the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred *ninety nine*

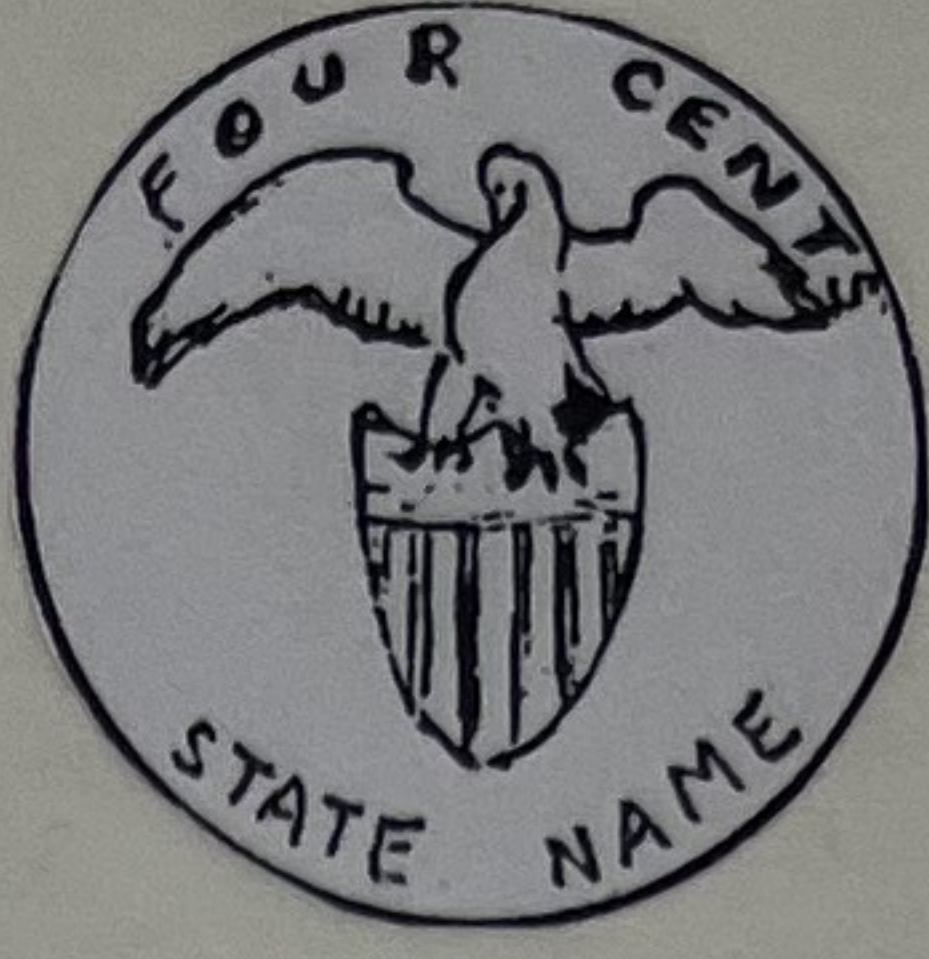
The Condition of the above Obligation is such, that if the

Do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all the Goods,
Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to
the hands, possession or knowledge of *her* the said *Nancy* or into
the hands or possession of any other person or persons for *her* and the same so
made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Court of Probate
for the county aforesaid, at or before the *third Wednesday* of *April*
next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits, and all other
the Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said deceased at the time of
his death, which at any time hereafter shall come to the hands or posses-
sion of the said *Nancy* or into the hands or possession of
any other person or persons for *her* do well and truly Administer according
to Law; and further do make or cause to be made a just and true account of
her said Administration upon oath, at or before the *third Wednesday*
of *January* which will be in the year of our Lord ~~One thousand seven hun-~~

and of none effect, or else to abide and remain in full force and virtue.

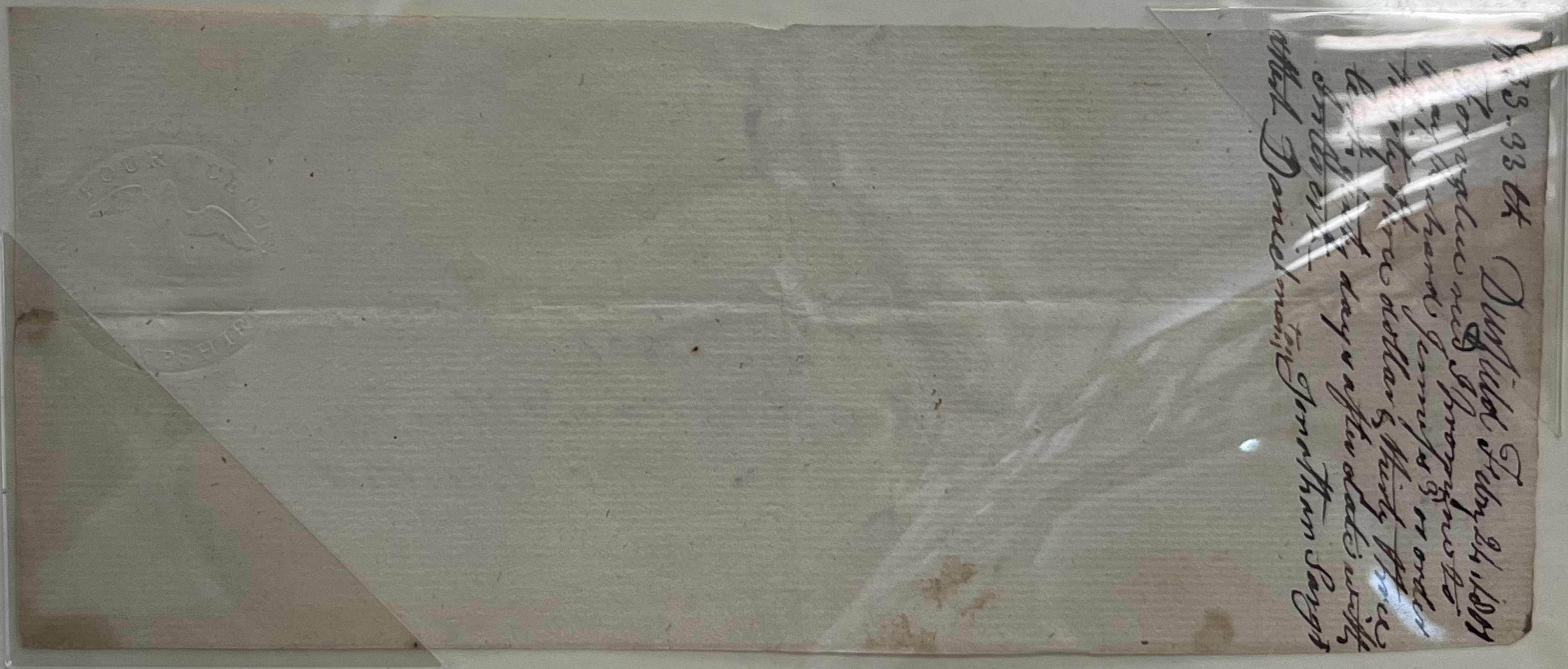

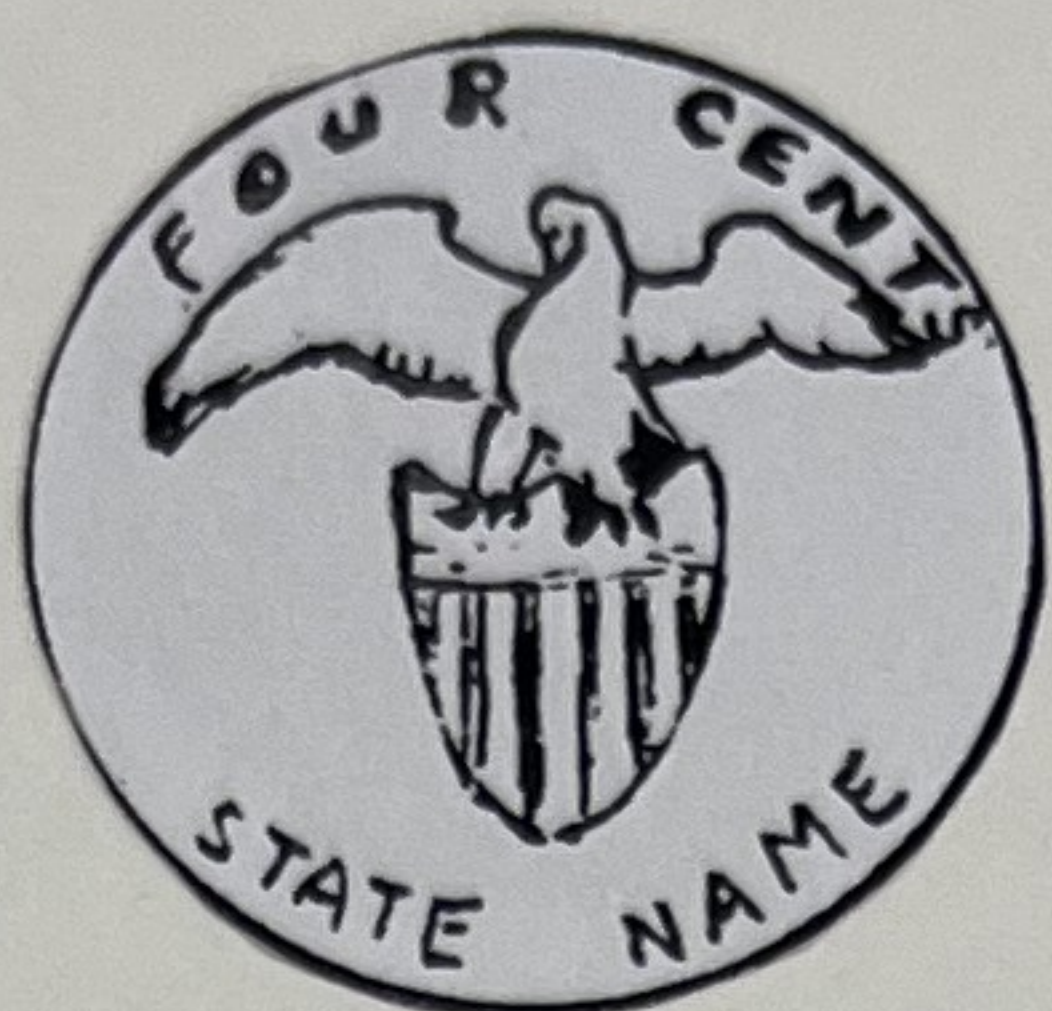

said Mesher & Bean their heirs & assigns we the undersub-
scribed our heirs executors & administrators finally by these
presents sealed with our hands & dated the 14th day of

October AD 1799 -

The condition of this obligation is such that whereas
the said Moulton has this day sued out a writ of Replevin
against the said Mesher & Bean returnable to the next Court
of Common Pleas to be holden at Portsmouth within & for the
said County of Rockingham on the first Tuesday of January
next for taking from the said Moulton five swine near
of the said Moulton Swain & Robie shall at said
Court & so from Court to Court untill said cause shall be
ended & shall in all things pay such costs & damages as
the said Mesher & Bean shall recover against the said
Moulton in said suit then this obligation to be void other-
