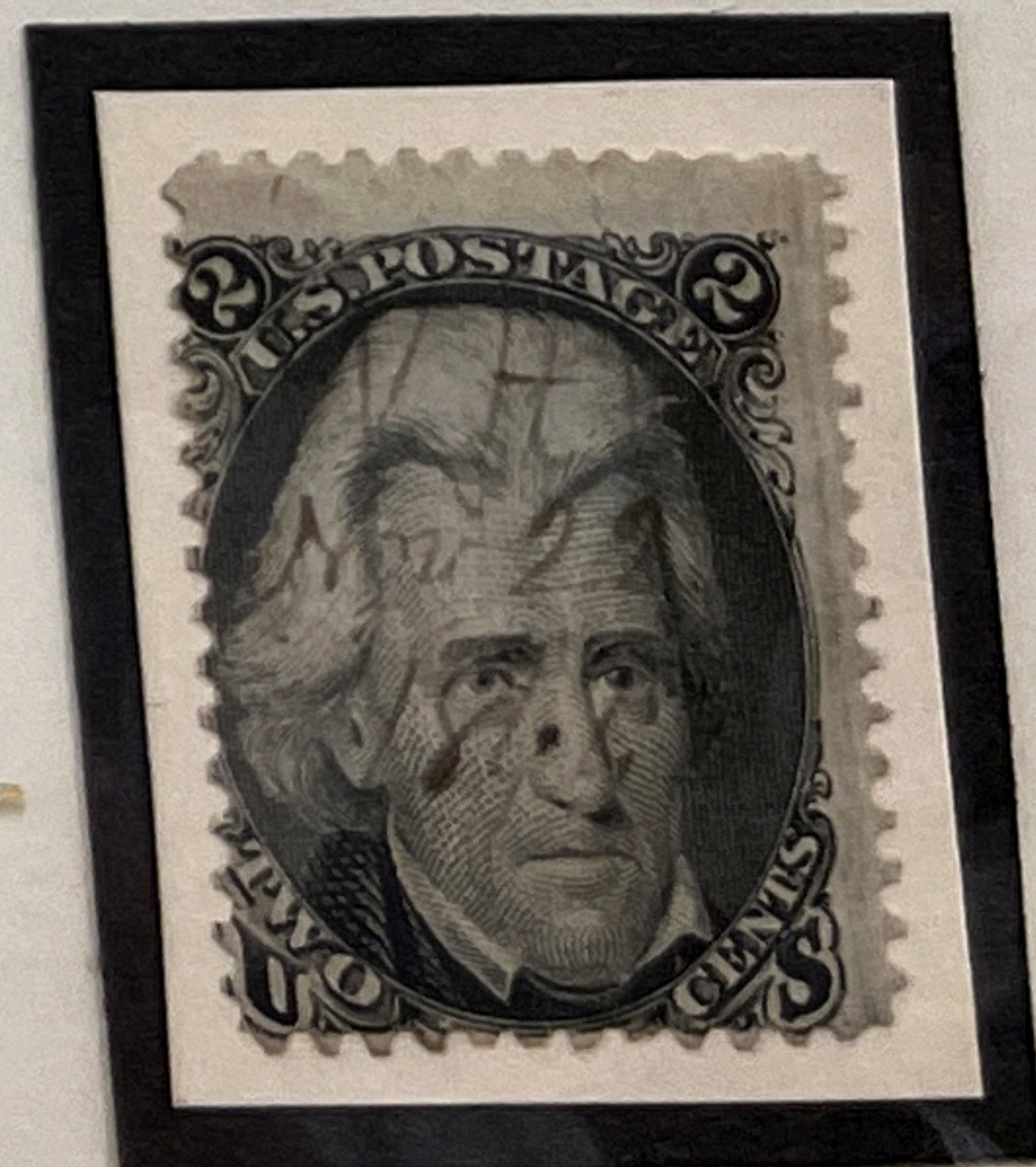
BLACK JACK USED AS A REVENUE STAMP

DESPITE A SEPARATE SET OF ADHESIVE STAMPS WHICH WERE DESIGNED AND PRINTED FOR USE AS REVENUE STAMPS YOU WILL FIND THAT THE POSTAGE STAMPS IN USE DURING THE SAME PERIOD WERE SOMETIMES USED IN THEIR PLACE. THE BLACK JACK WAS SO USED ON OCCASION.

THE ACT OF 1864 SEPARATED RECEIPTS FROM CHECKS, MEMOS, DEEDS AND OTHER TAXABLE ITEMS AND FIXED THE TAX FEE AT TWO CENTS ON EACH RECEIPT FOR OVER TWENTY DOLLARS, THUS THE REASON THE TWO CENT BLACK JACK WAS USED ON OCCASIONS.



THE USE OF FOUR POSTAGE STAMPS AS "REVENUES" WAS NOT INTENDED NOR WAS IT AUTHORIZED BY LAW. THEREFORE IF DETECTED THE POSTAGE STAMP WRS EITHER COVERED BY A REVENUE OR A REVENUE WAS AFFIXED & THE POSTAGE STAMP IGNORED.
