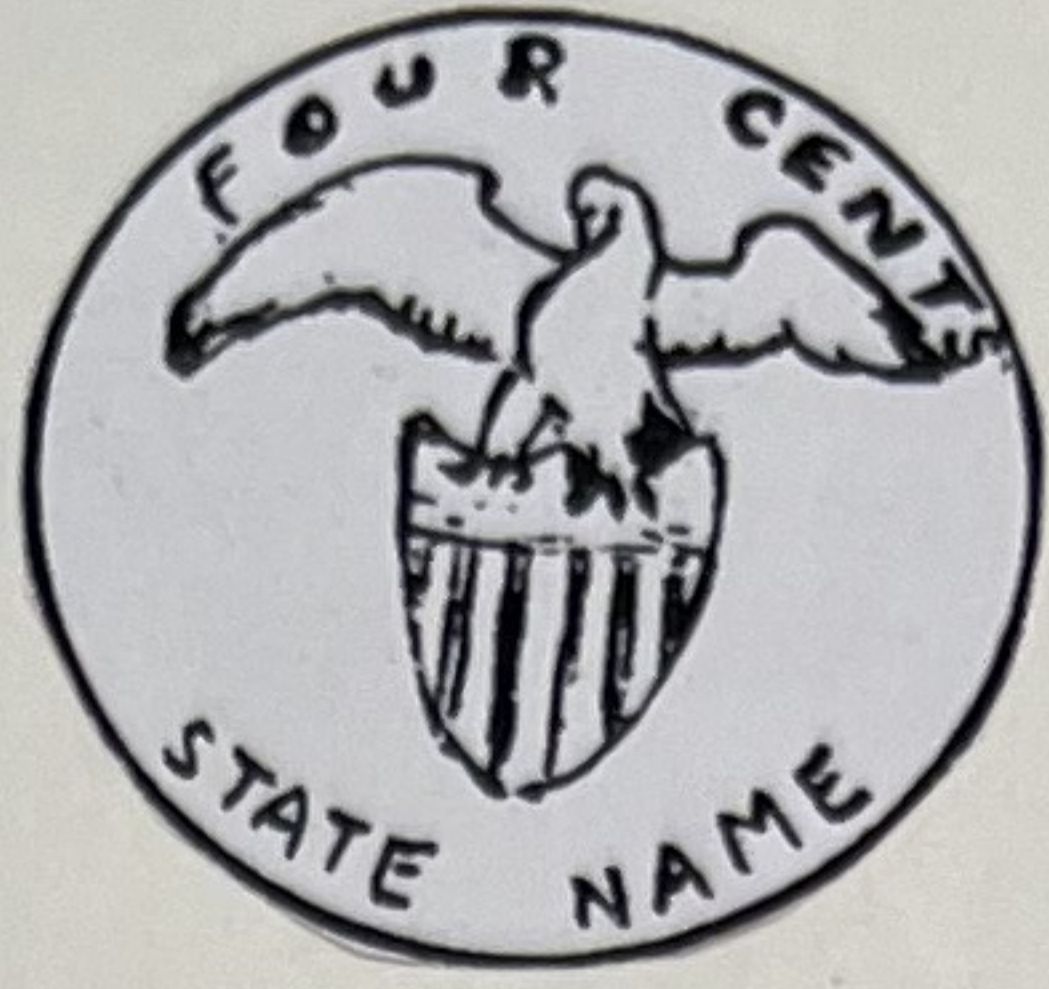
10¢ RHODE ISLAND Stamp **DOMESTIC BILL OF LADING**

- 4¢ Promissory note or bond of \$20 to \$100 due within 60 days.
- 4¢ Bill of lading for domestic shipment after March 31, 1799.
- 10¢ Promissory note, bond, or bill of exchange of \$20 to \$100 due after 60 days, or of \$100 to \$500 due within 60 days.
- 10¢ Bill of lading for domestic shipment before March 31, 1799, or foreign shipment after this date.
- 20¢ Promissory note or bond of \$500 to \$1000 due within 60 days.
- 25¢ Promissory note, bond, or bill of exchange of \$100 to \$500 due after 60 days.
- 25¢ Bill of lading for foreign shipment before March 31, 1799.
