GOVERNMENT—A kingdom of Germany, and the largest, most populous, and most important state of the German Empire. Since the world war a free state and territory of the German republic. CAPITAL—Berlin.

COINAGE=12 pfennige=1 silber groschen. 60 kreuzer=1 gulden. 100 pfennig=1 mark.

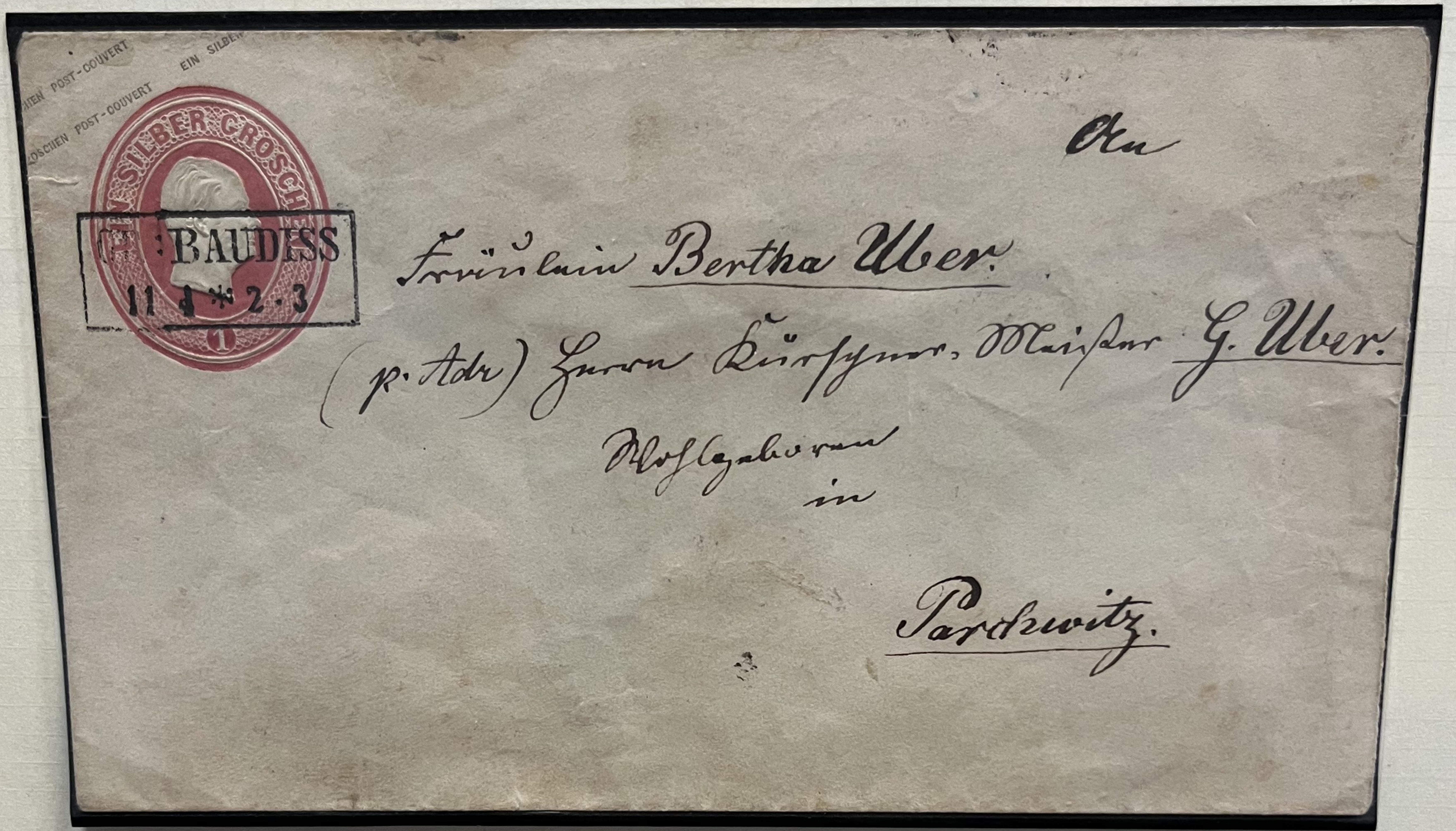

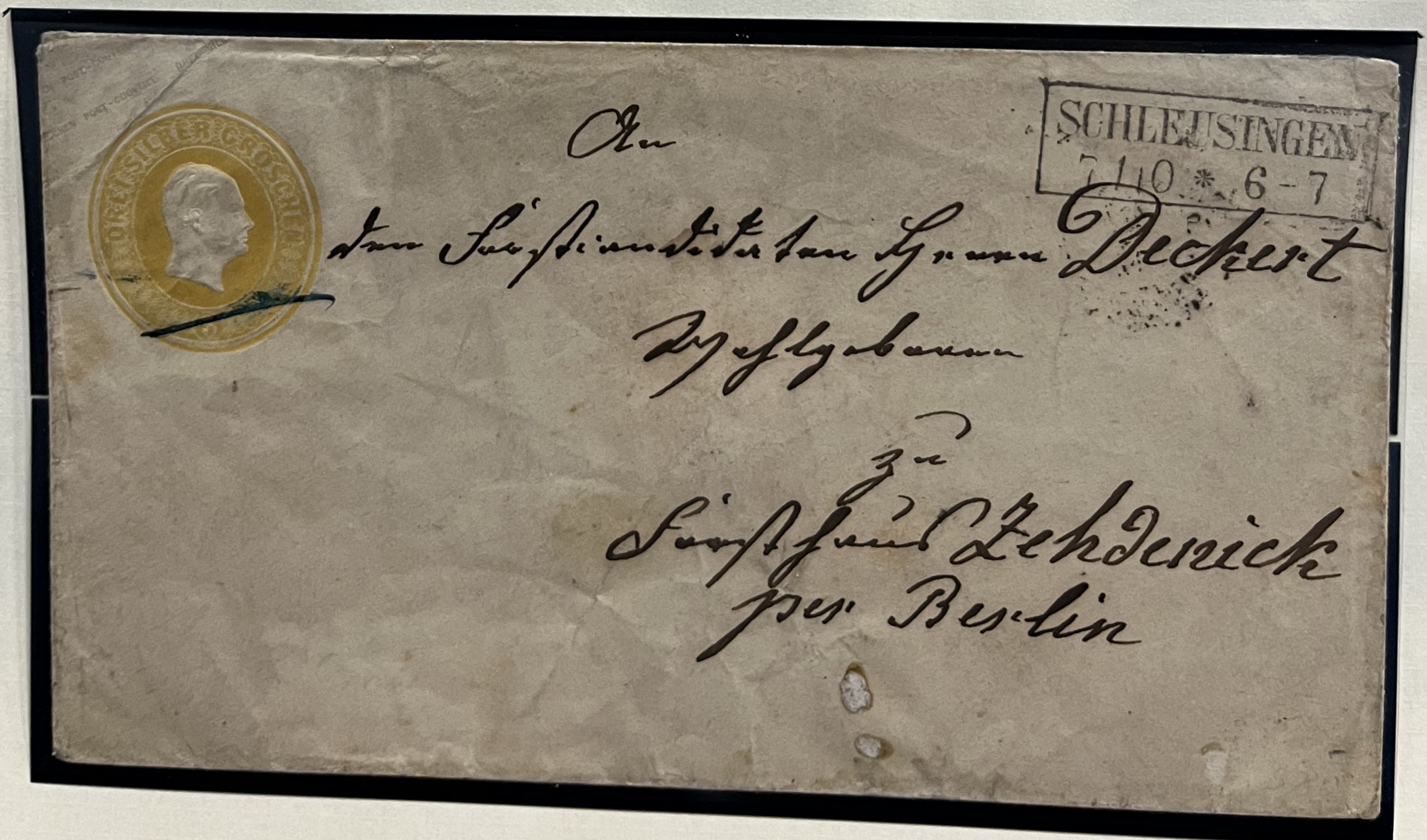

GOVERNMENT—A kingdom of the former German Empire, ranking fifth in area, third in population and first in density of population among the constituent states. It is now part of the German Republic. CAPITAL—Dresden.

COINAGE—10 pfennige=1 neu groschen. 30 neu groschen=1 thaler. Saxony's postage stamps were superseded in 1868 by those of Germany.

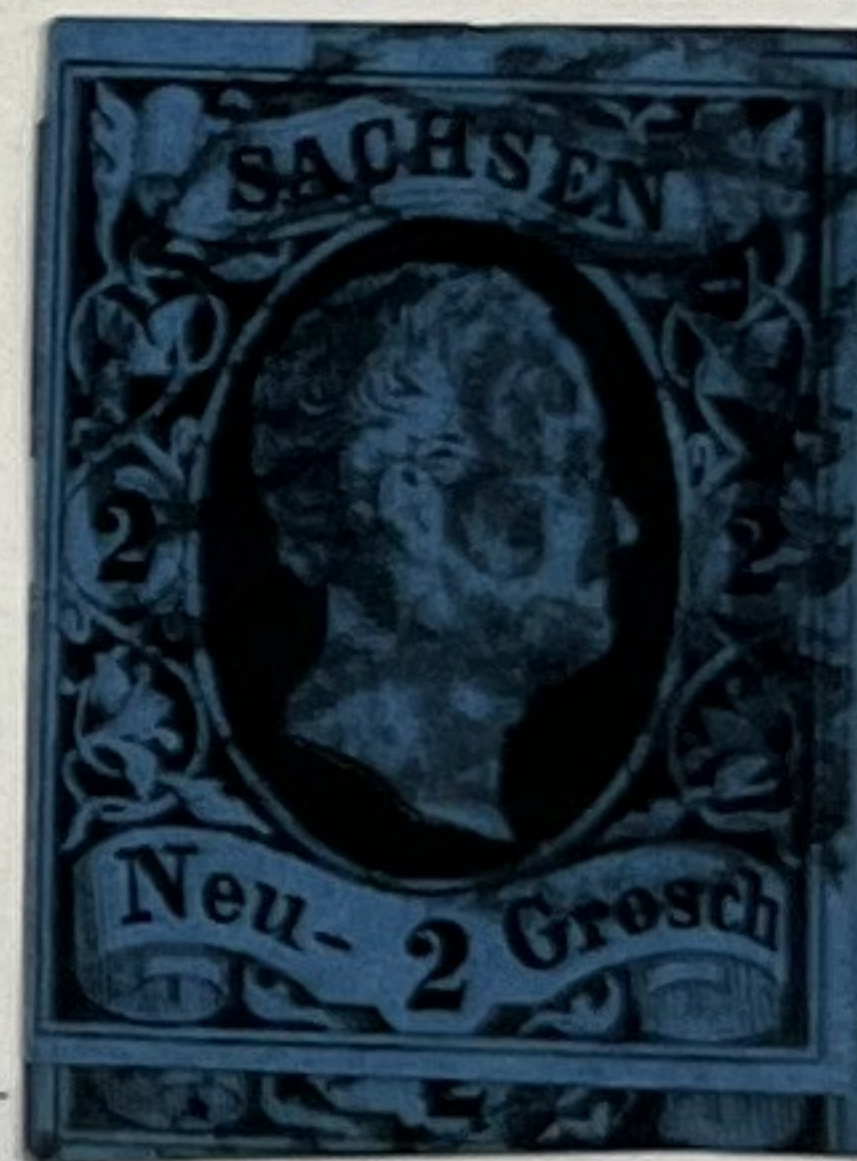

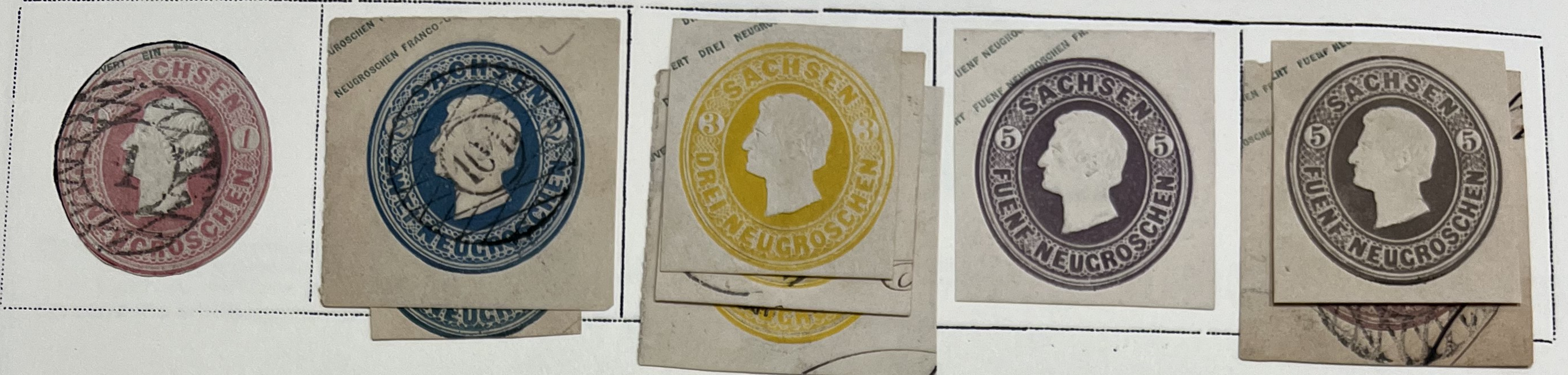

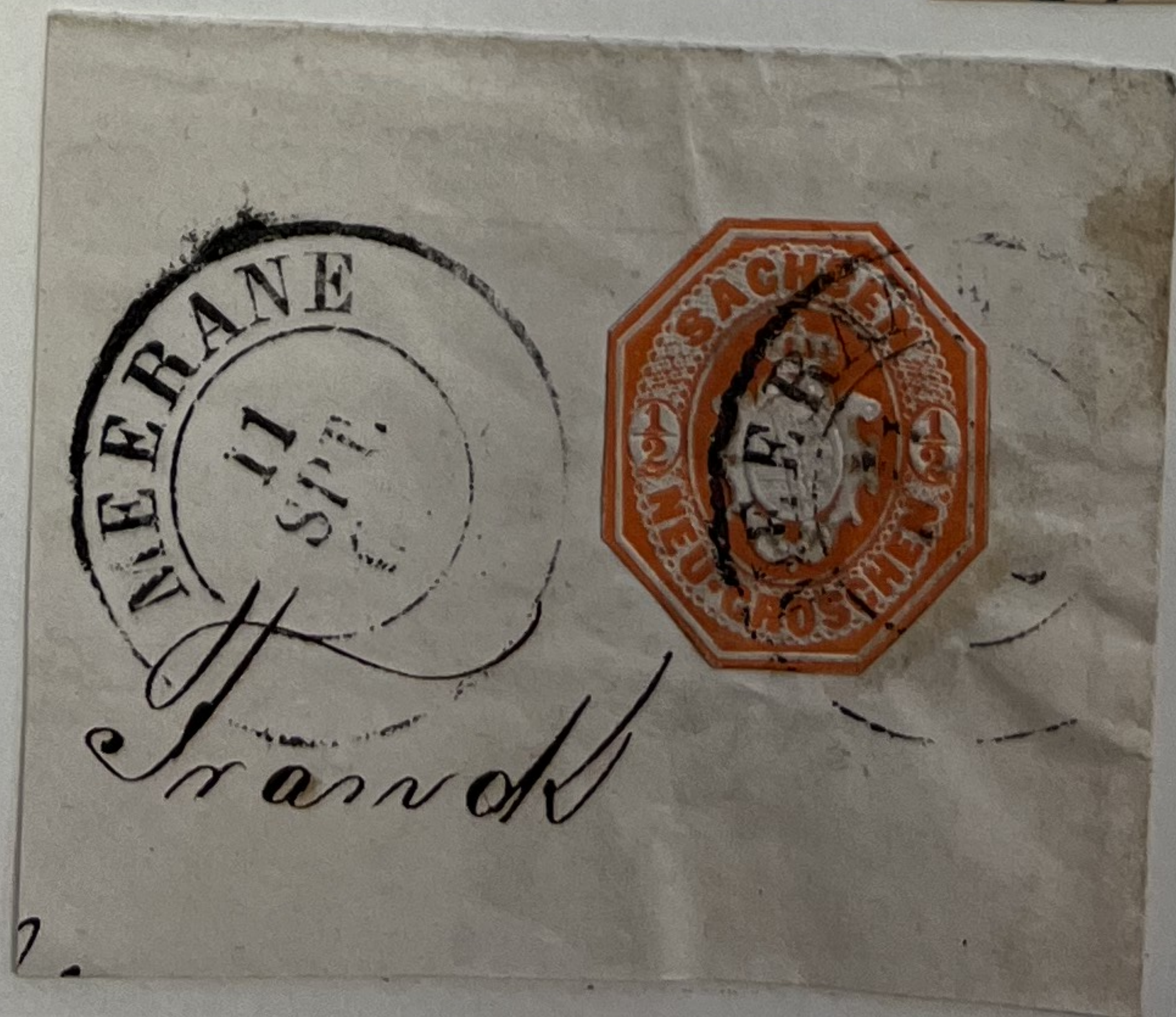

# SCHLESWIG-HOLSTEIN



GOVERNMENT—A province in northwest Prussia formed out of the once Danish duchies of Schleswig, Holstein and Fanenberg. Since the world war Schleswig has been divided into three zones under plebiscite. On July 7th, 1920, the executive power in zone one was handed over to Denmark.  
 CAPITAL—Schleswig.

COINAGE—16 schillings=1 mark. 100ö=1 krona (since Plebiscite in Zone one).

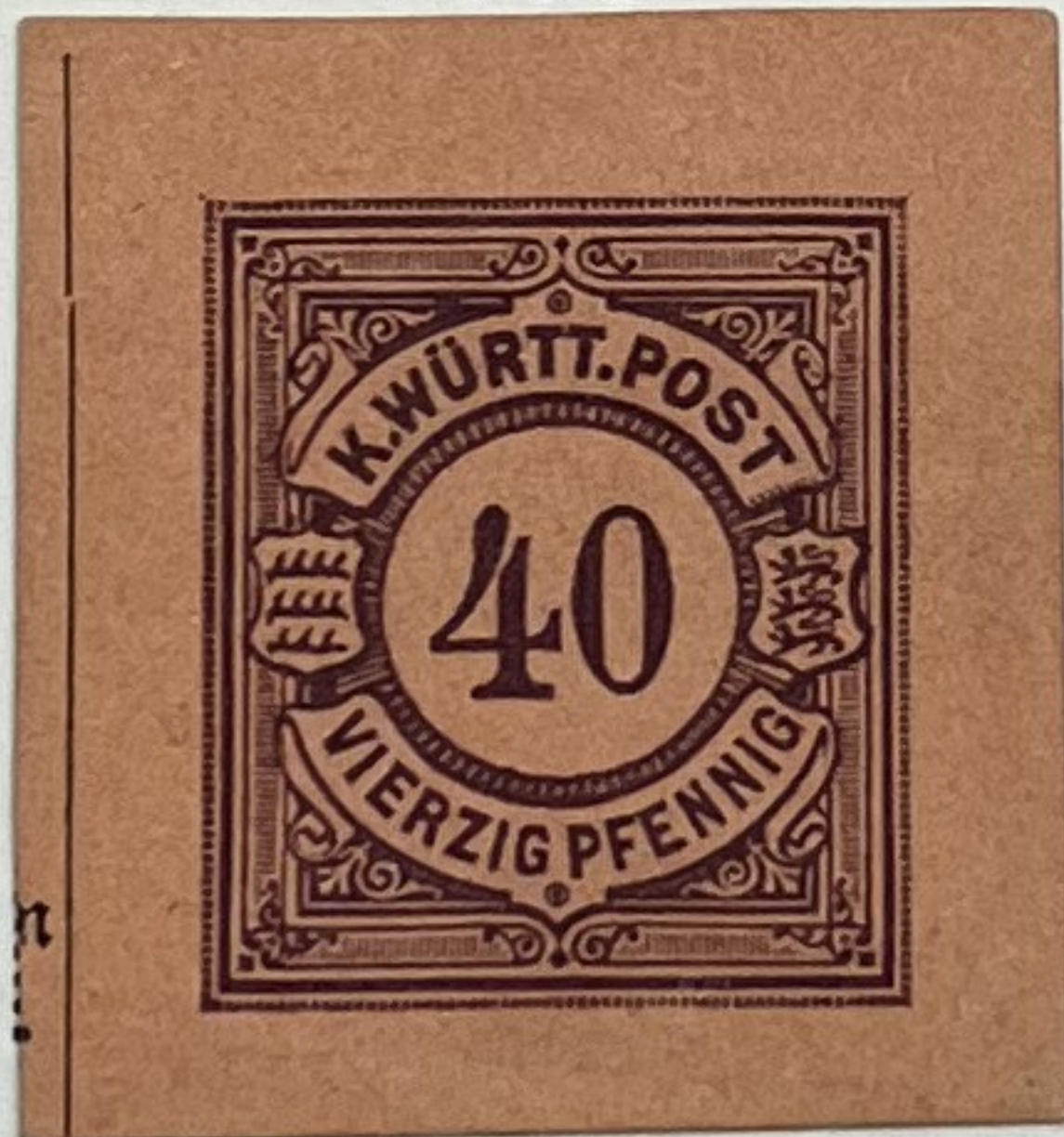

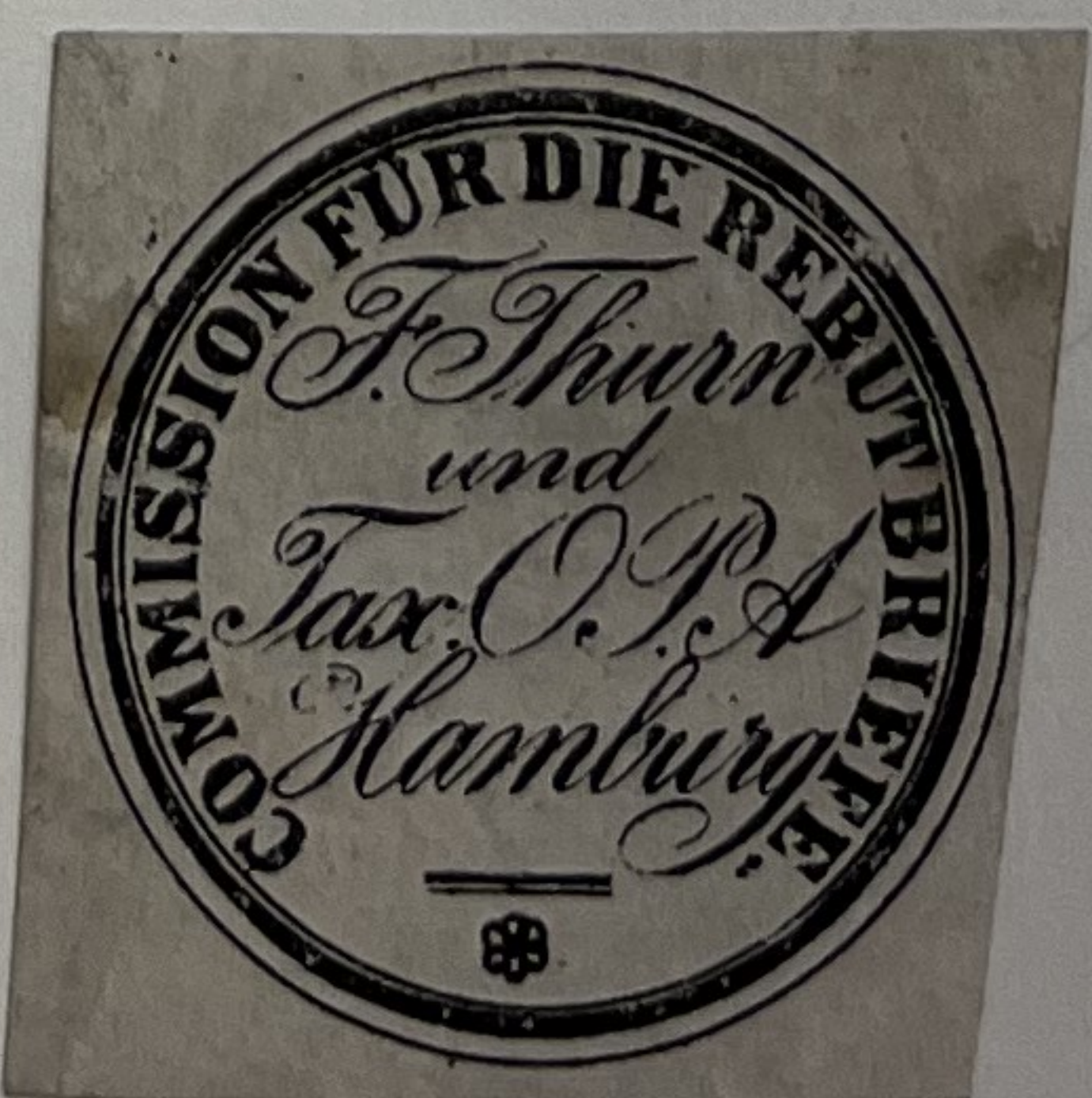

## NORTH GERMAN POSTAL DISTRICT

Including the North German Confederation, Rheinessen and Starkenburg. Replacing from January 1st, 1868, the stamps of Prussia, Saxony, Hanover, Brunswick, Oldenburg, the Mecklenburgs, Schleswig-Holstein, Bremen, Bergedorf, Lubeck, Hamburg, the Offices of Thurn and Taxis; also the Kreuzer set issued by Prussia in 1867 for Electoral Hesse, Nassau, Saxe-Coburg, Saxe-Meiningen, Hohenzollern, Schwartzburg and Frankfort.

COINAGE—Thaler=30 groschen or 105 kreuzers or 40 schillings.
