ents. Signed with our own hands, and sealed with our seals this *fifth* day
of *June* in the Year of Our Lord, *One Thousand Seven* Hundred
and Ninety nine

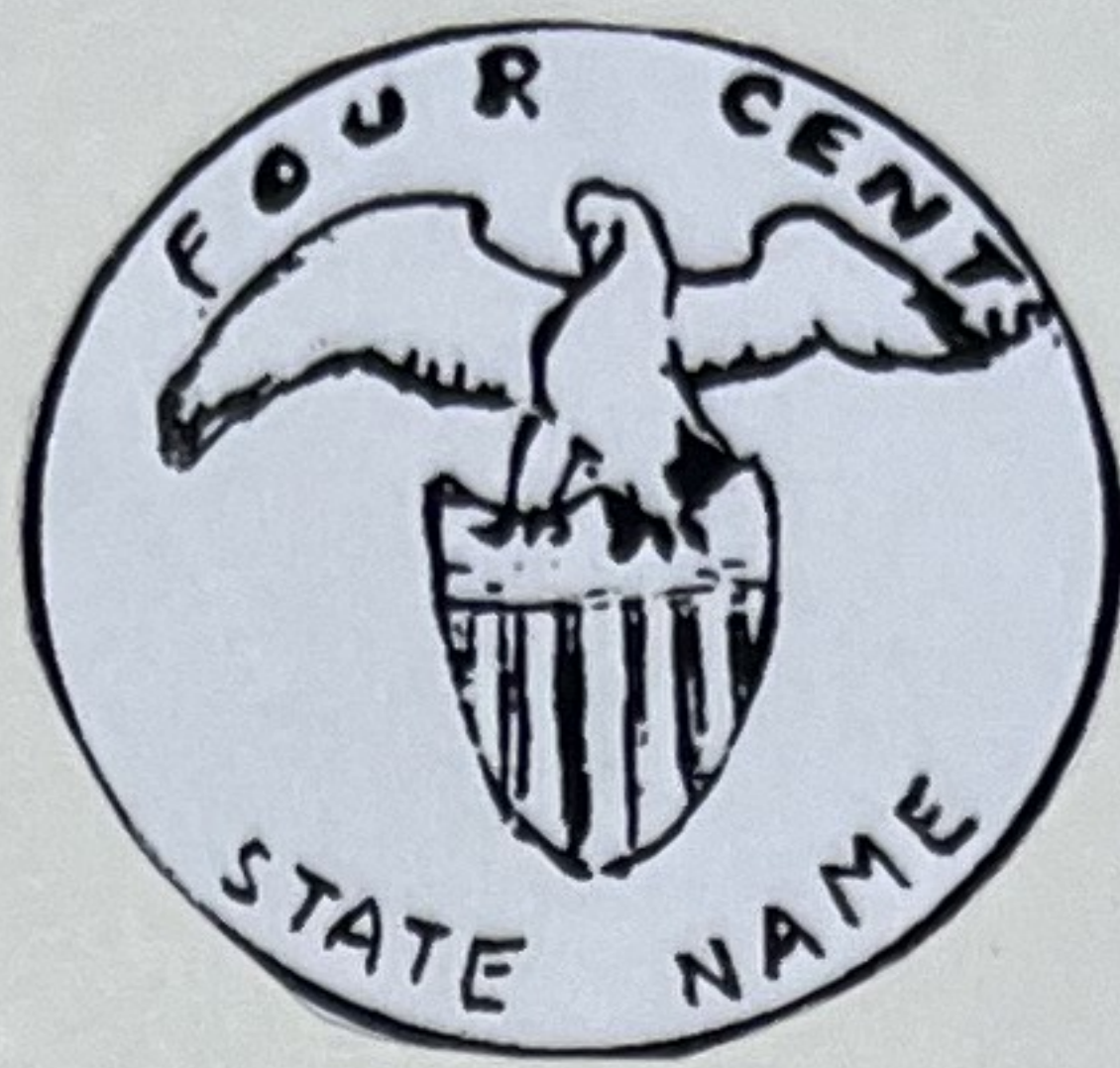

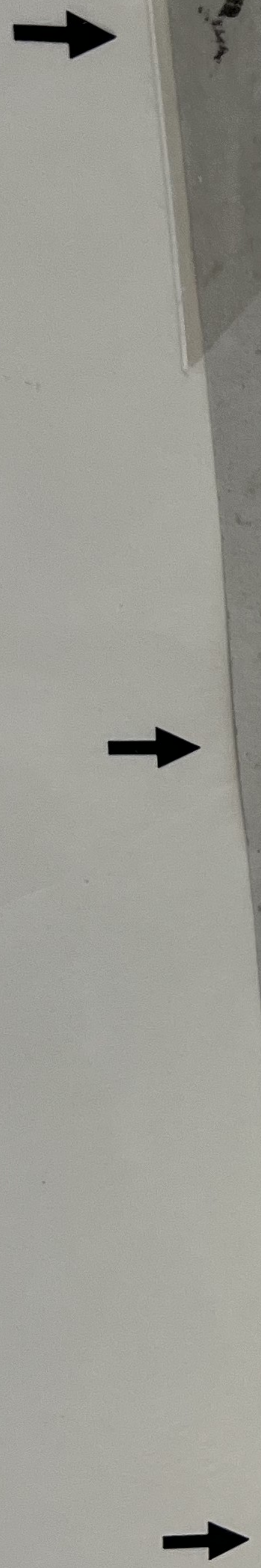

Three stamps on a document bearing three notes for \$329.75 for 9 months dated April 24, 1799. The note was to be paid in gold or silver! The three stamps resulted in a tax overpayment of 5¢. First reported in 1942 issue of Embossed Revenue Stamped Paper News. April 24, 1799. 46 stamps reported.
