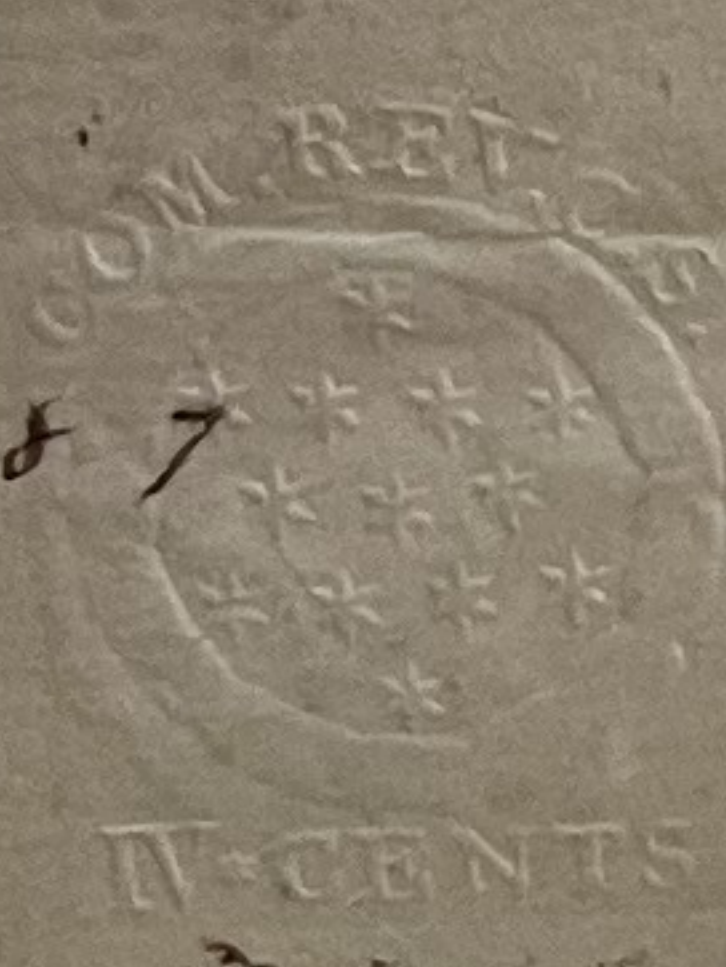

SECOND FEDERAL ISSUE

4¢ STAMP AND COUNTERSTAMP

The Second Federal Issue replaced the First Federal Issue to provide for better accounting and tax collection purposes. All denominations and items taxed by the First Issue were continued. The Second Federal Issue is the only group of stamps, revenue or postage, that consists of two types of stamps, a stamp and a counterstamp.

Note of \$41.60 plus interest for 60 days dated February 1, 1802. The document was written in Portland, probably in the District of Maine, Massachusetts. 146 stamps reported on laid paper with italic watermark.
