10¢ Kentucky stamp on promissory note dated November 12, 1799. This stamp was required for a note payable beyond 60 days and no due date is specified. About 21% of all promissory notes were payable in pounds, shilling, and pence. According to survey 67 of these stamps are known.

Bond, backed by a pledge of a house lot in Franklinton, Ross County, Northwest Territory. Probably the oldest philatelic item for an area now within Columbus, Ohio. January 31, 1800. 76 stamps reported.
