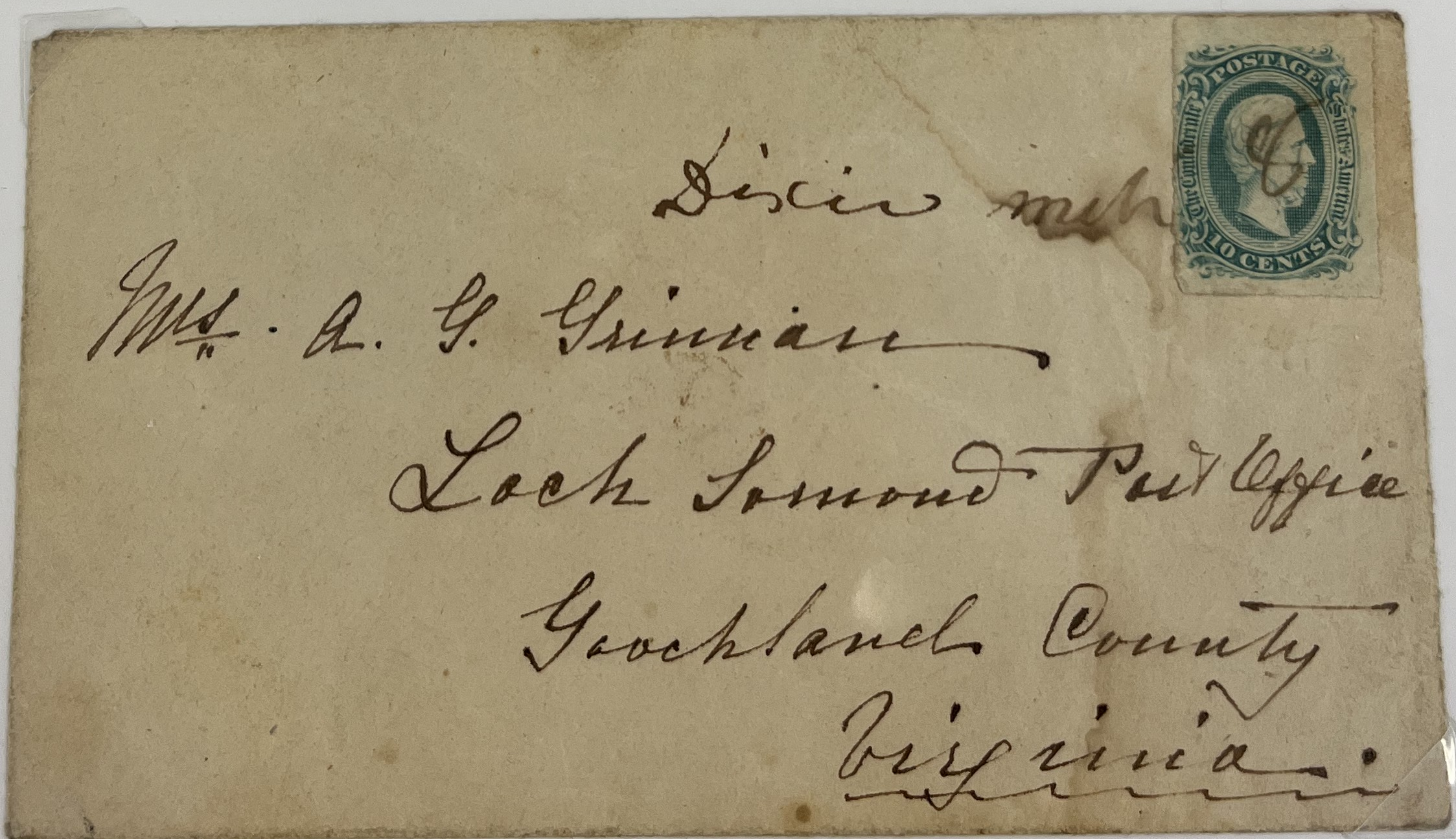




DAMS, PONDS, AND OTHER



First usage a CS #12 K& B print sent by Canal Boat on Feb. 2, 1865 to Loch Lomond on the James River in Goochland County. The cover was forwarded to Richmond marked, Loch Lomond (Va.) Feby. 14<sup>th</sup> (1865) Paid 10. The town was named for the river of the same name in Scotland.



Dixie (Va.) Mar. 8 (1864) on a CS #11 addressed to the Loch Lomond Post Office in Goochland County, Va. The "Bonnie Banks" inspiration for the name Loch Lomond, was published in 1841". It is the largest freshwater Loch (Lake) in Scotland.



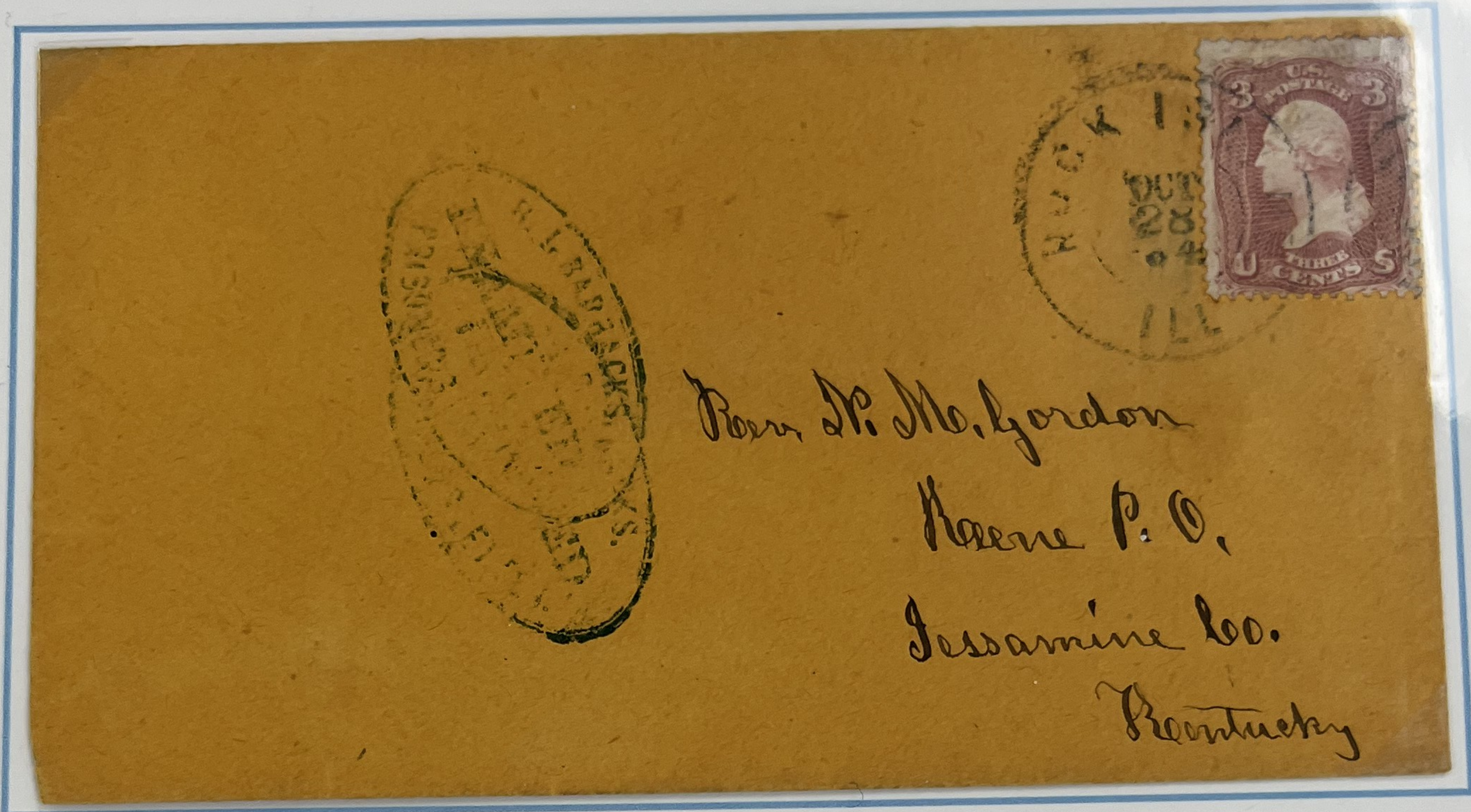

From a Confederate POW at Rock Island. 3¢ rose tied Rock Island, Ill. CDS Oct. 28, 64. Oval examined handstamp struck twice in blue. To Jessamine Co. Ky.



Money letter addressed to Mr. Frank Wheeler, Rock Island, Barracks 81 Ill. Wheeler was addressed as, "A conscripted prisoner". Saint Charles, Mo. CDS May 23, 65 ties 3¢. Blue crayon "Released" indicates Wheeler was no longer at the prison.

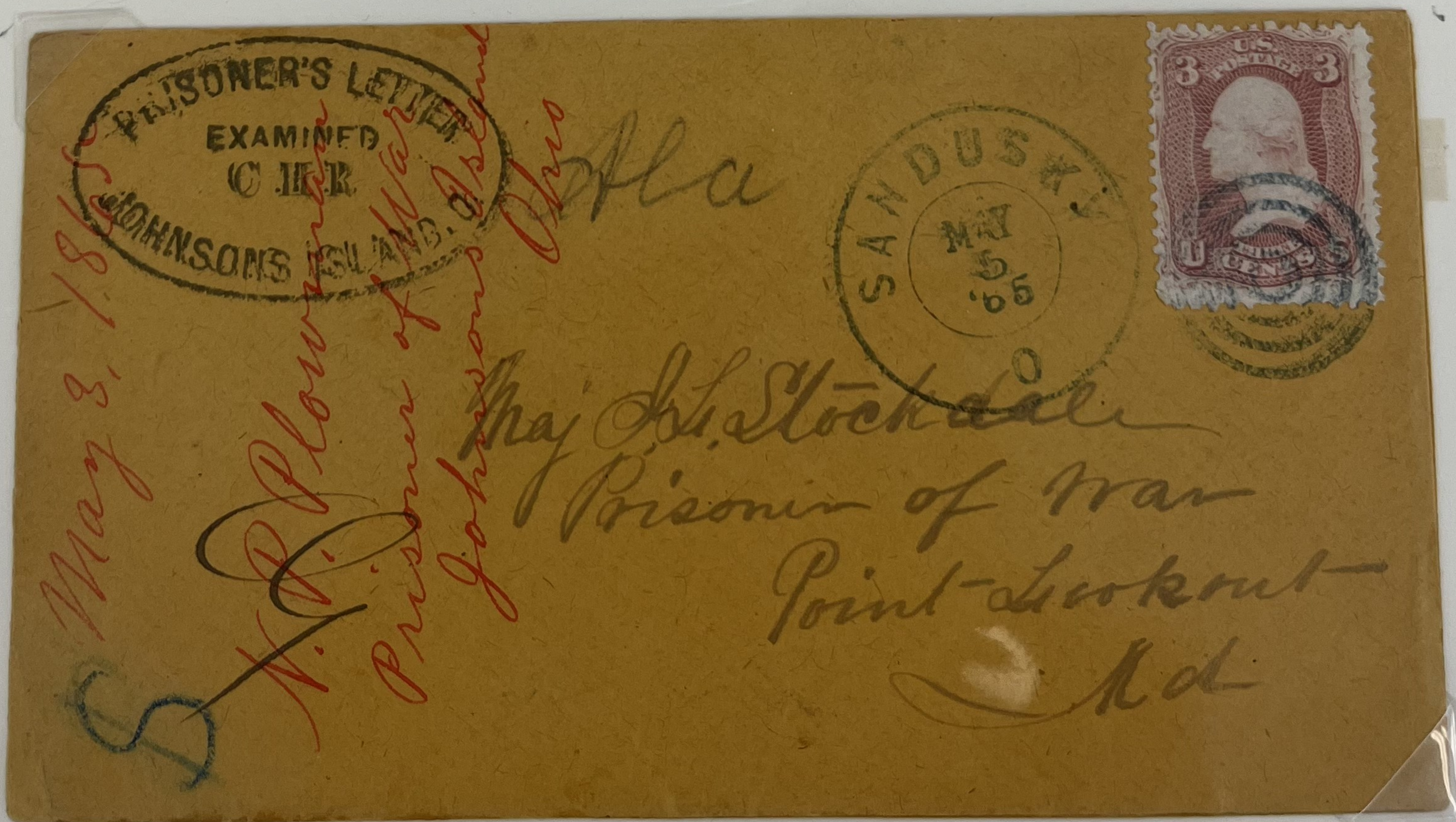
Stone Wall Mills, (Va.) Sept 27 (1863) CS #12 tied by vertical town cancel. Town ind Appomattox County. Sent to Rockfish Depot in Nelson County. The post office was established in May 1826, and discontinued in June 1828. Population in 1900 was 24.

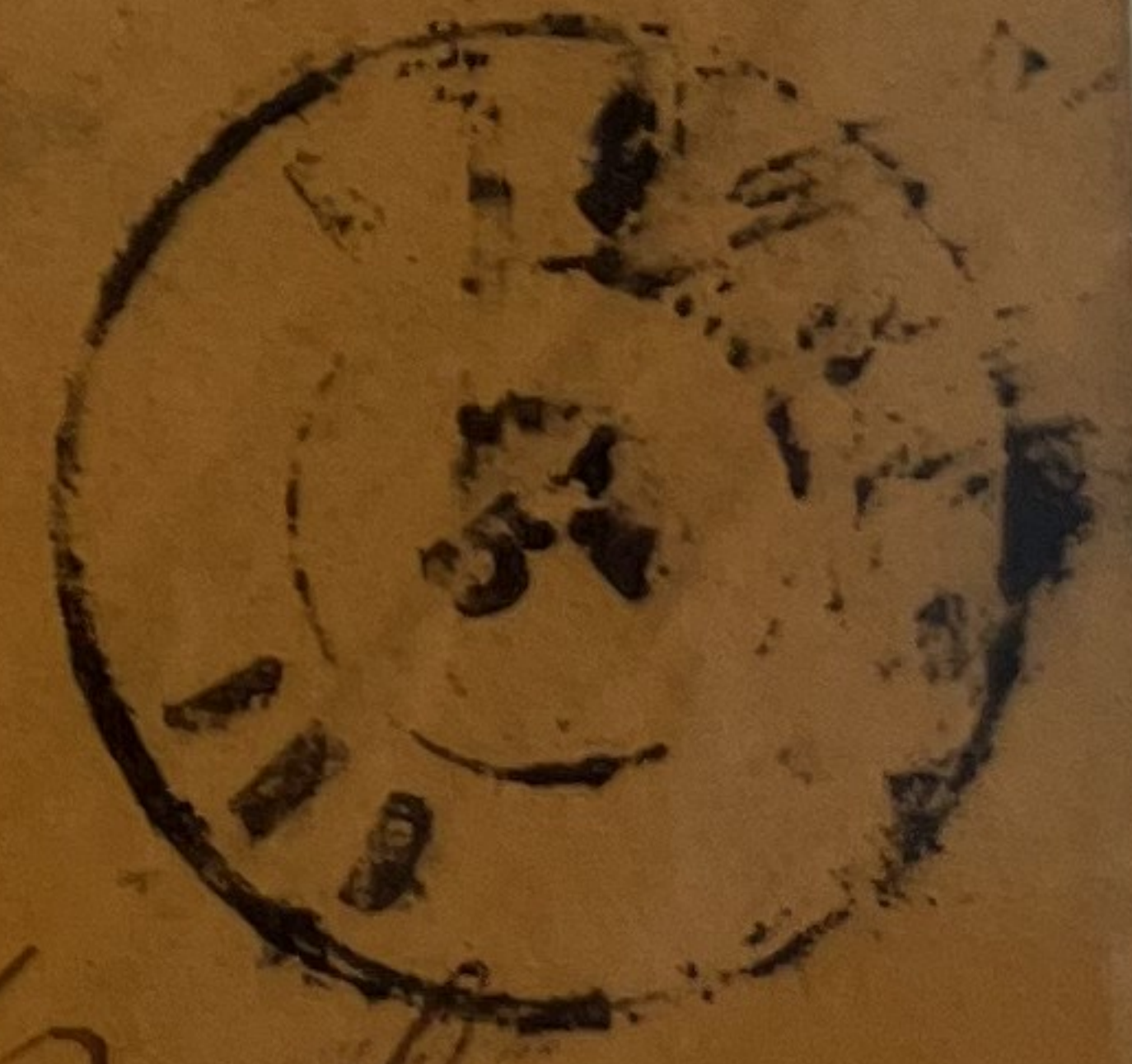

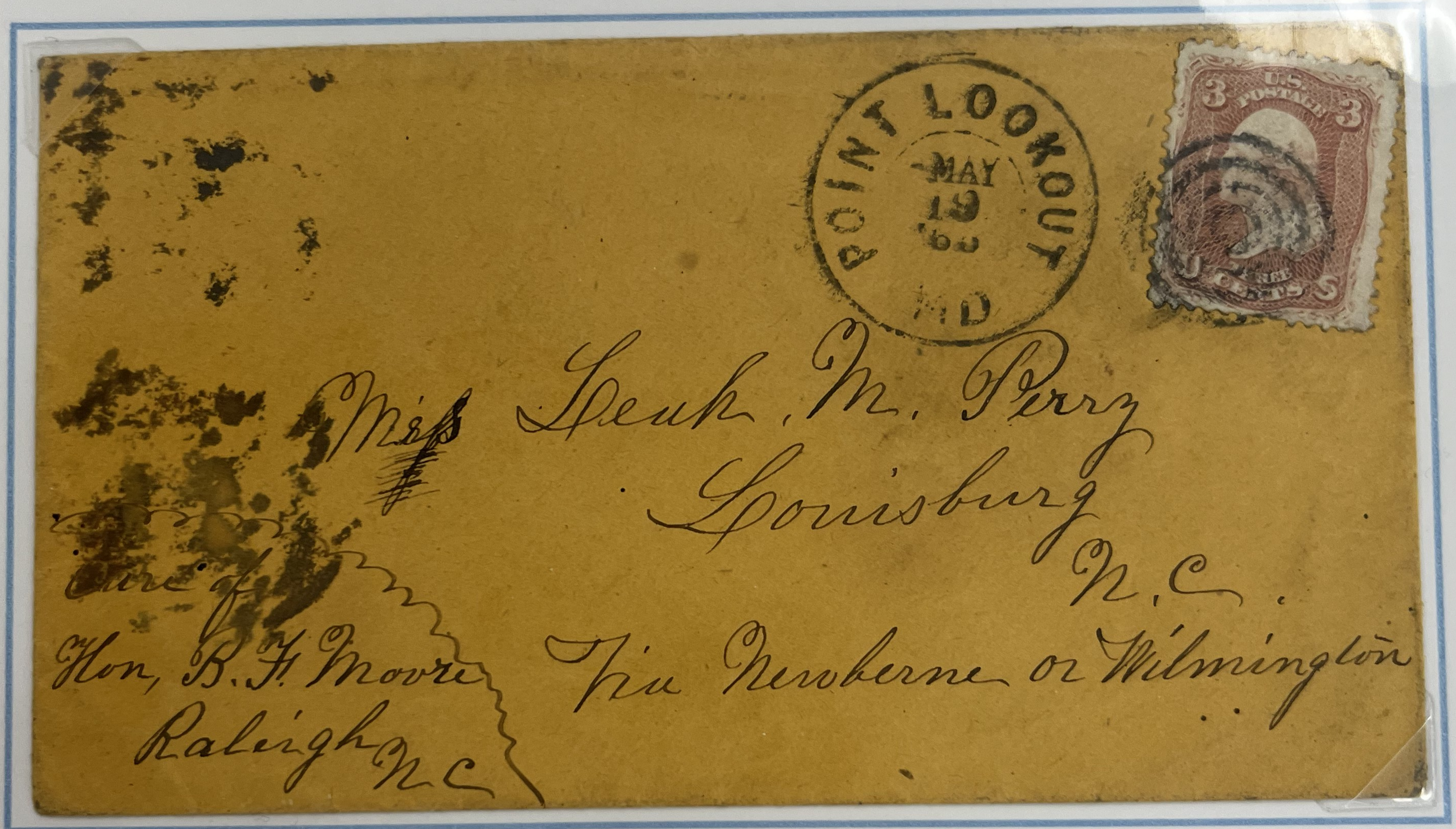

Perry, Louisburg, N.C., Via Newberne or Wilmington, Care of Hon. B.F. Moore, Raleigh, N.C.* Latest usage known from here.
