Mexico to Milano Dated November 19, 1887. Transit was 21 days via New York (November 28 Milano (December 10). Paid 10c International rat for 15 grams paid with the uncommon 10c brown Numeral Ledger Lines. Sent by Italian Embassy.





Lottery Tickets


Mexico to Ciudad Juarez

Registered free franking cover dated December 1, 1894. Sent by the National Government Lottery. It probably contained lottery tickets which had cash value. The National lottery had free franking privileges for domestic mail

Official Municipal Business Papers 1890

Chalchihuites to Zacatecas

Envelope with business papers.
Arrived on June 16, 1890. Paid 1c domestic printed matter rate for 60 grams. Sent by the Municipal President



Topo Chico, Monterrey to San Antonio Texas Dated June 21, 1888. Transit was 1 day. Paid 5c USA rate for 15 grams

Sultepec to
Milwaukee Dated July
15, 1894. Transit was
8 days via Toluca (July
19), Nuevo Laredo
(July 21), Milwaukee
(July 23). Paid 5c USA
rate for 15 grams.
Advertising covers
were very uncommon
in Mexico until 1920's





London, Redirected to Sydney and Melbourne 1891





Zamora to London, Redirected to Sydney and Melbourne Registered cover dated August 21, 1892. Transit via Celaya (August 24), Laredo, London (September 7). Once in London it was redirected to Sydney and then to Melbourne. Should have paid 20c: 10c international registration flat fee + 10c international rate for 15 grams. However it only paid 15c. Accountancy mark 116 indicate postage due charges on receipt. A 10c numeral is on the back of the cover
