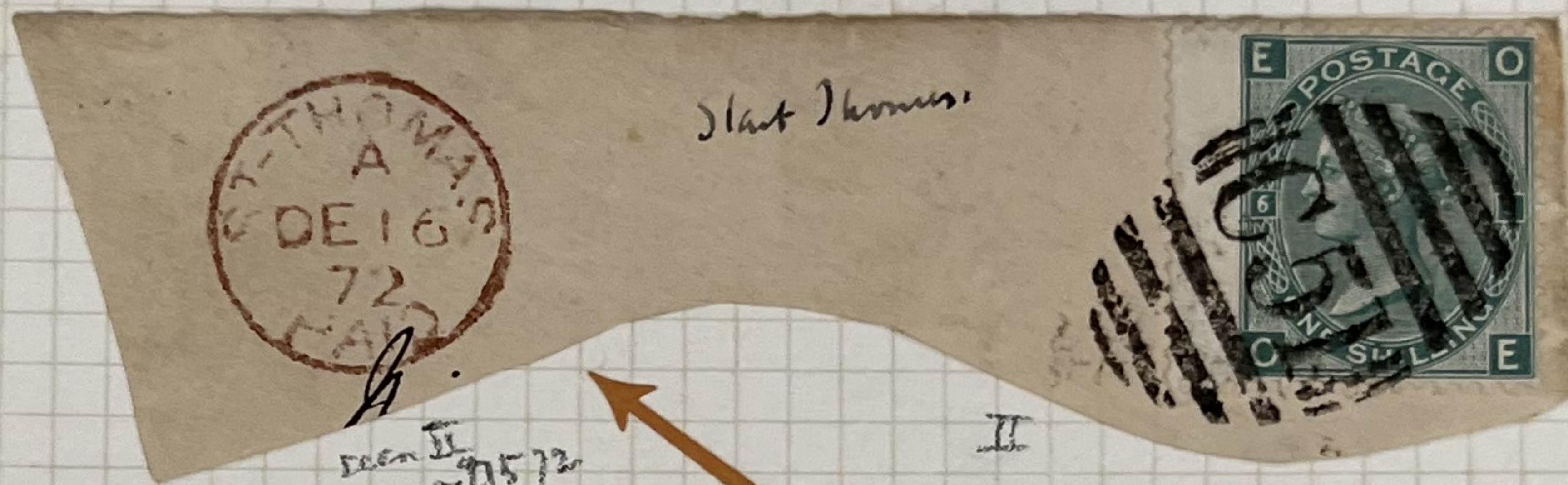

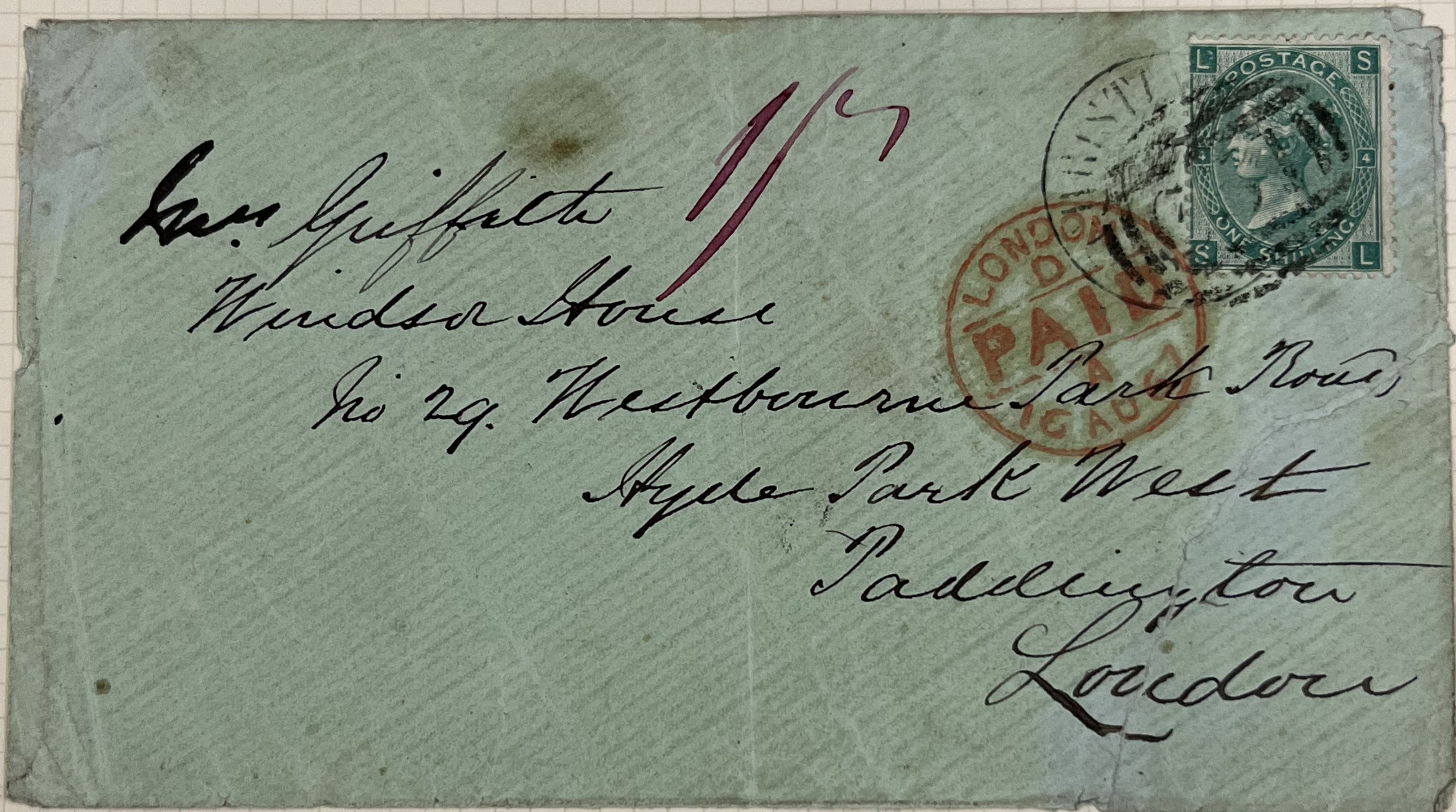
COVERS FROM CHRISTIANSTED,

the Danish postmark.

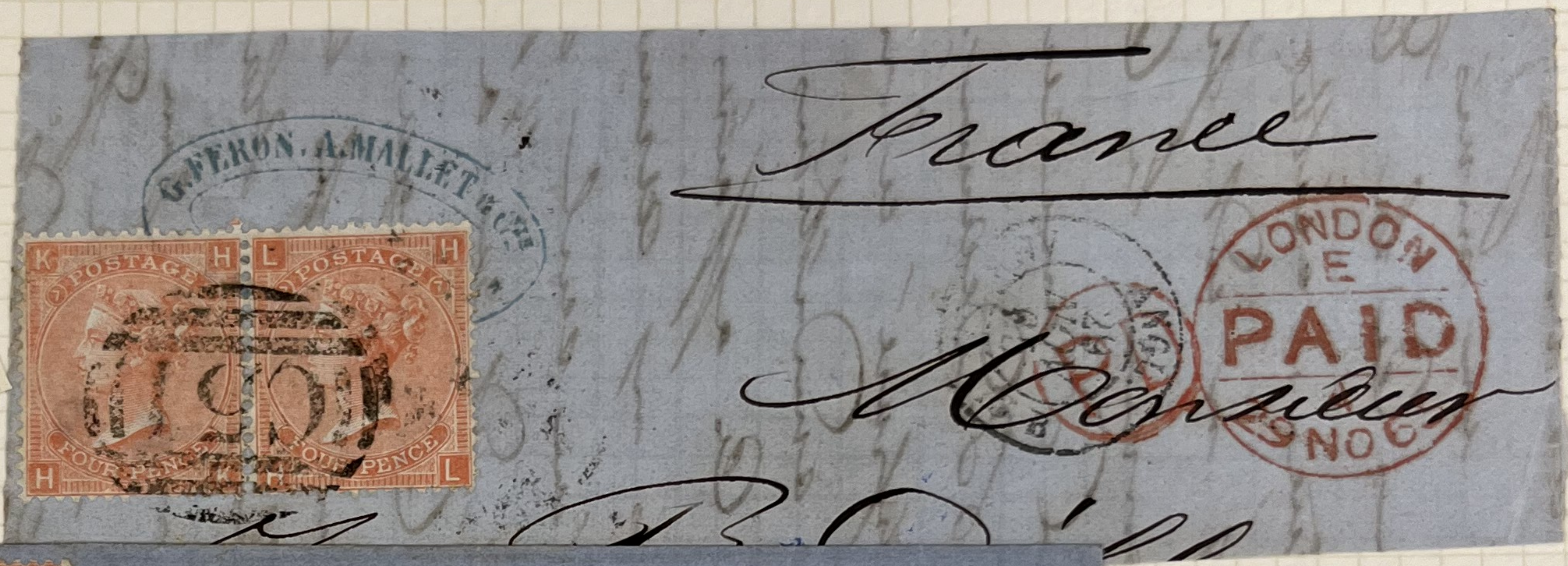
