ENVELOPES.—ISSUED 1889.



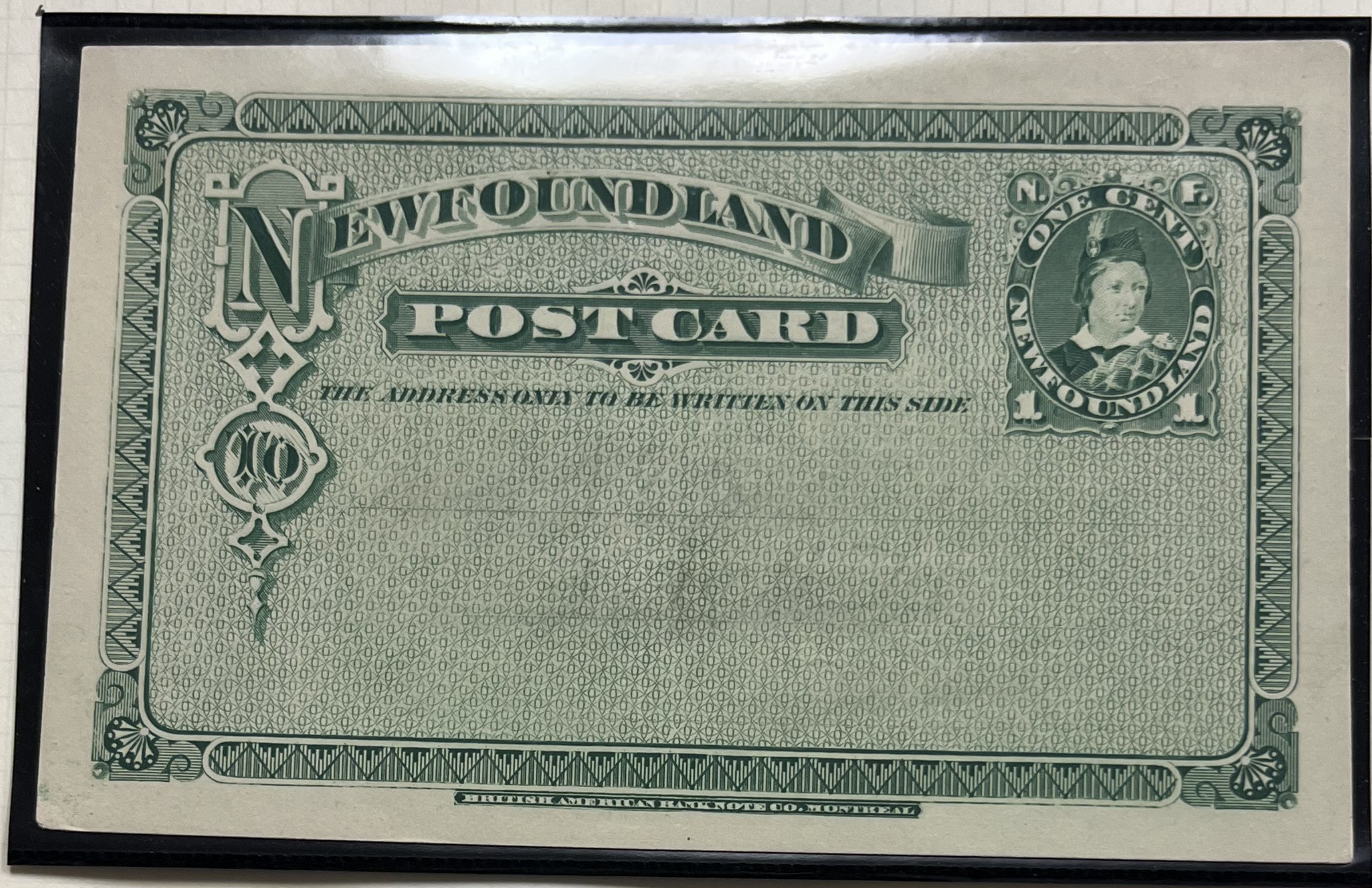

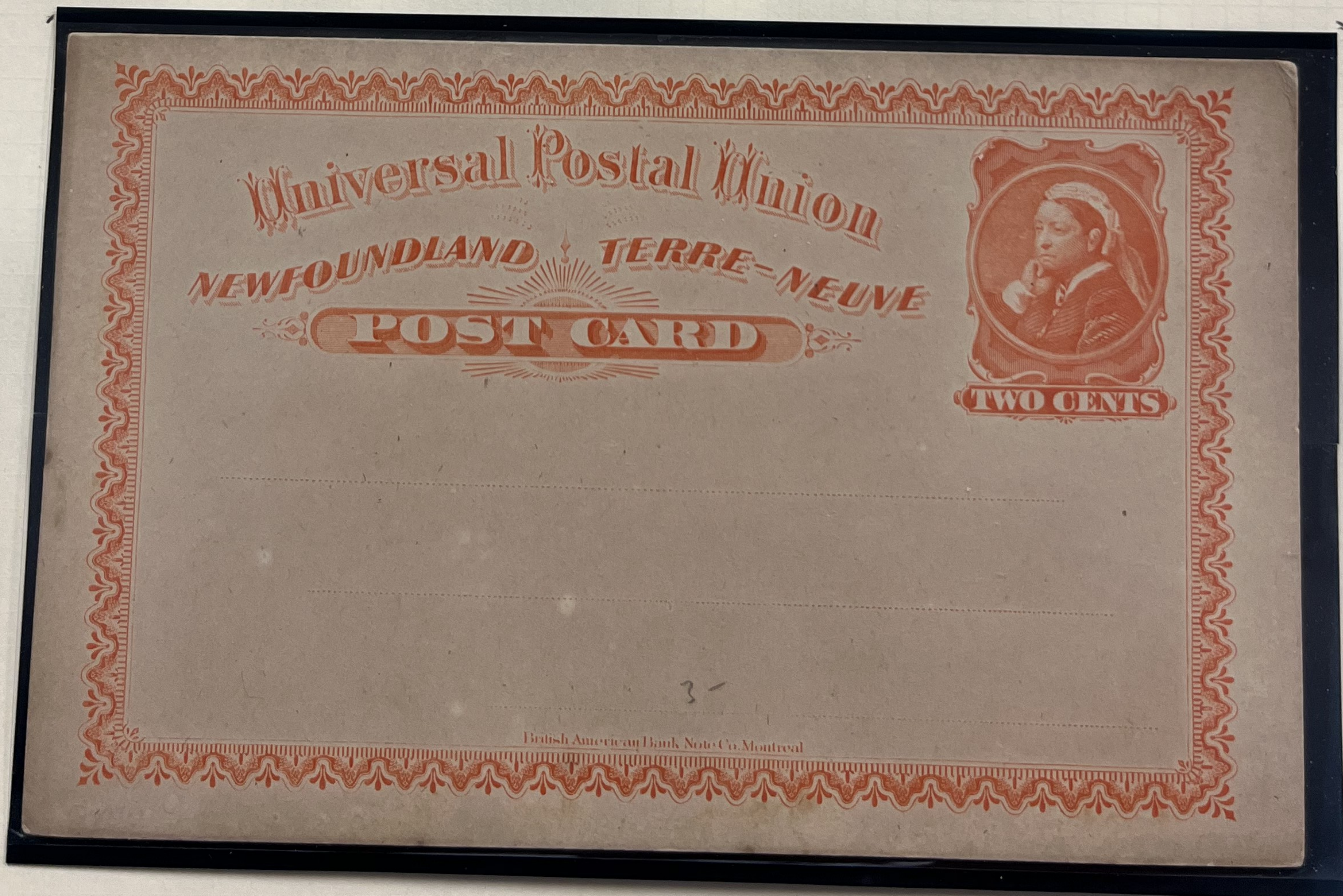

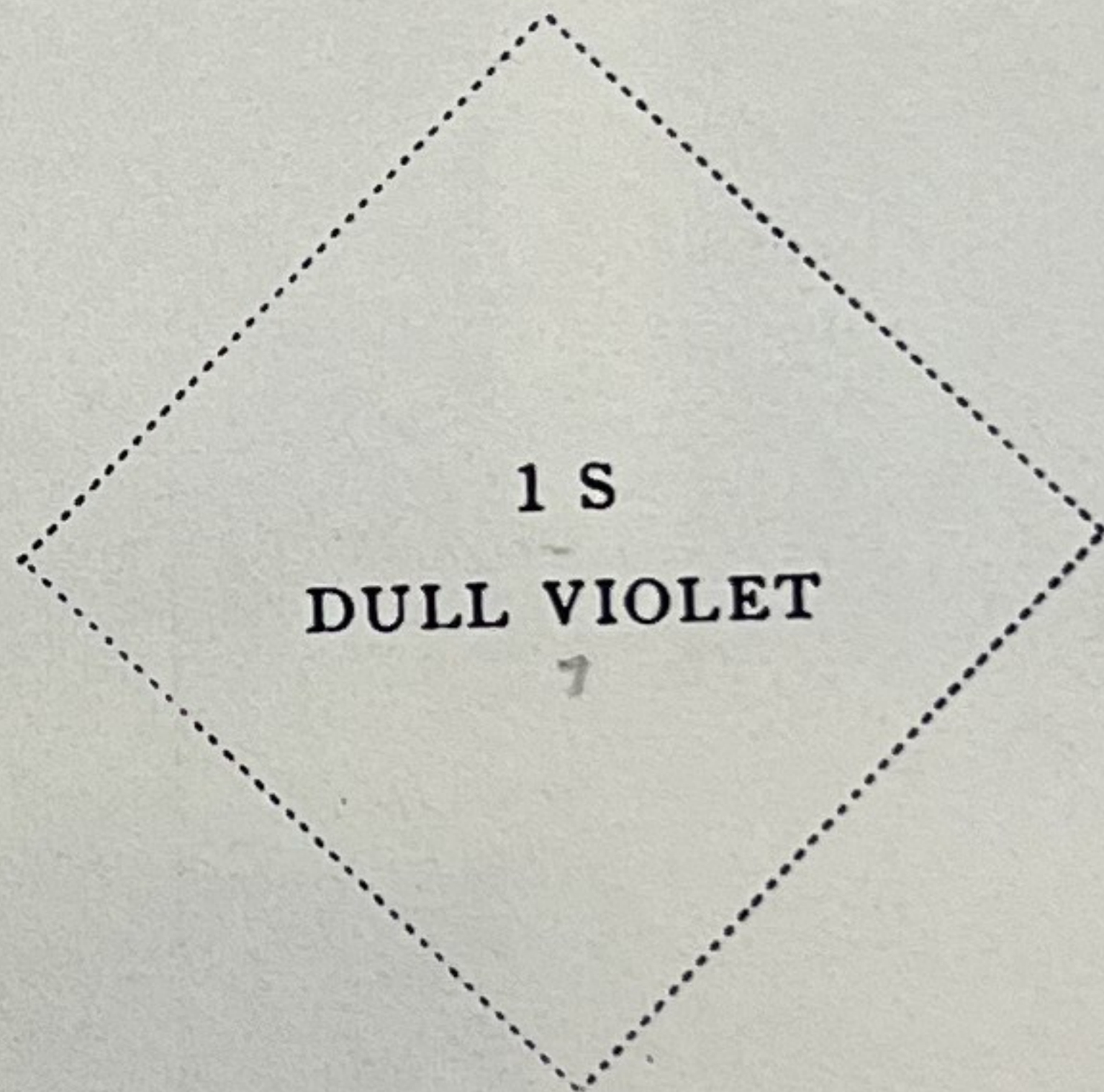
