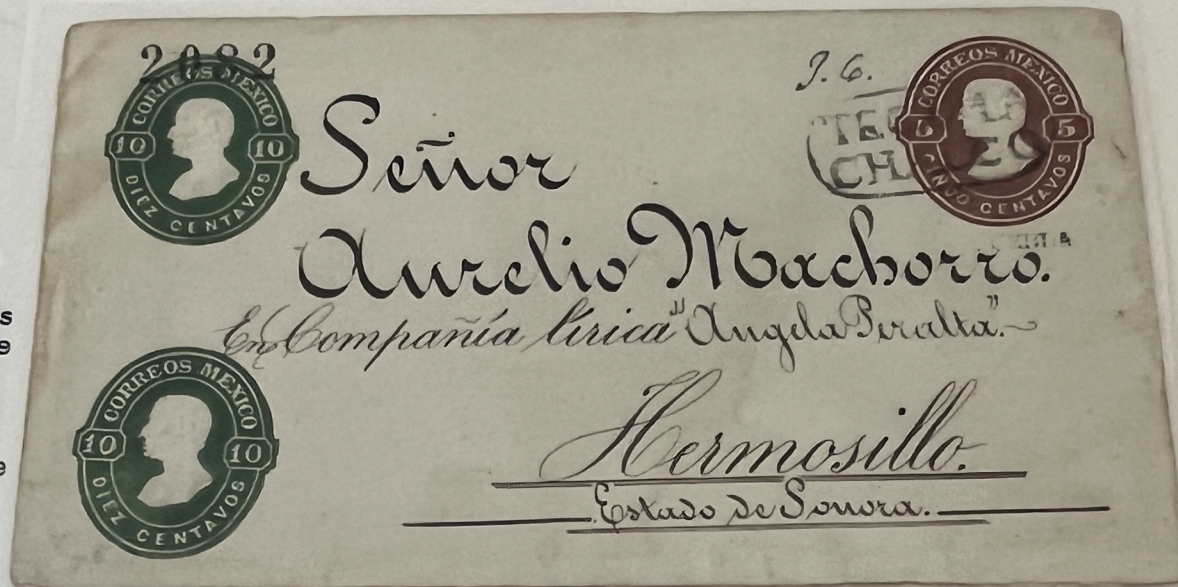


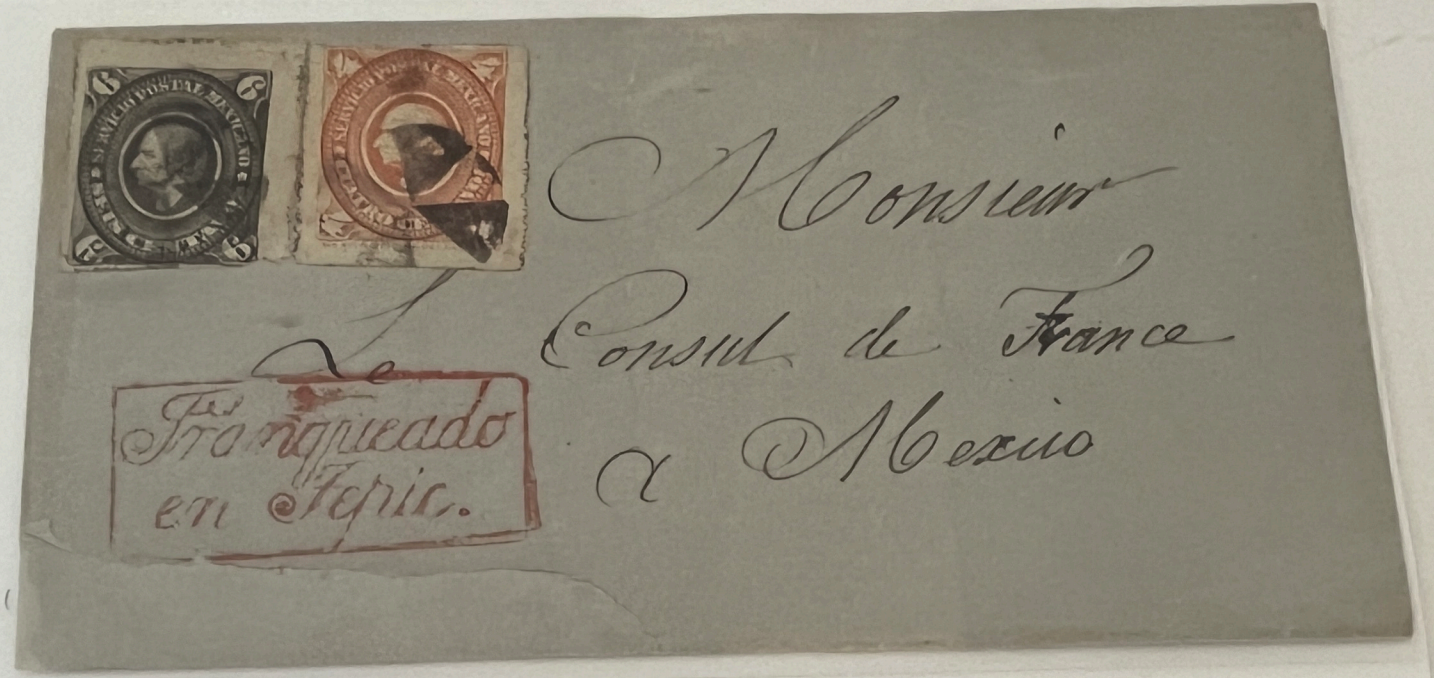
Tecamachalco to Hermosillo
 Postal stationary cover dated 1882 addressed to an actor in a theatrical company. Paid 25c domestic rate beyond 16 leagues for less than half ounce. This rate had been in effect since the first issue of stamps in 1856 and had two domestic levels: one for nearby towns and double that rate for all other towns beyond 16 leagues



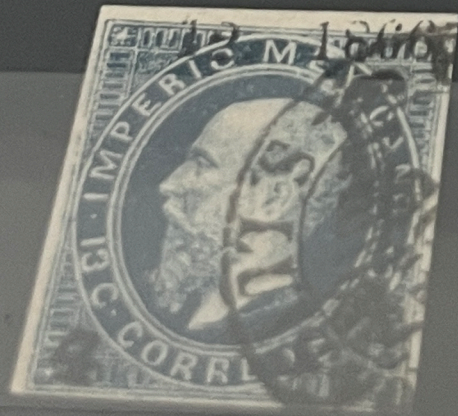
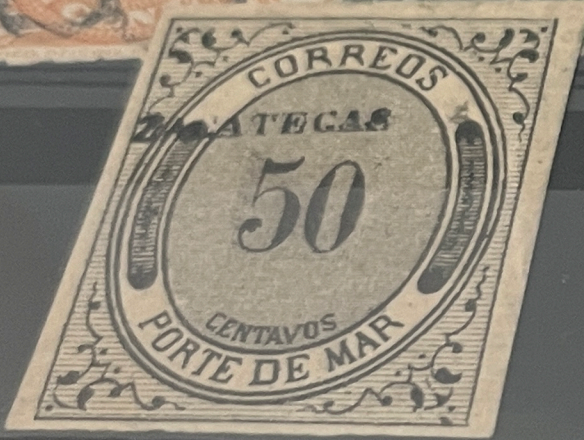
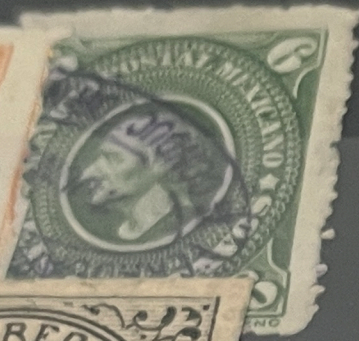
Aguascalientes to Palermo

 Transit was 22 days via New York (March) and Palermo (March 16). Paid 12c International rate for 15 grams



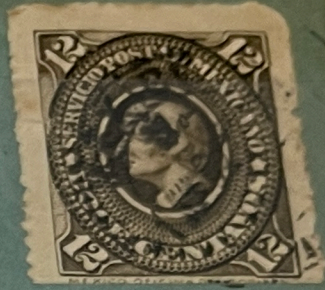
Tepec to Mexico

 28) and England.



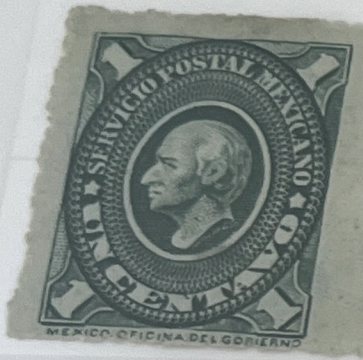
