the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred ninety nine

The Condition of the above Obligation is such, that if the  
above bounden *Nancy Clark as she is appointed Admin'r  
of the Estate of Peter Clark late of Portsmouth aforesaid  
Merchant deceased*

Do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all the Goods,  
Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to  
the hands, possession or knowledge of her the said *Nancy* or into  
the hands or possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so  
made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Court of Probate  
for the county aforesaid, at or before the *Third Wednesday of April*  
next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits, and all other  
the Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said deceased at the time of  
*her* death, which at any time hereafter shall come to the hands or posses-  
sion of the said *Nancy* or into the hands or possession of  
any other person or persons for her do well and truly Administer according  
to Law ; and further do make or cause to be made a just and true account of  
*her* said Administration upon oath, at or before the *Third Wednesday*  
of *January* which will be in the year of our Lord *One thousand seven hun-*




