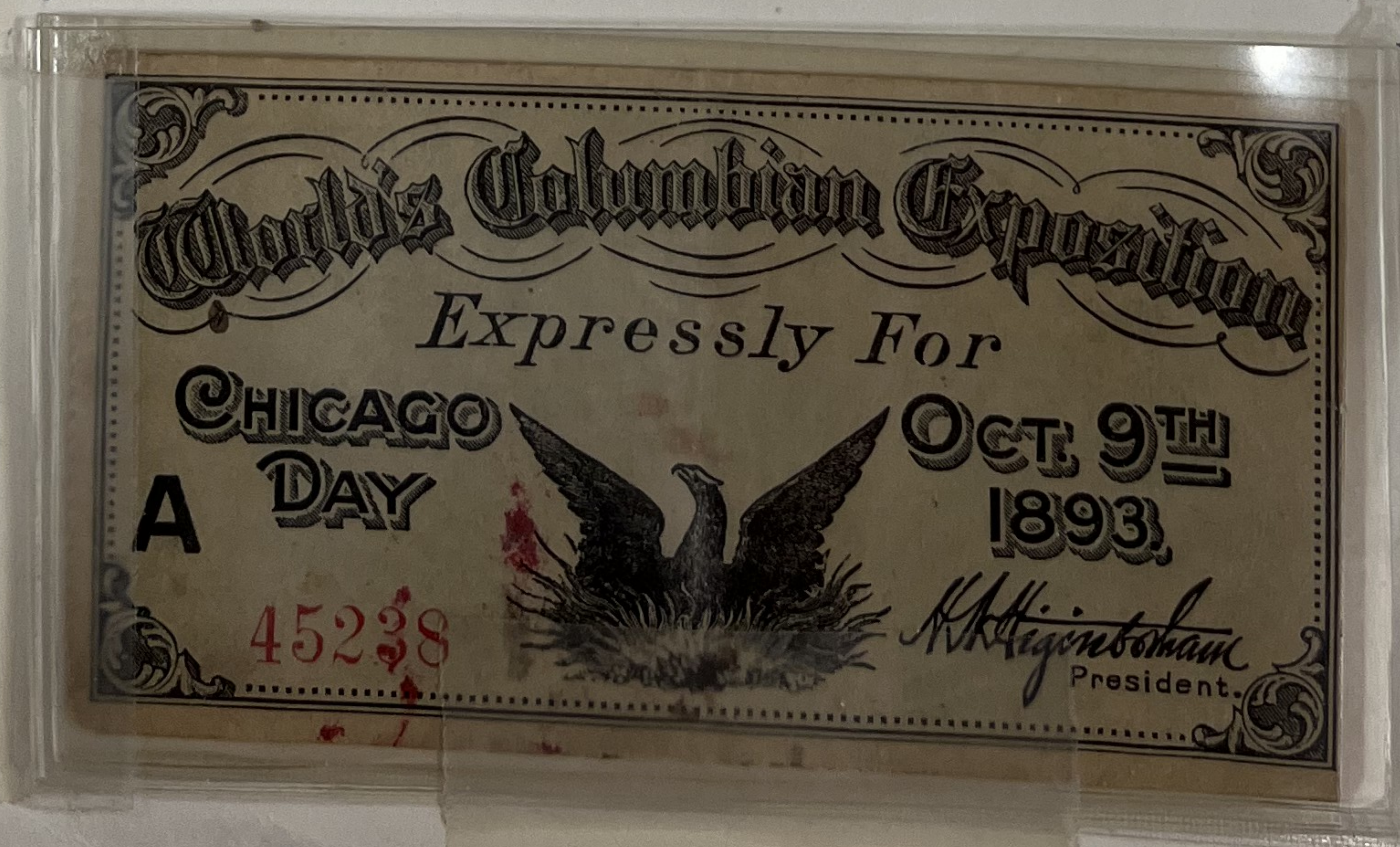




# Columbian Issue

These sixteen stamps, the first commemoratives and the first large size stamps issued by the Post Office, were a magnificent tribute to Christopher Columbus (1451-1506) and the 400th anniversary of his discovery of North America. Issued during the World's Columbian Exposition held in Chicago in 1893, they depict many events in the life of the great explorer.

These stamps were printed by the American Bank Note Company and they were the last U.S. postage stamps printed in the 19th century by a private concern. In 1894 the United States Bureau of Printing and Engraving started to print U.S. stamps.

The White Plains Issue of 1926 shows a reproduction of E.I. Wards painting "Alexander Hamilton's Battery."

This stamp, #629, was issued to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the Battle of White Plains, New York, Oct. 28, 1776. The British, attempting to outflank Washington's forces in Upper Manhattan, caused him to withdraw his main force northward. In a sharp battle at White Plains, the British captured a key hill, but Washington escaped while they were awaiting reinforcements.

Shown here is the first souvenir sheet ever printed in the United States. This 25 stamp miniature sheet, #630, was issued in honor of the International Philatelic Exposition Oct. 1926 in New York City. Total printing 107,398 sheets.

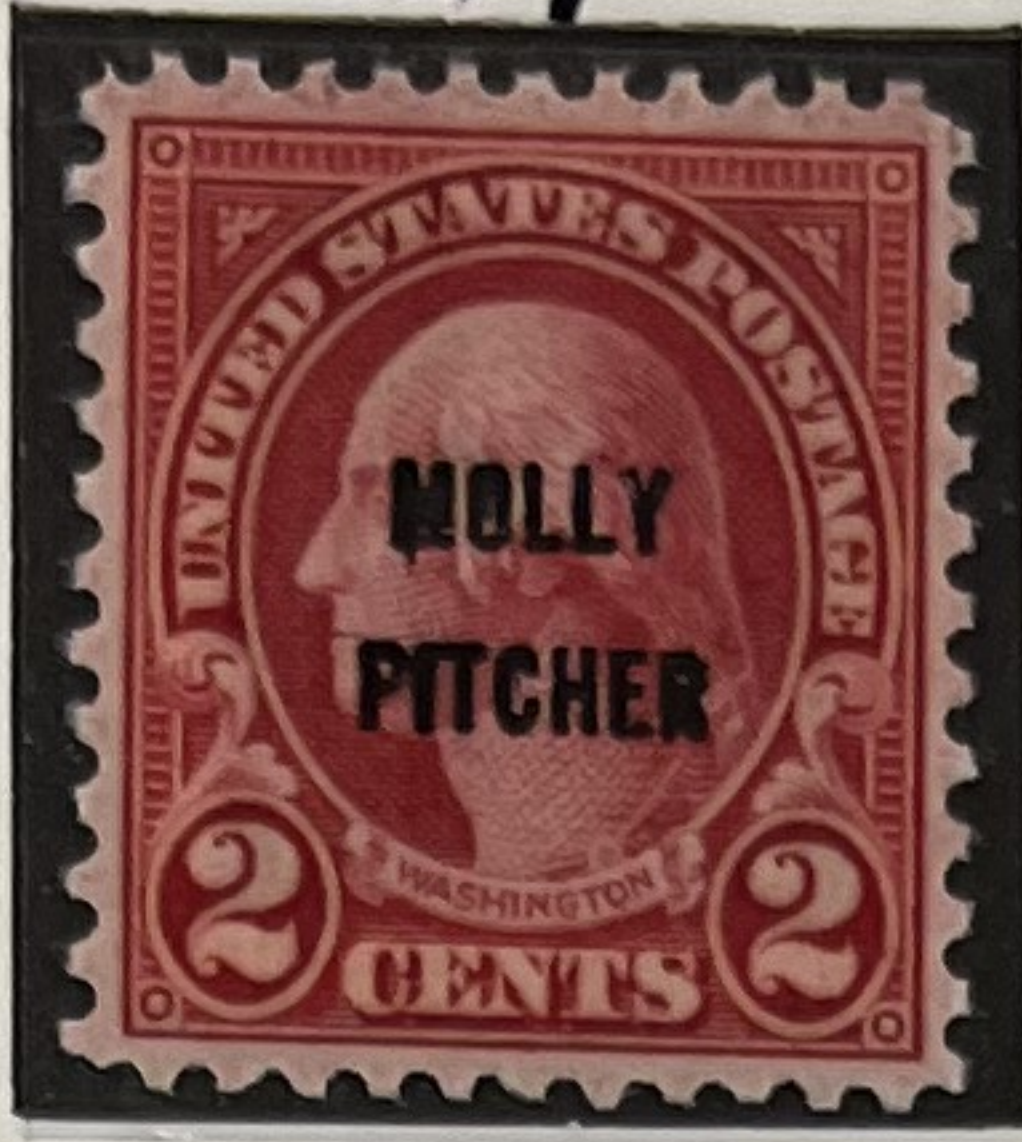

# WASHINGTON BICENTENNIAL

Twelve stamps were released in 1932 in honor of the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of George Washington 1732-1799. The designs were based on portraits of the President by some of the greatest artists of his age. The stamps were released Jan. 1, 1932 and were printed on a rotary press, perforated 11 x 10 1/2.
