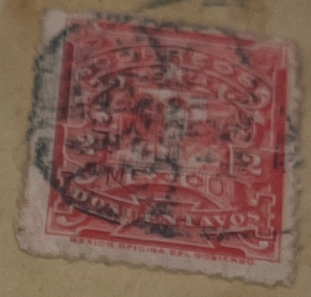
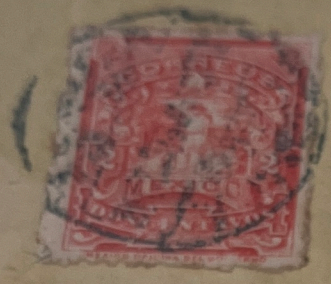

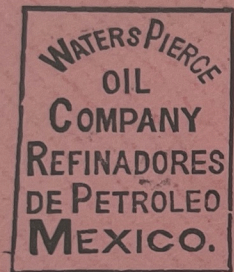

Santa Rosalia, Baja
California to Paris Dated
December 10, 1900.
Transit via Guaymas
(December 11). Paid 10c
International rate for 15
grams. Mixed franking
Mulitas and Aguilitas.
Mulitas were allowed to be
used during 1900 but less
than 50 mixed usages are
known.

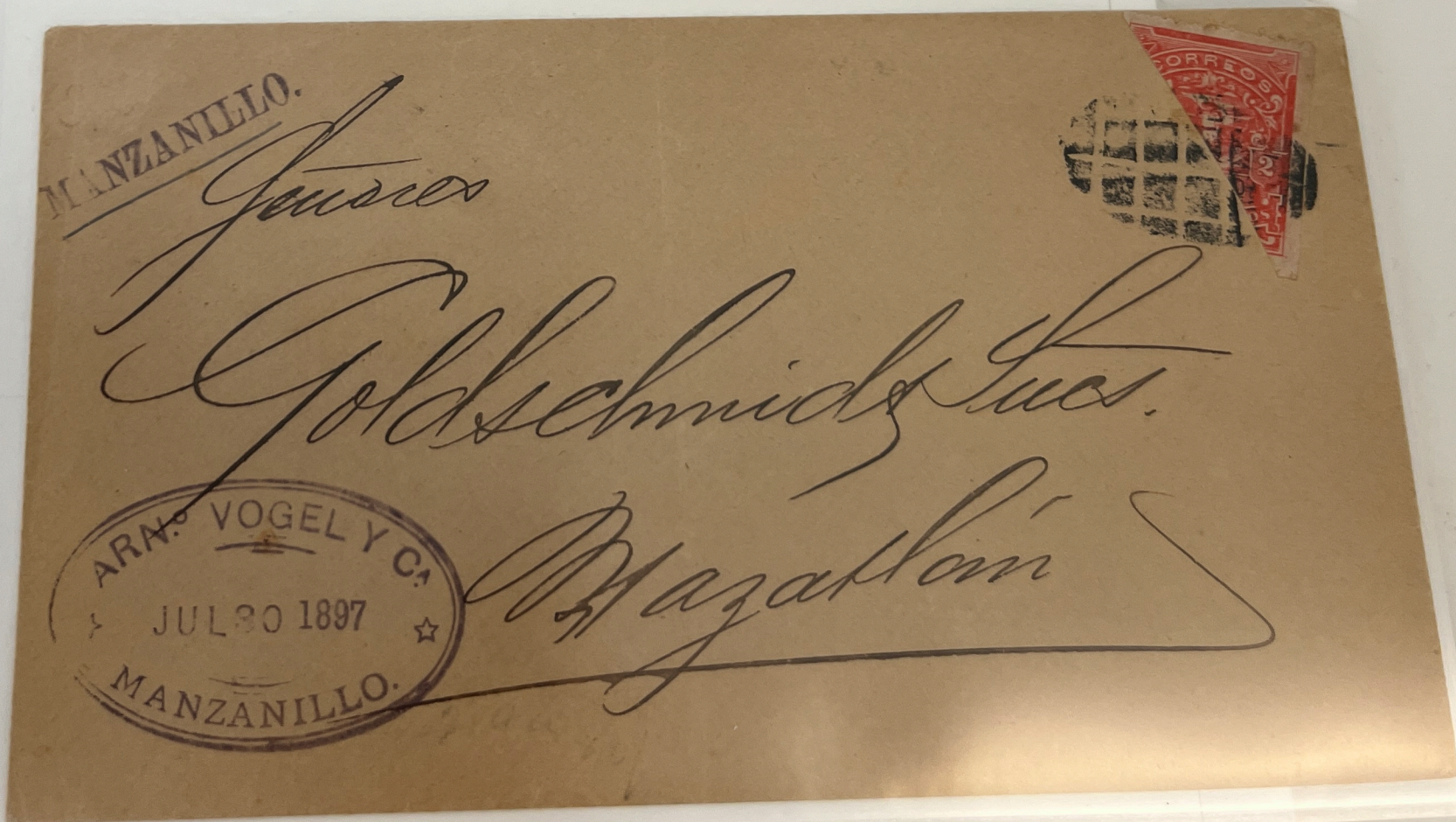


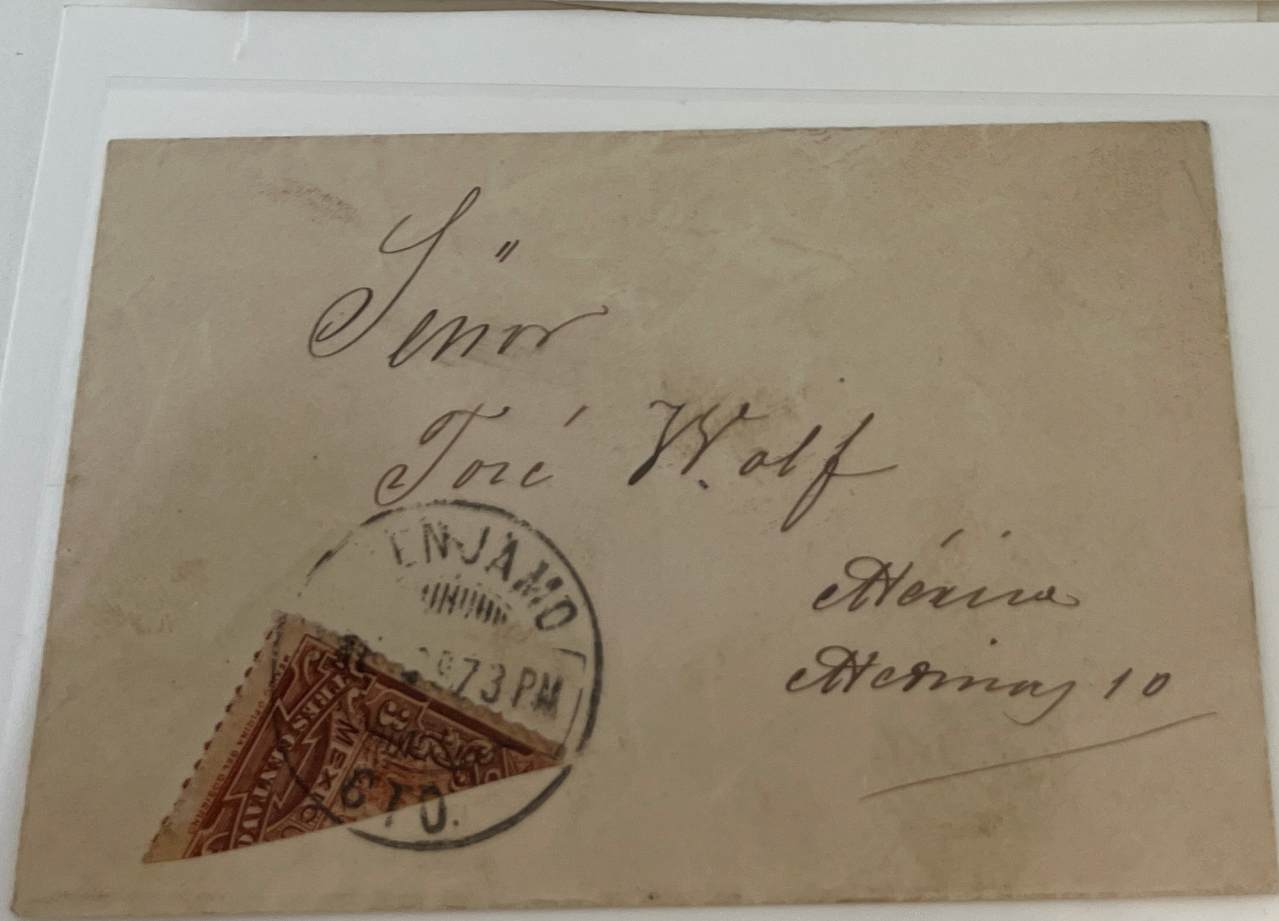


Tuzantla to New York Dated January 25, 1898. Transit was 7 days via Zitacuaro (January 26), Maravatio (January 27) and New York (February 1). Paid 5c USA rate for 15 grams

1897

Manzanillo to Mazatlan
Open envelope dated July 30, 1897. The cover travelled unsealed and probably contained a circular. Paid 1c domestic printed matter rate for 100 grams. This bisect originated in a small port so it is probably not philatelic





1897
Penjamo to Mexico Open envelope for a calling card dated 1897. Paid 1½ c: 1c for domestic printed matter rate for 100 grams + ½ c overpayment. Since it was a small town this bisect may not have been philatelic

Baja California 1899

Santa Rosalia, Baja California to Easton, PA Registered cover dated May 8, 1899. Transit via Nogales (May 12). Paid 15c: 10c USA registration flat fee + 5c USA rate for 15 grams. Very few covers are known from Baja California



Hand Painted Landscape 1897

Tlalmanalco to Waldorf, Germany
Registered uprated postal card dated July 23, 1897. Transit was 24 days via Laredo and New York. Paid 13c: 10c international registration flat rate + 3c international postal card rate. On the reverse a hand painted landscape of Tlalmanalco countryside dated 1897. The artist paid registration to ensure that his work of art were not lost, Reduced photo of the front of the card is at left

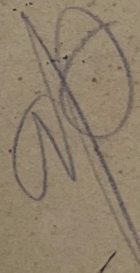
