 1895 Arrival Cancels.

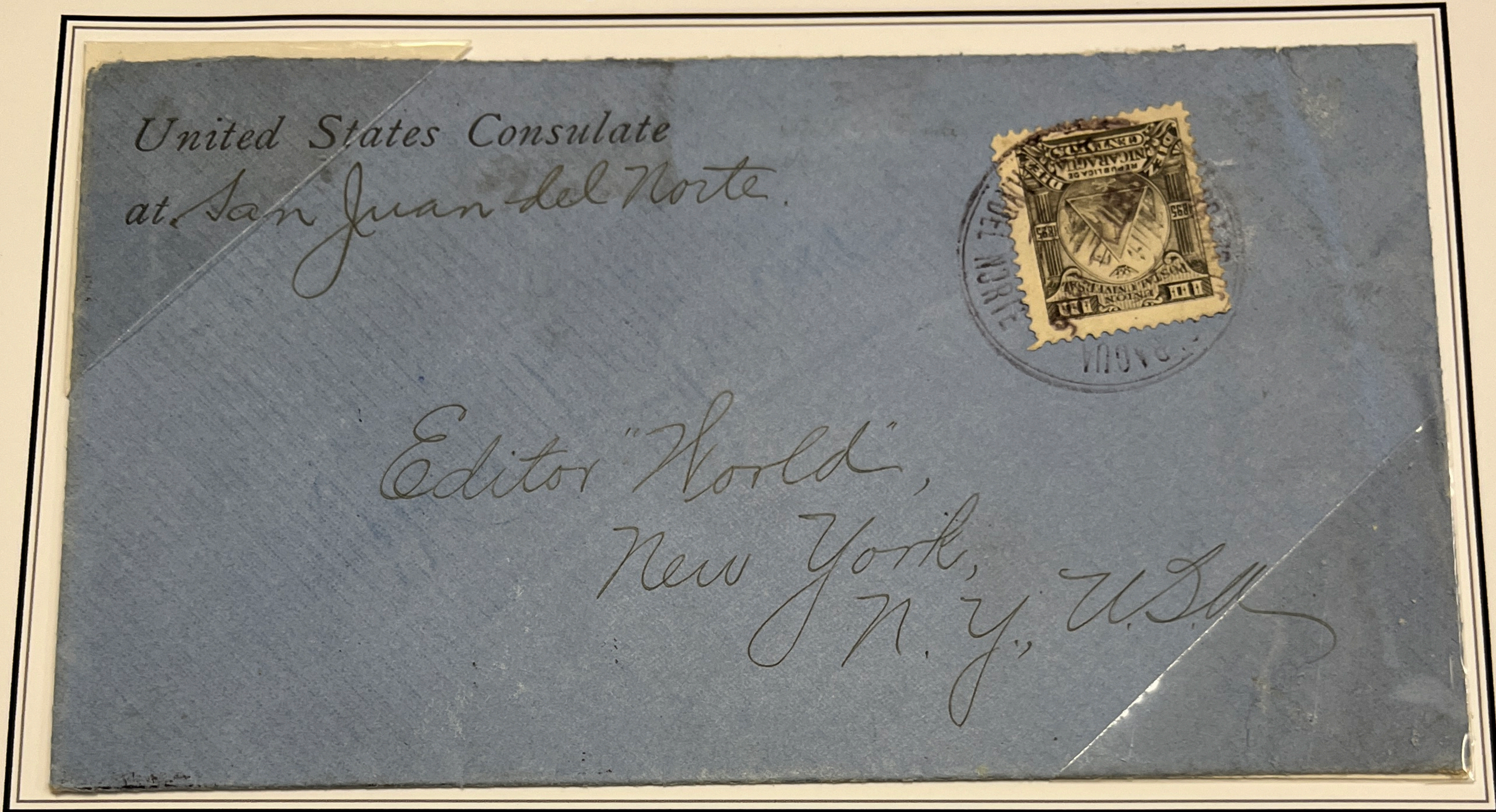

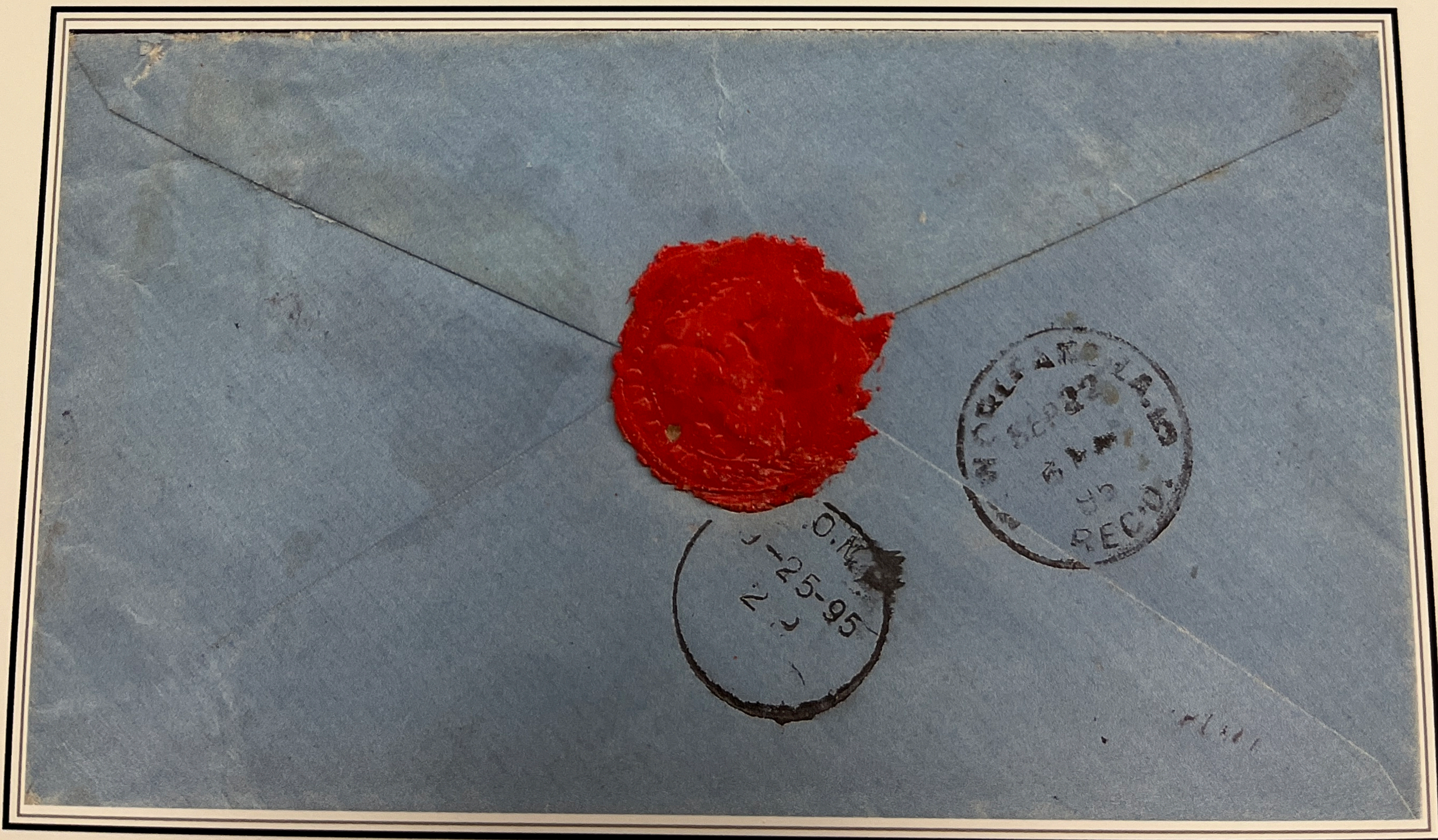

5 Centavos Blue #73 Affixed to H & G #B29 Tied by the genuine 27mm Black (Corinto) CDS that was in use in Corinto up until the later part of 1895.

Cover was sent to a G. Kolbe, Kaiserl. Postassistent in Tondern Germany.

Kolbe was the "Imperial Postal Assistant" in Tondern A very small town in the vicinity of Erfurt and was in the former DDR-See below Map.

The 10 cent rate is correct for this period and this cover represents a nice combination usage.

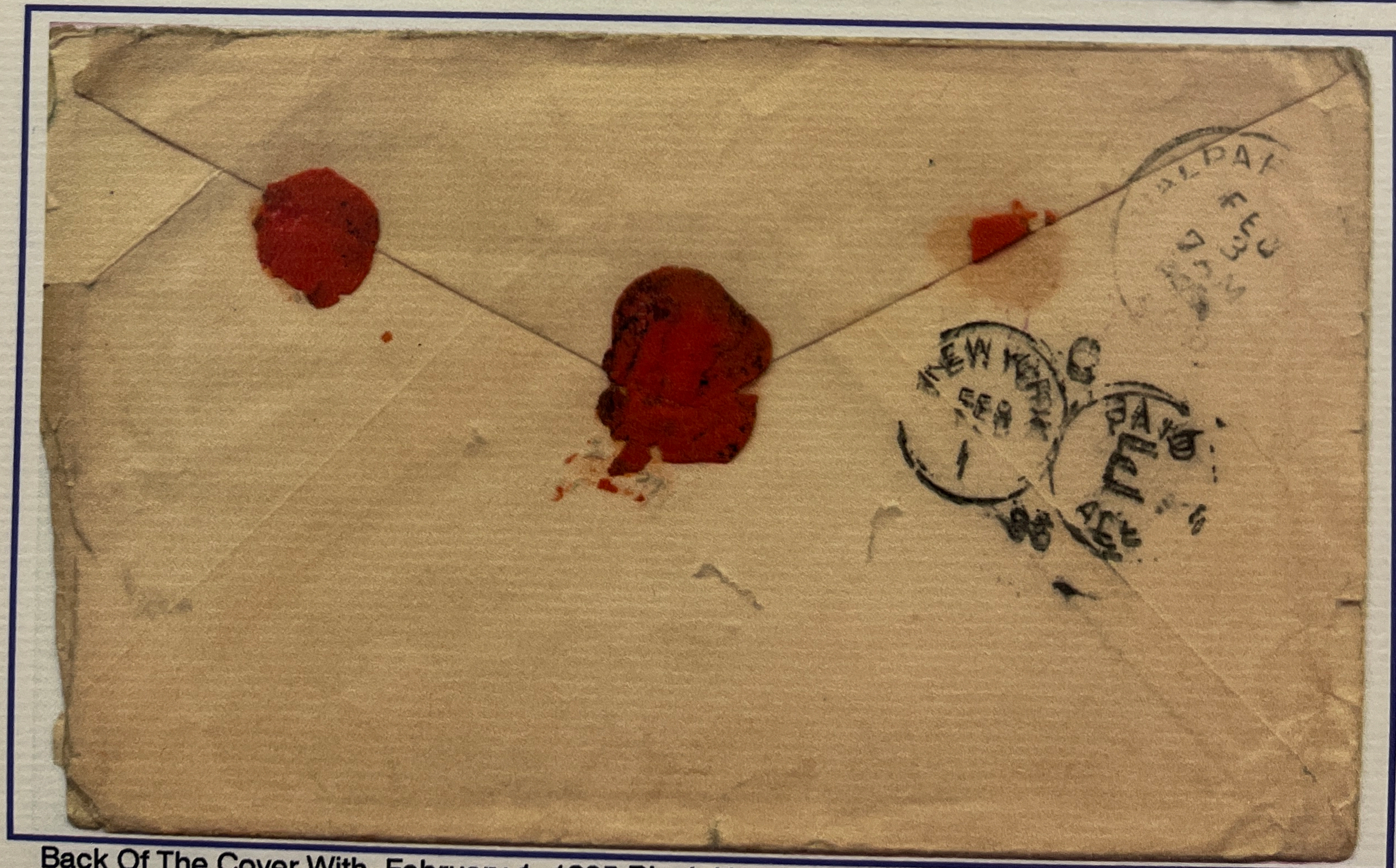
Genuine usage of the
