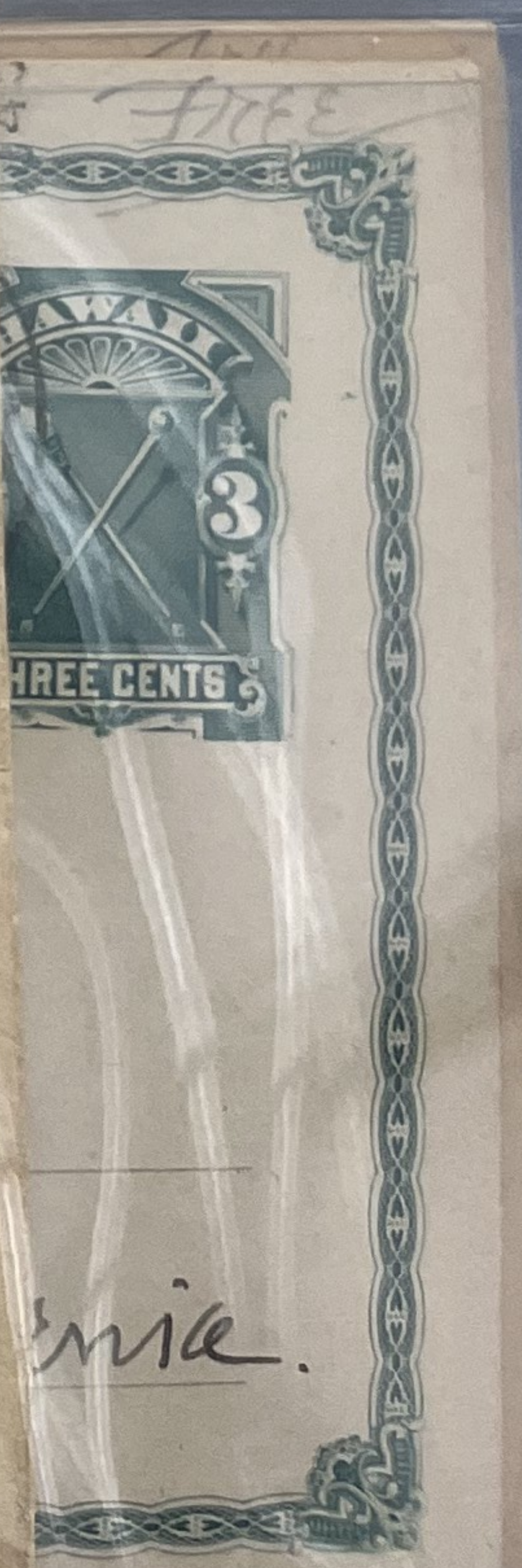
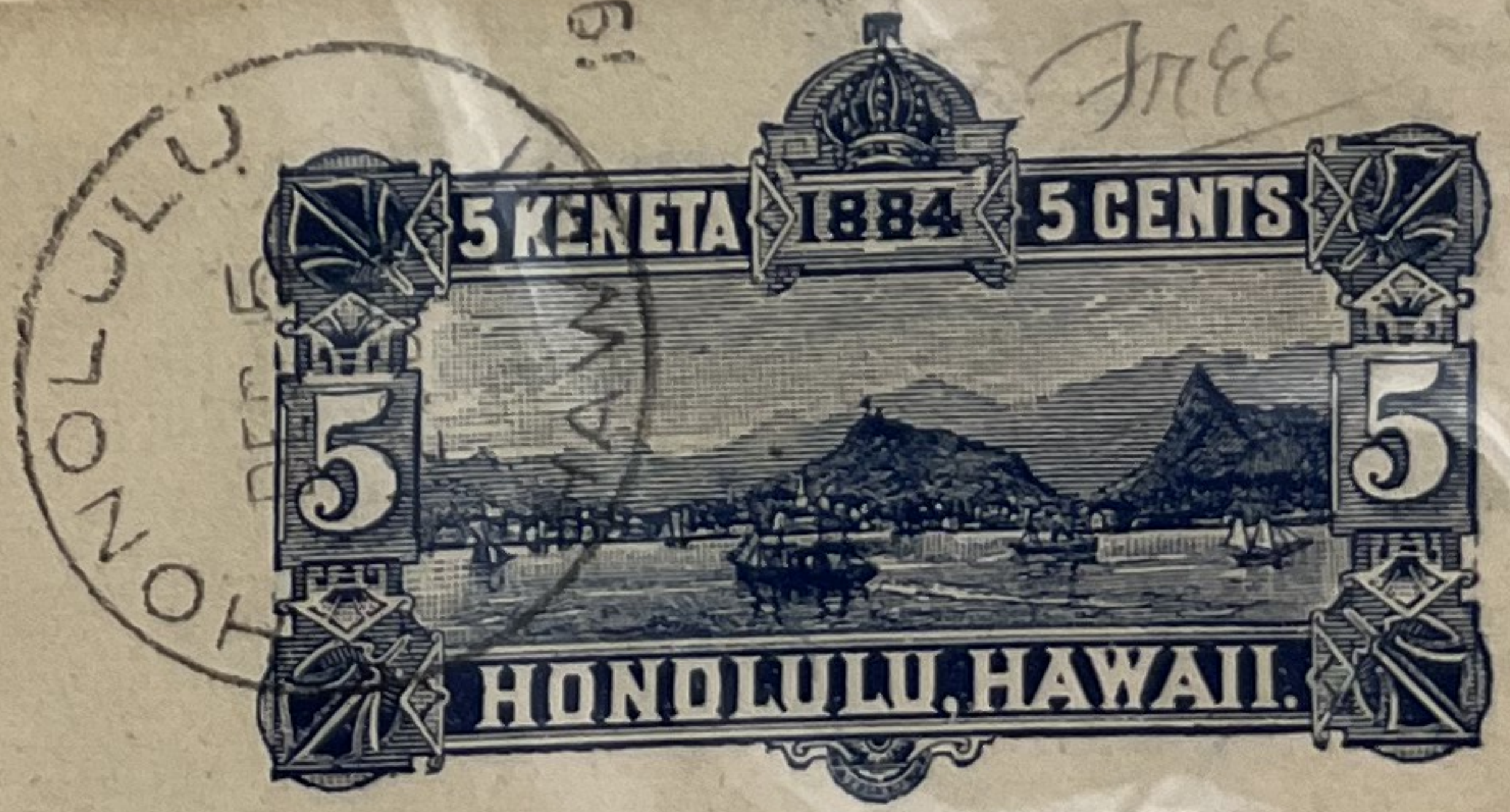
Dear Mother -

It looks pretty close (from Calif. to Hawaii) and is in terms of air travel about the same as from Washington D.C. to California.
